BULLDOGS TO HONOR FORMER HEAD COACH MARK RICHT SATURDAY

Former University of Georgia head football coach Mark Richt will be honored at halftime of Saturday's game versus Missouri.

"We are so appreciative of all of Coach Richt's contributions to the University of Georgia," said J. Reid Parker, Director of Athletics. Josh Brooks, "His impact on Georgia football, the Athletic Association and the Athens community is immeasurable. We are thrilled we are able to honor him at Sanford Stadium this season."

Richt's 145-51 overall record in 15 seasons at UGA ranks him 10th on the all-time winningest SEC coach list. The Bulldogs had an 85-40 SEC record during his tenure and made five appearances in SEC Championship Games, winning twice in 2002 and 2005. Richt, a two-time SEC Coach of the Year honoree, led Georgia to nine bowl game wins, with Sugar Bowl victories in 2002 and 2007. The 2002 SEC title was Georgia's first in 20 seasons, and the Bulldogs went on to finish 13-1 with a final national ranking of No. 3. Georgia's 2007 squad posted an 11-2 mark and final national ranking of No. 2.

During Richt's tenure leading the Bulldogs, his teams produced 84 NFL Draft picks (2002-16), including 13 taken in the first round, had 17 All-Americans and finished with 106 All-SEC selections.

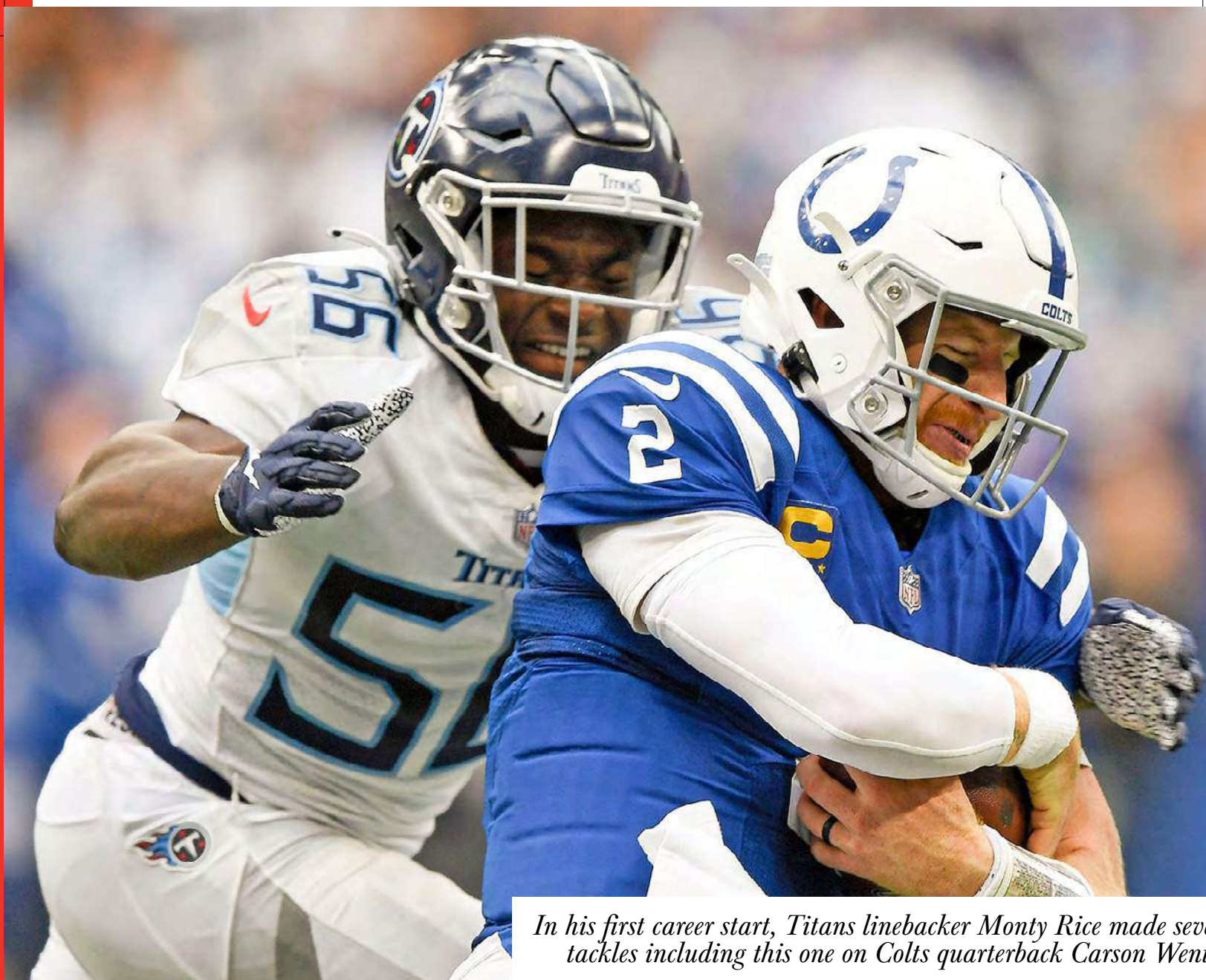
"Katharyn and I are excited about being honored in Sanford Stadium," Richt said. "Athens and the University of Georgia have been very special to us, and we are humbled to be a part of the great history and tradition of the football program. We also would like to thank the people of Georgia for the love and support we felt

throughout our time in Athens."

Bulldog head coach Kirby Smart credits Richt for having a lasting impact on countless Bulldogs players, coaches, staff, and fans as well as the Georgia program.

"Coach Richt and Katharyn (Richt), their family have just been tremendous to me and Mary Beth (Smart)," said Smart. "I think my career was probably like his in terms of coming up. Being a GA (graduate assistant,) growing up we both {worked} under Coach (Bobby) Bowden. Coach Richt gave me an opportunity to coach running backs, which I'd never done. It showed a lot of confidence in me as a coach, and I learned a lot from him. I learned about being the right kind of person, and how to run an organization the right way, and it's meant a lot to my career. I was only with him for one year but always followed him from afar because I respected the job he did."

"And he certainly made this a really good job from the way he built everything, and the things he did in the time he was here," Smart added. "He's meant so much to so many. I know all the guys that played for him and when they come back to events, they just rave about their relationship. Guys like Terrence Edwards and Ben Watson, these great players that just respect Coach Richt, and the things he did for this university. I certainly feel the same way, and I couldn't be prouder to be honoring him. He's reached out to me so many times where he and Katharyn have said, 'Hey, we're praying for you and your family.' It just meant a lot that he did those things. I know our fan base will be there to recognize him."

David Andrews, OL: Logged all 77 plays at center as New England accumulated 352 total yards.

Isaiah Wynn, OL: Registered 72 plays at tackle and helped the Patriots roll up 352 total yards.

Tre' McKitty, TE: Made his NFL debut by appearing on 11 of the Chargers' offensive plays.

Mark Webb, DB: Was not active for Los Angeles.

Charlie Woerner, TE: Caught a 7-yard pass for San Francisco.

Alec Ogletree, OLB: Posted five tackles for the Bears.

John Jenkins, DL: Was inactive for the Dolphins.

D'Andre Swift, RB: Had 12 carries for 27 yards and five catches for 24 yards for Detroit. He leads all NFL running backs with 47 catches for 415 yards.

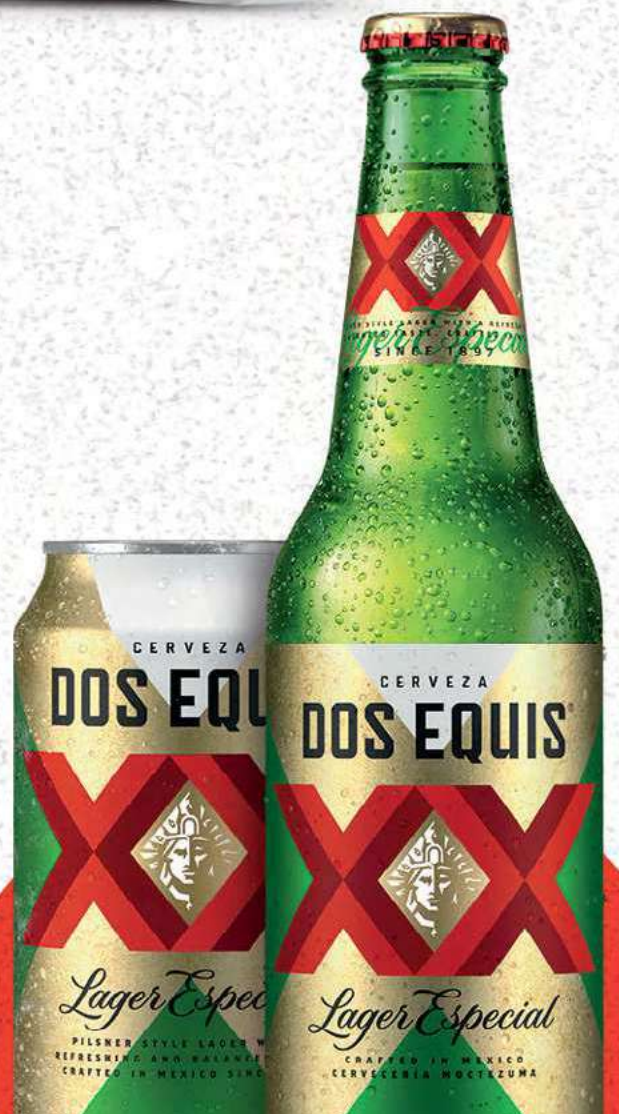

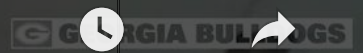


GEORGIA BULLDOGS GAME BREAKDOWN

GEORGIA - vs. - MISSOURI

- Top-ranked Georgia (8-0, 6-0 SEC) holds a 9-1 edge in the series history with Missouri (4-4, 1-3 SEC). The first meeting came in the 1960 Orange Bowl in Miami when the Bulldogs posted a 14-0 victory to cap a 10-1 season under Wallace Butts. The teams have played annually since 2012 when the Tigers joined the SEC. Georgia has won the last seven meetings.
- The Bulldogs lead the nation in scoring defense, allowing just 6.6 points a game while the Tigers are scoring 34.8 points a game. Georgia's offense is averaging 37.9 points a game while the Tiger defense has surrendered 36 points a game.
- Georgia has clinched a spot in the 2021 SEC Championship game set for Dec. 4 in Atlanta. It will mark the ninth appearance by the Bulldogs since the game was created in 1992 and the fourth in the Kirby Smart era which began in 2016.
