The Elephant In The Room

Alabama is the last team to beat Georgia (2023 SEC Championship Game), and the last team to register a regular season home win over the Bulldogs when they did it in Tuscaloosa on Oct. 17, 2020. Georgia's last regular season loss came on Nov. 7, 2020 to Florida in Jacksonville. Since then, the Bulldogs have won 42 in a row during the regular season. UA leads the all-time series over Georgia 43-26-4.

Georgia's last win over the Crimson Tide came on Jan. 10, 2022 by a score of 33-18 and delivered the Bulldogs their first national championship since 1980. It capped a 14-1 season. Then, Georgia became the first team in the CFP-era to repeat as champions, going 15-0 in 2022. The Bulldogs went 12-0 in 2023 before falling to the Tide.

Georgia hasn't played host to Alabama since 2015, and on Saturday, Sept. 28, the Bulldogs return to Tuscaloosa for the second time since 2020. The Crimson Tide will visit Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium in 2025.

The last three meetings with the Crimson Tide came in the postseason, two in the SEC Championship Game in Atlanta and one in the CFP National Championship in Indianapolis.

The Standard Is The Standard

The more things change the more they stay the same. The Bulldogs are the only FBS team that has not allowed a TD this season. Opponents have six field goals on the year against the Bulldogs. In 2024, the Bulldogs limited 14th-ranked Clemson to three points, Tenn. Tech kicked a field goal on the final play of the game and UK made four field goals. Georgia's leading tackler is sophomore LB **CJ Allen** with 15 while **Smael Mondon Jr.**, **Daylen Everette** and **Raylen Wilson** are next with 12 apiece. Georgia has eight sacks led by Wilson and **Jalon Walker** with 1.5 while junior **Malaki Starks** has an interception and senior **Dan Jackson** and sophomore **Damon Wilson II** have a fumble recovery. Seven of 11 starters return from the 2023 defense that ranked fifth nationally in Scoring Defense (15.6 ppg) and led the nation in 3rd Down Conversion (25.7%).

Up next, second-ranked Georgia (3-0, 1-0 SEC) battles fourth-ranked Alabama (3-0, 0-0 SEC). The teams last met in the 2023 SEC Championship Game in Atlanta with UA posting a 27-24 decision. Georgia saw its 29-game winning streak end and a bid to win its third straight national championship. Alabama is sixth nationally in Scoring Offense (49.0 ppg) and sixth in Scoring Defense (8.67 ppg).

Aiming To Be Elite On All Fronts Again

The Bulldogs opened the 2024 season ranked No. 1 in the AP and US LBM Coaches poll for the third time in school history (2008, 2023). Georgia (3-0, 1-0 SEC) dropped to No. 2 in the AP poll after its 13-12 road win over Kentucky on Sept. 14 and remain at No. 2 this week. The Bulldogs have the longest active streak of being ranked in the AP top 10 (54 straight polls). The Bulldogs will face five teams that were preseason ranked in the top 15 including three of those on the road in Texas, Alabama and Ole Miss plus a fourth at a neutral site (Clemson in Atlanta) while Tennessee visits Athens too.

Did You Know? Georgia is the only team to have finished in the top seven of the final AP poll in each of the past seven seasons. The last team to start and finish a season at No. 1 was Alabama in 2017.

Did You Know, Part II? Head coach **Kirby Smart** is unbeaten against all active head coaches over the past five years. Georgia is 65-6 in that span. The coaches no longer active who have wins over Georgia during this stretch: Nick Saban (3) along with **Will Muschamp**, Ed Orgeron and Dan Mullen.

Did You Know, Part III? The Bulldogs were the only FBS team to finish the 2023 season nationally ranked in the top five in both Scoring Offense (40.1 ppg/5th) and Scoring Defense (15.6 ppg/5th). Also the Bulldogs were the first FBS team since 2020 to not allow a punt return all season.

In the Smart era, the Georgia defense has ended the year ranked in the top five nationally in Scoring Defense five times including leading the nation twice (2019 at 12.6 ppg & 2021 at 10.2 ppg). Also, Georgia has been ranked in the final top 10 in Scoring Offense from 2021-23.

Beck By Popular Demand

Senior **Carson Beck** is 16-1 in his career as the starting quarterback (6-1 against top 20 teams), the loss coming to then No. 8 (CFP) Alabama 27-24 in the 2023 SEC Championship Game. Beck opened the 2024 season with a 34-3 win over No. 14 Clemson in Atlanta, going 23-for-33 for 278 yards and two TDs to earn SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors. He followed that with a school record-tying five TD passes in a 48-3 rout of Tennessee Tech and a 13-12 road win at UK. The Georgia offense is bolstered by four starting linemen returning in LT **Earnest Greene III**, LG **Dylan Fairchild**, RG **Tate Ratledge** and RT **Xavier Truss**. However, Ratledge is sidelined after an ankle injury in the UK game. The skill players share the load as Beck utilizes multiple options in the backfield, at wideout and tight end. A Georgia single game record-tying 15 Bulldogs caught a pass in the win over the Golden Eagles.

SMART Football: The Streaks

*Georgia is 49-2 in last 51 games with a school record streak of 42 consecutive regular season victories.

*Georgia has an SEC and school record streak of 28 consecutive SEC regular season wins.

*Georgia has a 16-game winning streak in an opponent's home stadium, which leads in FBS. The streak began in 2020 with a 14-3 win over Kentucky. Georgia last fell at No. 2 Alabama in 2020.

*The 2024 Senior Class is 45-2 (39-0 in the regular season). The 2023 Senior Class has the school record at 50-4 with two national titles, an SEC crown plus went 6-0 in bowl/CFP games.

*Georgia is riding a school record 26-game home winning streak, which leads in FBS.

*Georgia owns the nation's longest active bowl streak at 27 seasons and has won its last seven matchups.

Beck Once Again At The Controls

Fifth-year senior **Carson Beck**, a 6-4, 220-pound native of Jacksonville, Fla., owns a 16-1 record as Georgia's starting quarterback.

*Beck is on the 2024 watch list for numerous national awards. He was a 2023 *Manning Award* finalist and a *Maxwell Award / Davey O'Brien Award* semi-finalist after leading Georgia to a 13-1 mark and final AP ranking of No. 4.

* 6-1 versus top-20 opponents with a 73.3 Completion Percentage (148-202) for 1,971 yards, 15 TDs, 2 INTs in those contests.

* SEC Offensive Player of the Week after 34-3 win over #14 Clemson this year

* School record 72.4 Completion% in 2023 (5th nationally).

* 302 completions in 2023 ranked 2nd in UGA single season history, trailing only Stetson Bennett, who had 310 in 2022 when the Bulldogs went 15-0

* 3,941 passing yards last year ranked 2nd in school history, trailing only Bennett, who had 4,127 in 2022.

* Georgia's quarterback room also includes redshirt sophomore **Gunner Stockton**, freshman **Ryan Puglisi** and redshirt freshman transfer **Jaden Rashada** (Arizona State). Stockton saw action in four games last year and completed 63% of his passes (12-for-19) for 148 yards and two TDs. This year, Stockton is 10-for-12 for 90 yards, 0 TDs, 0 INT.

Seasoned Line Keeps The Chains Moving

Georgia's starting unit has featured **Earnest Greene III**, **Dylan Fairchild**, **Jared Wilson**, **Tate Ratledge** and **Xavier Truss** while **Micah Morris** and **Monroe Freeling** have been the next men up. Ratledge and Truss have 31 career starts, but Ratledge is now out after an ankle injury against UK.

*Georgia is averaging 6.90 yards per play and 402.3 yards per game in 2024.

* The 2023 Georgia offense set a school record averaging 7.26 yards per play while the 496.5 yards per game average ranked second all-time.

Opportunities Abound For Running Backs

Georgia's top running backs to date include **Trevor Etienne**, **Branson Robinson**, who was sidelined in 2023 due to a knee injury, **Cash Jones** and freshmen **Nate Frazier**. Etienne has a team-high 157 yards (6.5 avg.) after tallying 79 tough yards on 19 carries in the 13-12 road win over UK.

*Robinson made his first career start in the season-opening win over #14 Clemson. He was one of seven Bulldogs who combined for 169 yards and two touchdowns. Frazier led the attack with 83 yards on 11 carries including a 40-yard scamper and his first TD. Jones' lone carry was a 15-yard TD that featured an impressive stiff arm plus he was a key contributor on punt returns.

* Etienne, who did not play in the season opener, had a team-best 78 yards on five carries in the win over Tennessee Tech. He ran for 1,472 yards and 14 touchdowns in two seasons at UF. Also in his UF career, he tallied 30 receptions for 238 yards and one touchdown plus returned 28 kicks for 671 yards.

* **Roderick Robinson II** is recovering from toe surgery and yet to make his 2024 debut. He had 196 yards and two scores in five games last year.

I Like It, I Lovett

Senior QB **Carson Beck** will find the open receiver, and he's been spreading the wealth this season. "You have to do that nowadays in college football, You have to keep those tight ends happy and those wideouts happy," said **Kirby Smart** after the Tennessee Tech game. The top trio includes **Dominic Lovett** (12-for-155 yards, 1 TD) **Arian Smith** (11-for-142 yards, 1 TD) and **Dillon Bell** (9-for-98 yards, 1 TD). Against Tennessee Tech, a school record 15 different Bulldogs caught a pass (Lovett, Smith, Bell each had a score)

*Nine Bulldogs registered a reception in the win over #14 Clemson including a career-high five by Smith for 56 yards. Smith and Bell are options to run the ball too. Bell tallied four catches for 32 yards against the Tigers. Last year, Bell had 25 carries for 157 yards and two touchdowns and threw an 18-yard touchdown in the 38-10 road win over No. 18 Tennessee.

* **London Humphreys** (Vanderbilt), **Michael Jackson III** (USC) and **Colbie Young** (Miami) transferred to UGA in January. Young and Humphreys' scored touchdowns in their Bulldog debut, both coming on their second catch against #14 Clemson. Young's 7-yarder was Georgia's first TD of the season while Humphreys' covered 40 yards. Humphreys' first catch as a Bulldog was "clutch," according to coach **Kirby Smart** as it came on a 3rd-and-10 at the UGA 49 and went for 23 yards.

Luckie To Have You

*The tight end room features junior **Oscar Delp**, sophomore **Lawson Luckie** and Stanford grad transfer **Ben Yurosek** plus a pair of freshmen in **Jaden Reddell** and **Colton Heinrich**. Luckie leads the tight end group with 80 yards receiving on four catches including a 37-yard TD versus Tenn. Tech.

Luckie is a second generation Bulldog as his father Mike (LB) was part of Bulldog triplets from 1996-98 with uncles Dustin (LB) and Miles (OL).



Defensive Playmakers At Each Level

Georgia has had 42 players drafted over the past four seasons, including 23 on defense and eight of those defenders have gone in the first round.

- * The 2024 unit ranks 3rd in Scoring Defense (6.0 ppg), allowing just six FGs.
- * Georgia is the only FBS school to not allow a TD this year.
- * The 2023 unit ranked fifth nationally in Scoring Defense (15.6 ppg).
- * Allowed only 93 points in the second half in 2023 for a 6.6 average and allowed a touchdown or less in the second half in eight of 14 contests.
- * 5-1 versus ranked opponents and allowed just 15.2 ppg in those contests.
- * Seven of 11 starters return from Georgia's 2023 defense.

Stark(s) Reality Of Throwing It Near #24

The defensive backfield returns All-America safety **Malaki Starks** and **Daylen Everette**, who each started all 14 games last year. Starks' first career interception (vs. #11 Oregon - Bo Nix in 2022) and most recent pick (vs. #14 Clemson - Cade Klubnik in 2024), both in Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta, are worth checking out. Everette had a career-high eight stops versus UK.

- * Starks has six career interceptions. When asked about Starks' latest pick against the Tigers, head coach **Kirby Smart** said, "I do think the play I saw him make today may be one of the best defensive football plays I've ever seen live in person." Starks is on the watch list for several national awards and following the win over Clemson, he was named the Jim Thorpe Award National DB of the Week. In 2023, he was a *Bronko Nagurski Trophy* and *Jim Thorpe Award* finalist and a *Chuck Bednarik Award* semifinalist.
- * Three starters from the 2023 secondary now are in the NFL in Javon Bullard (Green Bay), Kamari Lassiter (Houston) and Tykee Smith (Tampa Bay).

Meet Me At The Ball

Mykel Williams, **Nazir Stackhouse**, **Warren Brinson**, **Christen Miller**, and **Tyrion Ingram-Dawkins** anchor the front while several freshmen have seen action too. Williams and Brinson missed the past two games due to ankle injuries. Ingram-Dawkins made his first career start against TT and responded with a career-high four tackles including 3 TFL. Against UK, Ingram-Dawkins had three tackles, a sack and seven QB pressures to earn SEC DL of the Week.

- * The veteran linebackers are **Smael Mondon Jr.**, **Jalon Walker**, **CJ Allen**, **Raylen Wilson**, **Damon Wilson II** and **Chaz Chambliss**. Raylen Wilson had a career-high five tackles, a forced fumble and sack for a loss of 28 yards that led to a change of possession and Georgia's first score in the road win over UK. He was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week.
- * Walker, a 6-2, 245-pounder is a self-described "hybrid linebacker" for his ability to play on the edge and in the box. He led the team with five sacks last year including a pair in the SEC Championship Game. Walker enjoyed a solid showing in the 2024 season opener, leading the Bulldogs with six tackles and 1.5 sacks in a 34-3 win over #14 Clemson to earn Reese's Senior Bowl Defensive Player of the Week honors. He was credited with 10 QB pressures at UK.
- * A few freshmen contributing include **KJ Bolden** and **Ellis Robinson IV** in the secondary, **Justin Williams** and **Chris Cole** at linebacker, **Joseph Jonah-Ajonye** and **Jordan Thomas** on the line. Bolden finished second on the team with four tackles in the win over #14 Clemson. Bolden and Thomas notched their first career sacks versus TT.

G'day Mate

Georgia welcomes back a two-year starter in P **Brett Thorson** and sophomore PK **Peyton Woodring** after both shined in 2023.

- * Thorson, a native of Melbourne, Australia is averaging 49.5 yards on 11 punts, placing seven inside the 20 with three fair catches and no returns.
- * Thorson is known for his comedic slant about his lack of playing time because the Bulldogs punted a record low 32 times in 2023 after just 36 punts in 2022 (15 games), the two lowest totals dating back to at least 1948.

- * In 2024, Thorson punted four times against #14 Clemson for a 48.0 average with three placed inside the 20, two for 50+ yards and none were returned. He came up big at Kentucky with a career-high six punts for a 49.5 average.
- * Thanks in part to Thorson's punts and the entire punt coverage team including gunners **Arian Smith** and **Dominic Lovett**, Georgia was the only team in the FBS that did not allow a punt return in 2023, the first school to do that since 2020 when COVID limited the amount of games teams played. Georgia has not allowed a yard on a punt return in 22 games. The last one came in a 45-19 road win over Miss. State on Nov. 12, 2022 when Zavion Thomas took one 63 yards for a score.

Geaux Dawgs

Peyton Woodring, who hails from Lafayette, La., was a *Lou Groza Award* semifinalist as a freshman. This year, he has a team-high 29 points and is handling most of the kickoffs too (18 of 20 overall with 12 touchbacks and one out of bounds).

- * He earned 2024 SEC Special Teams Player of the Week in the opening win over #14 Clemson. He accounted for 10 points including the first six points of the season on field goals of 30 yards and a career-long 55-yarder -- the longest by a Bulldog since the 2018 Rose Bowl (Rodrigo Blankenship vs. Oklahoma).
- * In 2023, Woodring scored a team-high 134 points, going 21-for-25 on field goals and 71-for-71 on PATs. He ranked sixth nationally in Scoring and third among kickers, and his 134 points ranked third best in school history for a kicker and most for a Bulldog freshman kicker.
- * The snapping duties are handled primarily by **Beau Gardner**, a graduate transfer from UCLA who is from San Francisco.
- * Graduate transfer **Charlie Ham**, a native of Atlanta, Ga., is back in the Peach State to provide depth. This year, he has two kickoffs with one touchback. He had a successful undergraduate career at Duke (2019-23). He appeared in 46 games, going 36-for-50 on field goals (LG-50), 91-for-93 on PATs and tallied 193 kickoffs with a 61.2 average and 98 touchbacks.

The Return Game

Sophomore **Anthony Evans III** is averaging 10.6 yards on the year with eight punt returns for 85 yards. He had a career-long 46-yarder versus TT. Against #14 Clemson, he had three returns for 23 yards.

- * Georgia does not have a KOR this year. Last year, **Dillon Bell** had six KOR for 160 yards (26.7 avg.) including a 39-yarder at Ga. Tech. In two seasons at UF, **Trevor Etienne** tallied 26 KOR for 645 yards (24.8 avg.).

Block That Punt...Block That Kick

Currently, four Bulldogs have blocked a kick or punt in their career.

- * **DB Joanel Agüero** blocked a Florida punt in 2023 that resulted in a safety. In 2022, **DL Nazir Stackhouse** blocked a field goal that was returned 96 yards for a touchdown by teammate Chris Smith in the opening quarter of the SEC Championship Game versus No. 14 LSU. OLB **Jalon Walker** blocked a punt that resulted in a safety versus Kent State in 2022. S **Dan Jackson** blocked a punt against No. 8 Arkansas in 2021.

Season-Opening Success

With its 34-3 demolition of No. 14 Clemson, top-ranked Georgia improved to 101-27-3 in season openers including 9-0 in the **Kirby Smart** era.

- * The Bulldogs have won 11 straight openers. The win over the Tigers gave the Bulldogs a 10-3 record in ranked matchups to start a season including 4-0 under Smart. The 18th-ranked Bulldogs beat No. 22 UNC 33-24 in Atlanta in Smart's debut in 2016. In 2021, then No. 5 Georgia stifled No. 3 Clemson in Charlotte. In 2022, No. 3 Georgia crushed No. 11 Oregon 49-3 in Atlanta.

Trifecta Of Undefeated SEC Regular Seasons

*Georgia is riding a school record streak of 28 consecutive regular season wins in league play. In the all-SEC 2020 schedule due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Bulldogs won their final three SEC regular season games and have since run the table.

* In 2021, Georgia posted its first perfect 8-0 mark in league play in school history. The SEC went to eight games when it split into divisions in 1992.

* The 2022 Bulldogs followed it up with another 8-0 SEC mark, and the average margin of victory in those games was 25.5.

* The 2023 Bulldogs made it three straight 8-0 league seasons (the only SEC school ever to accomplish that feat).

* In school history, Georgia has gone undefeated in league play 10 times.

*The 2024 SEC slate for the Bulldogs features roadtrips to Kentucky plus three teams preseason ranked in the top 10: No. 5 Alabama, No. 4 Texas and No. 6 Ole Miss plus the neutral site game with Florida in Jacksonville. Georgia's SEC home games will be with Auburn, Miss. State and No. 15 Tennessee.

*During a pregame ceremony at the annual "G Day" game, University of Georgia president Jere W. Morehead joined J. Reid Parker Director of Athletics Josh Brooks and his son, Davis, in the ceremonial collaring of Boom.

*Boom is the 11th solid white English Bulldog to serve as Georgia's mascot since the line began in 1956 courtesy of the Seiler family of Savannah. In his first season, Boom saw the Bulldogs post their third-consecutive undefeated regular season, followed by a record-breaking 63-3 victory over FSU in the Orange Bowl. In the offseason, Boom resides with his family in Savannah.

On Deck: Auburn on Oct. 5

After two SEC road games sandwiched around an open date, Georgia returns to Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium for the first time since Sept. 7 when it plays host to Auburn (2-2, 0-1 SEC) on Oct. 5. The Deep South's oldest rivalry continues on Oct. 5 when the Bulldogs tangle with the Tigers. This will be the 129th meeting, which ranks second in NCAA history for "Most Played Rivalries," trailing only Wisconsin-Minnesota (133 times). Georgia leads the AU series 64-56-8.

The Tigers play host to #21 Oklahoma (3-1, 0-1 SEC) Saturday at 3:30 p.m. ET (ABC).

Academic & Community Service In The Smart Era

* The University of Georgia ranked No. 20 in *U.S. News & World Report's* 2024 ranking of the best public universities in the nation, marking the eighth consecutive year that UGA has placed in the top 20.

*The 2024 Bulldogs feature nine players who will get to wear the "SEC Graduate" patch on their uniform: **Carson Beck, Warren Brinson, Luke Collins, Beau Gardner** (UCLA), **Charlie Ham** (Duke, also has a master's in management studies), **Dan Jackson, Micah Morris, Xavier Truss** and **Benjamin Yurosek** (Stanford).

* In 2023, offensive lineman Chad Lindberg was named an Academic All-American.

* Georgia has had 242 players make the SEC Academic Honor Roll in the Kirby Smart era including a high of 43 from the 2023 team.

* Under Smart, 18 Bulldogs have been named National Football Foundation (NFF) Hampshire Society Members. The society is comprised of football players from all divisions who maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or better throughout their career, were starters or significant contributors and have completed their final year of playing eligibility. The most recent members were Chad Lindberg, Ladd McConkey, Sedrick Van Pran and Jared Zirkel.

* McConkey, a 2nd round pick of the L.A. Chargers, became the 15th Bulldog since 1966 to be named a Campbell Trophy finalist and NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award winner. He received an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship to use when he's done playing professional football. Georgia leads the SEC and is tied for sixth nationally with its 15 honorees.

* In the area of community service in 2024, **Malaki Starks** became the 24th Bulldog since 1992 to earn a spot on the AFCA Good Works Team, which honors 22 men annually. Georgia's 24 recipients leads the nation.

* Members of the 2024 squad took part in the 20th annual Bulldogs Battling Breast Cancer charity golf tournament this past summer. It has raised more than \$2 million since the event began in 2004.

*In October of 2023, the team participated in the Chick-fil-A Dawg Bowl. It was led by former Bulldog coach Mark Richt and raised more than \$750,000 for Parkinson's and Crohn's disease awareness.

* Former Bulldog defensive lineman Travon Walker, who was the No. 1 overall draft pick in 2022 (Jacksonville) donated \$44,000 to the UGA Athletic Association with the money earmarked for athletic training. It was a part of a series of donations made by his foundation.

* Former All-American and NFL linebacker Jarvis Jones, who currently serves as UGA football's Player Connection Coordinator, was one of three former Bulldog greats selected to the UGA Athletic Association's 2023 class for the Circle of Honor. It is the highest honor a Bulldog can receive.

* NFL veteran Fernando Velasco (UGA 2003-07) was named to UGA's 40 Under 40 Class of 2023. Currently, he is Director of Player Development for the Atlanta Falcons.

* In September of 2020, it was announced that Kirby and Mary Beth Smart contributed \$1 million to UGA to go towards the Athletic Association's new social justice program, scholarships for senior athletes whose seasons were affected by the pandemic and the expansion of the football program.

No. 1 GEORGIA 34, No. 14 CLEMSON 3

Aug. 31, 2024 • Mercedes-Benz Stadium • Atlanta

ATLANTA, Ga. — Led by a stifling performance from its defense, the top-ranked Georgia football team opened its 2024 season Saturday with a dominant 34-3 win over No. 14 Clemson in the Aflac Kickoff Game in front of a sellout crowd of 78,827 inside Mercedes-Benz Stadium and a national audience on ABC.

The Bulldogs (1-0) were leading 20-3 in the fourth quarter when quarterback Carson Beck hit sophomore wide receiver London Humphreys for a 40-yard touchdown to lift much of the crowd of 78,827 to its feet and blow the game open with 9:57 remaining. Beck finished 23 of 33 passing for 278 yards and two touchdowns, the Georgia offense racked up 447 yards, and the Bulldog defense, which got an interception from safety Malaki Starks in the fourth quarter, held the Tigers (0-1) to just 188 yards.

The Bulldogs opened their season with a win for the 11th year in a row. In 2021, the Bulldogs pulled out a 10-3 win over the Tigers in Charlotte, N.C., to open the season. Not unlike that defense-dominated matchup, neither offense got much going early in this year's meeting, and the game was scoreless after the opening quarter. In the second, Georgia's offense continued what became a methodical, 12-play drive that ended with a 30-yard Peyton Woodring field goal and a 3-0 lead.

Later in the second, Woodring blasted a career-long 55-yard field goal to make it 6-0 Georgia with 4:16 to play in the quarter.

Georgia got the ball to start the second half and quickly went to work. Receiver Arian Smith ran the ball for seven yards on first down and then had a 32-yard reception on the next play. Wideout Dillon Bell ran for 27 yards up the left side, and soon after, Beck hit receiver Colbie Young for a seven-yard touchdown and a 13-0 lead with 12:01 to play in the third.

Clemson put together its best drive on the ensuing possession and had a first down at the Georgia 7. But the Bulldogs held the Tigers to a 26-yard Nolan Hauser field goal that cut the Georgia lead to 13-3 with 6:34 to go in the third quarter.

The Bulldogs responded with another touchdown drive. This one began with a short pass from Beck to tailback Nate Frazier that led to a 24-yard gain — and ended with a 1-yard Frazier run for the score and a 20-3 lead with 3:15 remaining in the quarter. Georgia also got a 23-yard completion from Beck to wideout London Humphrey on third-and-10 to keep the drive going.

Early in the fourth, Beck found Humphrey for the 40-yard score that made it 27-3. Later in the period, after Starks' interception, Cash Jones ran the ball in from the 15 to push the lead to 34-3. Linebacker Jalon Walker led the defense with six tackles, including 1.5 sacks.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"Anytime you play in Atlanta in this facility and it's part of a title-sponsor game where you're playing another top-15, top-20 (team), to me it feels like a playoff game. It's a great way to try to assess where you are as a team."



Freshman Nate Frazier ran for 83 yards and scored on a 1-yard run.

Worth Noting...

- With the win, Georgia has won 11 straight season-openers and 40 consecutive regular-season games, a run that began in 2020. The Bulldogs have won 47 of their last 49 games.
- Linebacker Jalon Walker's six tackles led a group of 13 Bulldogs with at least two stops. Walker also led the defense with 1.5 sacks, while linebacker Mykel Williams had a team-high 2.0 tackles for loss.
- Malaki Starks' leaping fourth-quarter interception was the sixth of his career and looked almost exactly like his interception against Oregon in the 2021 Aflac Kickoff Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.
- Arian Smith led a large group of pass-catchers with a career-high five receptions for 56 yards. Nine different Bulldogs had at least one catch and eight caught at least two.
- Running back Brandon Robinson, in his first game since the 2022 College Football Playoff National Championship Game on Jan. 9, 2023, got the start in the backfield for Georgia. Robinson suffered a season-ending ruptured patella tendon less than two weeks before the 2023 opener. In his return, Robinson had seven carries for 12 yards.
- The captains for the Clemson game were quarterback Carson Beck, offensive lineman Tate Ratledge, Starks and Williams. All four were among Georgia's conference-leading 15 preseason All-SEC selections.
- Former Georgia coach Mark Richt gave the invocation on the field prior to kickoff Saturday, while legendary kicker Kevin Butler was the Bulldogs' honorary captain.



No. 1 GEORGIA 48, TENNESSEE TECH 3

Sept. 7, 2024 • Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium • Athens

ATHENS, Ga. — Led by five touchdown passes from quarterback Carson Beck, the top-ranked Georgia football team earned its 26th consecutive win at Sanford Stadium on Saturday, routing Tennessee Tech 48-3 in the Bulldogs' home opener. The victory, in front of a crowd of 93,033 and a national audience on SEC Network+.

Beck completed his first 11 passes, for 111 yards, and threw three touchdown passes in the first half. Beck sat out much of the second half after the game was a runaway, ending up 18 of 25 passing for 242 yards and five touchdowns. Beck is the eighth Georgia passer to throw five TD passes in a game.

While the Georgia (2-0) offense piled up 498 yards, averaging 8.2 yards per play, the Bulldog defense held the Golden Eagles (0-2) to 134 yards of total offense and just 2.8 yards per play. Tech's only points came on a 32-yard field goal on the game's final play.

On Tech's first play from scrimmage, the Golden Eagles were stopped for a four-yard loss. The first time a Georgia player got his hands on the ball was when Anthony Evans III returned the Golden Eagles' first punt, going 46 yards down to the Tech 22-yard line. On the Bulldogs' first offensive play, Beck hit wide receiver Dillon Bell on the left edge of the end zone for a touchdown and a 7-0 lead less than three minutes into the game.

After the Bulldog defense forced another punt, the Georgia offense kept rolling. On third-and-11 at the UGA 41, Beck hit Oscar Delp for 13 yards. On the next play, Beck hit Dominic Lovett for 12, followed by a 14-yard completion to Arian Smith. A short pass to Brandon Robinson on the next play resulted in a 14-yard gain, and on first-and-goal at the 6, Beck connected with Colbie Young for a six-yard touchdown and a 14-0 lead.

The Bulldogs later got a 27-yard Peyton Woodring to push their lead to 17-0 with 11:45 to play in the half. And just before halftime, Georgia took a 24-0 lead after Beck hit Lovett for a 10-yard touchdown.

Georgia got the ball to open the second half, and soon another Beck pass was in the air for a touchdown. This time, on first down at the 50, Beck lofted one deep to Smith for the 50-yard score and a 31-0 lead.

Tech fumbled on its next drive, the game's first turnover, and safety Dan Jackson recovered the loose ball at the 27. Soon after, following a penalty, Beck lofted an easy pass to an open Lawson Luckie on the left side for a 37-yard touchdown and a 37-0 lead.

Gunner Stockton took over at quarterback midway through the third quarter and led the Bulldogs on another touchdown drive, with Branson Robinson scoring on a 13-yard rush. Stockton finished the game 10 of 12 passing for 90 yards. Woodring kicked a 32-yard field goal with 3:07 remaining in the game to make it 48-0 Bulldogs.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"It's awesome being home. Every time you walk into Sanford Stadium and see it packed — I give our fans credit, they were in the heat, they fought the heat and came and were loud, especially early. I think it was good entertainment; we scored on that first play on offense and got things rolling in the first half. I was proud of our fans."

Worth Noting...

- The win was Georgia's 26th in a row at Sanford Stadium and the Bulldogs' 41st straight regular-season victory — both are the most in program history and are the longest active streaks among all FBS teams. Georgia has now won 48 of its last 50 games.
- Georgia's 2024 senior class is now 44-2, including a 38-0 record in the regular season. This year's seniors are chasing the all-time mark set by the Class of 2023, which went 50-4 overall, won two national titles, an SEC crown, and went 6-0 in bowl/CFP games.
- In his first appearance as a Bulldog, running back Trevor Etienne rushed for 78 yards on five carries, including a 45-yarder, and caught two passes for 14 yards. As a group, Georgia's backs rushed for 166 yards on 24 attempts.
- This was Georgia's third win over Tennessee Tech in three meetings. The Bulldogs won 67-0 in 1943 and 38-0 in 2009.
- During a timeout in the opening quarter, longtime Georgia Director of Sports Communications Claude Felton, who retired in January after 45 years on the job, was recognized on the field. Saturday also marked the debut of the Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium Press Box, which has a floor honoring Felton and one honoring his predecessor, Dan Magill.
- The captains were offensive lineman Xavier Truss, running back Cash Jones, nose guard Nazir Stackhouse and linebacker Chaz Chambliss. The Bulldogs won the toss and elected to defer to the second half.

No. 1 GEORGIA 13, KENTUCKY 12

Sept. 14, 2024 • Kroger Field • Lexington, Ky.

LEXINGTON, Ky. — The top-ranked Georgia football team scratched and clawed its way to a 13-12 win over Kentucky in the Bulldogs' SEC opener Saturday night in front of a crowd of 61,663 at Kroger Field and a national television audience on ABC. Down 9-3 in the third quarter of a game dominated by the defenses, the Bulldogs got a 30-yard Peyton Woodring field goal and a three-yard Branson Robinson touchdown to take the lead for good.

The win is Georgia's 42nd in a row during the regular season, 28th straight in SEC regular-season games, and the program's 15th straight over Kentucky. Georgia had just 63 yards of offense in the first half before finding some rhythm and hitting some big plays in the second to finish with 262.

Georgia's defense held Kentucky to 284 yards, 3.9 yards per play, and forced a turnover that led to a Bulldog field goal. Cornerback Daylen Everette led the defense with eight tackles, including six solo. Eleven Bulldogs had at least four stops.

Kentucky took a 3-0 lead on a school-record 55-yard Alex Raynor field goal with 2:45 left in the opening quarter. The field goal marked the first first-half points that the Bulldogs had allowed this season.

In the second quarter, consecutive 15-yard penalties on Georgia's defense, plus a 15-yard Brock Vandagriff run on third-and-12, put the Wildcats in Georgia territory. A Tyrion Ingram-Dawkins sack led to a six-yard loss. On the next play, Raylen Wilson sacked and stripped Vandagriff, and Damon Wilson II recovered the ball for Georgia at the Kentucky 23.

The turnover led to a 34-yard Woodring field goal, tying the game 3-3 with 3:48 to play in the half. The Wildcats answered with a drive inside the Georgia 20 and another Raynor field goal, this one a 32-yarder that put Kentucky ahead 6-3 at the half.

The Wildcats got the ball to start the second half and drove down to the Bulldog 22 before having to settle for a 40-yard Raynor field goal that pushed the Kentucky lead to 9-3.

Georgia's offense had its best drive of the game on the ensuing possession, with Beck completing a 33-yard pass to Lovett, followed soon after by a 20-yard completion to Dillon Bell. However, the Bulldogs eventually had to settle for a 30-yard Woodring field goal.

The Bulldog defense forced a three-and-out on Kentucky's next drive, and the offense took over at the Georgia 32. Trevor Etienne touched the ball on five straight plays on the drive, resulting in 49 yards, and Robinson ran the ball in from the 3 for a touchdown and the Bulldogs' first lead of the game, 13-9, with 12:20 to play.

Kentucky answered with an 11-play drive that resulted in a 51-yard Raynor field goal, cutting the Bulldog lead to 13-12 with 8:01 remaining. Neither team was able to produce any points after that.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"I don't know that we can rest and recover (next week). I mean, that's what people think bye weeks mean. We've got to find a way to improve and get better. You know, we were really beat up coming into this game, specifically at one position (defensive line), and it was a really tough week for us."

Worth Noting...

- The Bulldogs were held to three first downs and 63 total yards in the first half, their lowest yardage output in an opening half since 2009. The offense produced some big plays (and 199 yards) in the second half, including a pair of 33-yard completions to Dominic Lovett. Lovett led all receivers with six catches for 89 yards.
- Facing off against his former (and hometown) team, Kentucky quarterback Brock Vandagriff threw for 114 yards and ran for 26. Georgia sacked Vandagriff three times and forced a fumble on two of them, one of which the Bulldogs recovered and led to a field goal in the second quarter.
- Eight Bulldogs had at least five tackles, led by cornerback Daylen Everett and safety Malaki Starks with eight each. Georgia's defense has yet to allow a touchdown through three games.
- After punting a total of five times in Georgia's first two games, Brett Thorson punted six times against Kentucky. He averaged 49.5 yards per boot, with a long a 58. Seven of Thorson's 11 punts this season have been downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line.
- Not only has Georgia won 15 straight games against Kentucky, the Bulldogs have also won eight in a row in the Wildcats' stadium. Georgia is 22-4 all-time at Kroger Field.
- The captains against Kentucky were linebacker Smael Mondon Jr., safety Malaki Starks, running back Trevor Etienne and offensive lineman Tate Ratledge. Kentucky won the toss and deferred to the second half.
