# **QUICK NOTES**

- Kentucky will play host to No. 1 Georgia on Saturday at 7:30 p.m. ET, as the Wildcats seek their fourth win over a top-ranked team in school history.
  - UK has lost its last nine meetings against a No. 1 opponent since a triple-overtime win over eventual national champion LSU in 2007.
  - This will be the fourth straight season that Kentucky takes on Georgia, with the Bulldogs ranked No. 1 in the country.
  - The Wildcats have two former Bulldogs in their lineup, including quarterback Brock Vandagriff and linebacker Jamon Dumas-Johnson. Vandagriff has completed 53.6 percent of his passes for 199 yards and three touchdowns, while Dumas-Johnson has six tackles, including 1.5 for loss, and had an interception in the season opener.
- Kentucky is coming off a 31-6 home loss to South Carolina in the SEC opener for both teams.
- Kentucky, which is in the midst of a four-game, season-opening homestand, had a unique win in the season opener against Southern Miss on Aug. 31.
  - Originally scheduled for 7:45 p.m. ET, the game was delayed by lightning and didn't begin until 10:05 p.m. It was then stopped by a lightning delay at 11:51 p.m. before being called final at 12:25 p.m. The game ended with 9:56 remaining in the third quarter, as the Wildcats defeated the Golden Eagles, 31-0.
- Demie Sumo-Karngbaye, senior running back, leads the Cats in rushing with 129 yards, averaging 5.2 per carry. Freshman Jason Patterson also averages 5.2 yards per attempt, with 73 vards on 14 carries.
  - The Wildcats await the services of Chip Trayanum, a transfer from Ohio State who is out indefinitely with an injury.
- The Wildcat receiving room is led by juniors Dane Key (5 for 96 yards) and Barion Brown (4 catches for 28 yards, two TDs) and transfer Ja'Mori Maclin (3 for 68).
- The Kentucky defense is paced by steady senior linebacker D'Eryk Jackson with nine tackles.
  - Jackson has led UK in tackles in each of the last two seasons.
- Safety Zion Childress also has nine tackles and leads the team in tackles for loss with four.
- Three Wildcats received preseason All-America nods, including return specialist Barion Brown (Athlon, Phil Steele, Sporting News and USA Today), defensive lineman Deone Walker (AP, Athlon, ESPN, Phil Steele, Sporting News, USA Today and Walter Camp) and defensive back Maxwell Hairston (Athlon).
- Kentucky football head coach Mark Stoops is the longest-tenured active head coach in the Southeastern Conference and the sixth longest-tenured active head coach in FBS.
  - Now in his 12th season at Kentucky, Stoops is one of only 19 head coaches who have coached at least 12 seasons at an SEC school since the league's first season in 1933.

### THE SERIES

- Kentucky trails Georgia, 63-12-2, in the all-time series, losing the last 14 straight matchups.
  - The Cats trail the Dogs, 30-7, in games played in Lexington, including the last eight.
- Kentucky has defeated Georgia three times when the Bulldogs were ranked, the last time being a 16-10 vicory over No. 11 UGA in Lexington in 1988.

# **THE TIES**

- Kentucky's roster has 16 players from the state of Georgia and two transfers from the Bulldogs.
  - Brock Vandagriff, junior quarterback, spent three seasons in Athens (2021-23), where he appeared in a total of 13 games.
  - Jamon Dumas-Johnson, senior linebacker, spent three seasons in Athens (2021-23), where he totaled 126 tackles, including 9.5 for loss, and was a first-team All-American in 2022.
- Other Kentucky players from the state of Georgia inlcude defensive backs Jonquis "JQ"
   Hardaway (Columbus), Jiquavious "Quavo" Marshall (Macon), Troy Booker (Evans); running
   back Jamarion Wilcox (Douglasville); wide receiver Darius Cannon (Gainesville); kicker Alex
   Raynor (Kennesaw); linebackers Grant Godfrey (Suwanee), Quintavion Norman (Covington),
   Devin Smith (Brunswick), Antwan Smith (Atlanta), D'Eryk Jackson (Dublin); offensive linemen
   Jalen Farmer (Covington), Kyle Mixon (Warner Robins) and defensive linemen Dennious
   Jackson (Augusta) and Tayvion Gadson (Savannah).
- The Georgia roster has no players from the state of Kentucky.

# **WILDCATS AGAINST NO. 1 TEAMS**

- Kentucky is 3-17 all-time against No. 1-ranked opponents, including a 0-3 record against topranked Georgia.
  - The Wildcats No. 1-ranked triumphs are as follows:
    - Oklahoma, 13-7, in the Jan. 1, 1951, Sugar Bowl, breaking the Sooners' 31-game win streak
    - 27-20 vs. Ole Miss (in Jackson) in 1964
    - A 43-37 triple-OT thriller at home vs. eventual national champion LSU in 2007
- This will be the fourth consecutive season UK has faced a top-ranked Georgia team.
  - No. 1 UGA defeated UK, 51-13, in Athens in 2023.
  - No. 1 UGA defeated UK, 16-6, at Kroger Field in 2022
  - No. 1 UGA defeated UK, 30-13, in Athens in 2021

# **WILDCATS AGAINST RANKED TEAMS**

- Kentucky has played 271 ranked teams in the Associated Press poll in its history, while the Wildcats are 52-214-5 in those games.
  - UK went 2-4 against ranked teams in 2023, defeating No. 22/23 Florida at home on Sept. 30 and No. 9/9 Louisville on the road on Nov. 25. UK fell to No. 1/1 Georgia in Athens on Oct. 7, No. 21/20 Tennessee on Oct. 28, No. 8/8 Alabama on Nov. 11 and No. 22/RV Clemson on Dec. 29 in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl.
    - Please note, Missouri was ranked No. 25 in the Coaches Poll when the two teams met on Oct. 14, but unranked in the AP poll.
- UK's win over No. 9/9 UofL marked the highest AP-ranked triumph of the Mark Stoops era and it tied for the eighth-highest AP-ranked triumph in program history.
- The Wildcats are 7-8 against their last 15 ranked AP-ranked teams, dating back to a win over NC State in the 2020 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl.
  - Since 2018, the Cats are 11-15 against AP-ranked teams.

# **KENTUCKY IN THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE**

- The Wildcats have a 188-407-12 (.319) all-time record in Southeastern Conference games.
  - UK head coach Mark Stoops has a 30-56 (.349) all-time record in SEC games.

# **SEPTEMBER IN THE SOUTH**

- Since 2021, Kentucky is 5-1 in Southeastern Conference games played in September.
- Since 2018, Kentucky is 8-5 in SEC games played in September.
  - Since 2018, UK has won all of its SEC games played in September in four of seven seasons (three in 2018, two in 2021, one in 2022, two in 2023).

# **1K FOR BARION BROWN, DANE KEY & JA'MORI MACLIN**

- Barion Brown and Dane Key eclipsed 1,000 career yards receiving in the same game as sophomores last season at South Carolina on Nov. 18, 2023.
  - Brown concluded last season with 1,167 career yards receiving after he became the 33rd player in program history to eclipse 1K.
  - Key concluded last season with 1,155 career yards receiving after he became the 34th player in program history to eclipse 1K.
- Ja'Mori Maclin, who played the last two seasons at North Texas (2022-23) after transferring from Missouri (2020-21), led the wide receiver room ahead of the season with 1,389 career yards receiving. In fact, he recorded 1,004 of those yards just last season, logging 57 catches and 11 scores at North Texas in 2023.
  - Fun Fact: While Maclin committed to Kentucky prior to the hiring of offensive coordinator Bush Hamdan, Hamdan was actually Maclin's wide receivers coach at Missouri in 2020 and 2021.







# **KEEP CALM AND BARION**

- While Barion Brown is most honored and praised for his success returning kicks, he also led Kentucky with 43 catches for 539 yards and four touchdowns as a sophomore in 2023.
  - He added 12 rushes for 147 yards and one rushing TD last season.
- The Wildcat just snapped his streak of 27 straight games every game of his collegiate career – with a reception in the loss to the Gamecocks on Sept. 7.
  - He needs just three more catches to become the 20th player in Kentucky history with at least 100 receptions.
  - Fun Fact: Coming off the season opener where he led his team with four catches and a
    pair of touchdowns receiving in the abbreviated game against Southern Miss on Aug.
     31, Brown became the first player in program history to record a touchdown in three
    straight season openers since Marc Logan in 1984-86.

# **BIG BLUE WALL**

# **BETTER WITH AGE**

- Prior to the start of 2024, Kentucky's offensive linemen combine for 207 career games played and 143 career games started in the FBS.
  - UK's 143 career games started was ranked second in the Southeastern Conference and ninth in the FBS.
- UK's offensive line includes five returners that appeared in at least 12 games in 2023.
   Those core returners started in 76.9 percent of possible starts equaling 50 total starts in 2023.
  - Eli Cox and Marques Cox started all 13 games, while Jager Burton started in all 12 games that he appeared.
  - Dylan Ray started in 10 of 13 games played, while Courtland Ford started in two of 13 games played.

# THE COX BROTHERS

- Eli Cox and Marques Cox not actually brothers by the way returned for their sixth and seventh seasons, respectively, in 2024.
  - Going into Week 3 in 2024, between the two of them, they combine for 97 career games played and 86 career games started.
  - Fun Fact: Eli Cox has played center for three different quarterbacks at Kentucky, including Will Levis, Devin Leary and now Brock Vandagriff. Levis and Leary are currently in the NFL.

# THE QUARTERBACK ROOM

Prior to the start of the season, none of Kentucky's four quarterbacks had started a game in Blue and White, but three of the four players have collegiate experience:

- Gavin Wimsatt played in 25 games at Rutgers over the last three seasons. He started 19 games, including all 13 in 2023. He totaled 2,537 passing yards and 14 touchdowns and also had 628 net rushing yards and 11 TDs.
- Brock Vandagriff played in 13 games at Georgia over the last three seasons (no starts) from 2021-23. He completed 12-of-21 passes for 165 yards and two touchdowns and had 46 net rushing yards during that stretch.
- Beau Allen played five games as a reserve at UK in 2020-21 before transferring to Tarleton State, where he passed for 2,836 yards and 23 touchdowns in 2022.

# **BROCK O'CLOCK**

- Making his first collegiate start, Brock Vandagriff completed 12-of-18 passes for 169 yards and three touchdowns, all of which marked career highs, in a shortened game because of lightening in the area in the season opener against Southern Miss on Aug. 31.
- He added 35 yards rushing in that game, while his 34 yards rushing in the first quarter already eclipsed his career high, which was 27 yards against Kentucky in 2023.
  - Of his four rushes in the first quarter, three were first downs.

# **WISE WILDCATS**

- This season, Kentucky retained nine starters on defense from 2023, including:
  - Defensive linemen: Octavious Oxendine, Keeshawn Silver and Deone Walker
  - Linebackers: Alex Afari Jr., J.J. Weaver and D'Eryk Jackson
  - Defensive backs: Maxwell Hairston, Jordan Lovett and Zion Childress
- Altogether, 16 defenders on the roster have seen significant action for at least two seasons, either at Kentucky or another school in the FBS, including six defensive linemen, five defensive backs and five linebackers.
  - Another nine defenders have seen significant action for one season either at Kentucky or elsewhere.

# A DEFENSE THAT RANKS...

Heading into Week 3 in 2024, defensive coordinator Brad White's defense ranks among the top 10 in the nation in several categories.

# **STOPPING THE RUN**

- Kentucky has held 10 of its last 16 opponents 62.5 percent to less than 100 yards rushing, dating back to the final game of 2022.
  - That includes the five yards rushing Kentucky held Southern Miss to in the abbreviated season opener on Aug. 31. That marked the fewest since 2019, when UT Martin had minus-12 yards rushing.
- The Wildcats concluded last season ranked second in the SEC and 17th in the nation in rushing defense, allowing opponents just 113.1 yards per game in 2023.
  - The Cats held each of their first five opponents of last season to under 100 yards rushing for the first time in program history, based on game-by-game stats available since the 1940s.
    - Going into Week 3 in 2024, the Cats are on track to continue that streak.

# **TURNOVERS GAINED**

- UK concluded last season ranked third in the SEC in turnovers gained, forcing 18 for an average of 1.4 per game - in 2023.
- UK has grabbed three turnovers, 1.5 per game, so far this season.

# **DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS**

- UK concluded last season ranked third in the SEC and tied for eighth in the nation in defensive
  - UK was one of three schools in the SEC and one of 14 schools in the nation to record at least four defensive touchdowns in 2023.





### PICK SIX

UK is tied for second in interceptions returned for touchdowns, among teams in the FBS, since the beginning of 2020, including two each in two different games.

# **MADDD MAXXX**

- Maxwell Hairston made five interceptions, including four against Southeastern Conference opponents, as a sophomore and first-year starter in 2023, running two of those back for touchdowns.
  - He totaled 131 return yards, which marked the most in program history since Greg Long had 176 return yards in 1981.
  - He led the SEC in interceptions (5), interception return average (26.2 yards per return), interception return yards (131) and interception return TDs (2) in 2023.
- His two interceptions returned for touchdowns came in the same game, the conference opener at Vanderbilt on Sept. 24, 2024.
  - He tied the SEC record for interception touchdowns in a game, becoming just the sixth player in league history and the first at UK to have two pick-sixes in one game.
- The Wildcat also recorded the third-most total tackles of anyone on the team in 2023 (68).

# **DEONE WALKER ANCHORING THE LINE**

- Named to nearly every preseason watch list he was eligible for, Deone Walker, a 6-foot-6, 348-pound defensive lineman, is primed to have a big junior season in 2024.
  - Despite battling frequent double teams, he led the Blue and White in tackles for loss (12.5), quarterback sacks (7.5) and quarterback hurries (8). He also added two pass breakups, including one in Kentucky's win over Florida on Sept. 30, which was intercepted by UK and returned to the UF 15-yard line that led to an eventual touchdown.
- The Wildcat was named one of seven permanent team captains last season, as he went on to play in and start all 13 games. In fact, he improved his streak to 24 straight starts, a stretch dating back to his freshman season in 2022.
- Walker set or tied single-game career highs in every category last season, including recording
  nine tackles at South Carolina, 4.0 tackles for loss (-7 yards) at Missouri, 1.0 sacks (-6 yards) last
  at South Carolina, one pass breakup last at Georgia and two quarterback hurries against EKU.

# **ACTION JACKSON**

- Inside linebacker D'Eryk Jackson has led the Wildcats in tackles in each of the last two seasons.
  - He tallied 89 stops a year ago, earning All-SEC First Team honors from Pro Football Focus and All-SEC Third Team honors from Phil Steele.
  - He also led the Cats with 67 tackles in 2022.
- Jackson also has been active in pass defense, totaling four interceptions (one for touchdown)
  and seven pass breakups during his career.
  - He got this season off to a good start on pass defense, deflecting a Southern Miss pass that was intercepted by JQ Hardaway in the season opener on Aug. 31.
- He is tied for the team lead in tackles with nine stops this season in 2024.

### **BRAD'S BENCHMARKS**

- Brad White is in his sixth season as the defensive coordinator, and his seventh season overall
  at Kentucky, since Mark Stoops plucked him from the NFL in 2018. He became defensive
  coordinator in 2019, and UK has steadily become more stout on that side of the ball.
  - Other programs have taken notice, too, as White has turned down several other coaching opportunities in that time.
- Kentucky's defense has remained constant under White, and that is evident by the benchmarks he continues to reach year-in and year-out.
  - The UK defense has held opponents to 30 points or fewer in 51-of-64 games 79.6 percent with White as the defensive coordinator (2019-present).
  - The UK defense has held opponents to 24 points or fewer in 23 of the last 31 games (Nov. 2021-present).
  - UK has allowed 26 points or fewer per game in six straight seasons (2018-23) for the first time since 1983-89.
  - UK has yielded fewer than 160 rushing yards per game for six straight seasons (2018-23) for the first time since 1946-53.

# J.J. WEAVER ON THE ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM AND WUERFFEL TROPHY WATCH LIST

- J.J. Weaver, outside linebacker, has been named a nominee for the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy and the AllState Good Works Team.
- Weaver, who was born with polydactyly, a condition in which a person has more than five fingers
  or toes on one, or on each, hand or foot, has had to face many obstacles in his lifetime. With
  six fingers on his right hand, he was bullied and ridiculed in grade school for being different. But
  that obstacle was nothing compared to what he was about to face during his collegiate years.
  - From July 2020 to August 2021, Weaver lost his father to homicide, sustained a seasonending knee injury and then lost his beloved high school football coach to cancer.
- Inspired by the help he received, Weaver has become an outspoken advocate for mental health
  and counseling. In the fall of 2023, with help from the Kentucky Center for Grieving Children and
  Families, he launched an eight-week peer-led grief counseling group on UK's campus, the first of
  its kind at UK called "The Perfect Fit Support Group."
  - With Weaver's help, "The Perfect Fit Support Group" received a \$40,000 grant by Women in Philanthropy and now will be available to all students on UK's campus beginning in the fall of 2024.
- In Spring 2024, Weaver attended the "Supporting Children and Teens Through Loss" event at the Kentucky Center for Grieving Children and Families, where he spoke to the group about going through grief and participated in a drum circle with the children.
  - In June, he attended the 2024 Annual Symposium on Children's Grief in Denver, Colorado, hosted by the National Alliance for Children's Grief. He shared his story and the work he's doing on UK's campus.
- He's also done many other community service events, including hosting free football camps and two bike drives, providing more than 200 bicycles to children in Lexington and his hometown of Louisville.
- Because of his resilience and work in the community, Weaver recently earned the Kentucky Pro
  Football Hall of Fame's 2024 Ron Butler Character in Adversity Award.







# **MILESTONES REACHED IN 2024**

- Coach Mark Stoops has the most on-field victories (74) in Kentucky history, most SEC victories (35), most home victories (51) and most victories against ranked opponents (13).
- Sophomore **WR Dane Key** has gone over 1,000 career receiving yards. He now has 1,251.
  - He has 84 career receptions, needing just 16 to reach 100.
- Sophomore WR Barion Brown has gone over 1,000 career receiving yards. He now has 1,195.
  - He has the most kickoff return TDs by an active FBS player with four.
  - He currently owns the school record for kickoff return average (min. 30 returns) at 30.3 yards per return.
  - He has 97 career receptions, needing just three to reach 100.
- Junior transfer WR Ja'Mori Maclin has 1,457 receiving yards in his career. He needs 543 to reach 2,000 for his collegiate career.
- Senior LB D'Eryk Jackson has 187 career tackles and led the Cats in both 2022 and 2023. He needs 13 to reach 200.
- Senior LB J.J. Weaver has 18.5 career sacks, tied for fifth in school history. He has 34.0 TFL
  and needs three to reach the top three in school history.

# **WEAVER ON THE CAREER LISTS**

- J.J. Weaver has been a big-play performer during his career in Lexington. Notching a quarterback sack in each of the first two games, he now has 18.5 career sacks tied for fifth in school history, which also ranks seventh in the nation on the active career list.
- He also has 34 tackles for loss and needs three more to reach the top three in school history, which also ranks eighth in the nation on the active career list.

# **RAYNOR'S RETURN**

- Prior to 2023, Kentucky brought in a senior transfer from Georgia Southern to help bring consistency to the program's kicking game in Alex Raynor.
  - He shined in his Kentucky debut against Ball State on Sept. 2, 2023, connecting on all
    three of his field goal attempts, all of which were more than 40 yards, and on all five of his
    extra point attempts. Raynor became the first Kentucky player with three made field goals
    in their UK debut since Taylor Begley against Louisville on Sept. 1, 2002.
  - The Wildcat's first field goal against No. 21/20 Tennessee on Oct. 28, 2023, a 28-yard field goal, made him 7-of-7 on the season at the time. With that, he broke the school record for most consecutive field goals made at the beginning of a career. The previous record of six was held by Joe Mansour (2013) and Miles Butler (all four in 2015, first two of 2018).
  - He concluded the season 10-of-11 on field goals and 48-of-49 on extra points.
- Going into Week 3 in 2024, Raynor is 13-of-14 at field goals and 52-of-53 at extra points in his
  career at Kentucky.
  - He remains perfect 12-of-12 on kicks from 0 to 49 yards at Kentucky.
  - He holds a current field-goal streak of six straight.
  - Ranks second on the NCAA's active career scoring list with 335 points
  - Ranks second on the NCAA's active career PATs list with 161
  - Ranks fifth on the NCAA's active career field goals list with 58
  - Ranks 21st on the NCAA's active career points per game list with 6.6
  - Ranks 19th on the NCAA's active career PATs percentage list (0.976 161-of-165)

- In 2024, Kentucky is in its 52nd season playing at Kroger Field, which was formerly named Commonwealth Stadium (1973-2016).
  - The Cats are 181-145-4 (.555) all-time in the stadium, including 45-29 (.608) under Mark Stoops.

# **NONCONFERENCE COMPETITION**

- The Wildcats have won their last 17 straight nonconference games in the regular season.
  - That streak is second in the nation behind Georgia (25).
- UK has won 15 straight nonconference games at Kroger Field, dating back to the start of 2018.
- Kentucky has won 20 of its last 22 nonconference games.
  - That stretch featured 16 straight nonconference wins, which was the longest active streak in FBS at the time, including four straight bowl wins. The streak began in the season opener on Sept. 1, 2018 and ended in the Music City Bowl game on Dec. 31, 2022.

# **COACHING CHANGES**

- Bush Hamdan was named Kentucky's new offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach
  prior to 2024. Hamdan replaced Liam Coen, who was named the offensive coordinator for the
  Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Hamdan, 38, came to the Bluegrass with 15 years of collegiate and
  NFL coaching experience combined, most recently serving as the offensive coordinator and
  quarterbacks coach at his alma mater, Boise State.
- Daikiel Shorts Jr. was hired as the wide receivers coach. Shorts, 29, came to the Bluegrass after three seasons (2021-23) as the wide receivers coach under Dana Holgorsen at Houston. He also spent two years as the Director of Player Development (2019-20) for the Cougars.
- **Eric Wolford** returned to Lexington as the offensive line coach in 2024. Wolford, who was Kentucky's offensive line coach in 2021, spent the last two seasons in the same position at Alabama. He has over 25 years of coaching experience, including two in the NFL.

# **WILDCATS IN THE NFL DRAFT**

- Four players were drafted in 2024, giving head coach Mark Stoops a total of 28 drafted players since his arrival in 2013.
  - Twenty-four of those 28 selections have come in the last six drafts (2019-24).
  - Sixteen of those 28 selections were defensive players.
- The 2024 NFL Draft marked the sixth straight year UK had at least one player drafted in the first three rounds.

# **KROGER FIELD**

On game day, Kroger Field often becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.



- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 334 games within the friendly confines of newly-named Kroger Field. UK has a 181-145-4 record (.555), 45-29 (.608) under Mark Stoops.
- 2024 marks the 52nd season at the facility.
- UK set a new Kroger Field attendance record when 63,543 fans packed the stadium for the Nov. 3, 2018 game vs. No. 6 Georgia.
- Two of the top five crowds in Kroger Field history came in 2018.
- UK announced its first sellout since 2015 when 62,945 fans attended the Florida game on Sept. 23, 2017.
- Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 60,261 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 30 teams in attendance in 17 of the last 19 seasons. Both the single game and season attendance record has been broken in recent years. \*Note: Kroger Field capacity was limited to 12,000 fans per game in 2020 due to COVID-19 restrictions
- The stadium footprint is named C.M. Newton Grounds at Kroger Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

# **KROGER FIELD**

Commonwealth Stadium was renamed to Kroger Field in May of 2017. The agreement--which is between Kroger and JMI Sports, UK's multimedia rights partner-- begins at approximately \$1.85 million annually with a term of up to 12 years. With the partnership, Kroger becomes the Official Fuel Partner of the University of Kentucky and the Official Grocery Partner of Move-In at UK while also providing additional engagement opportunities with UK students. Per the agreement, Kroger is also the Official Nutrition and Pharmacy Partner of UK Athletics.

Kroger Field was transformed into a state-ofthe-art facility after a \$126-million reinvention which was completed prior to the 2015 season. The project was handled by HNTB. The outside of the stadium underwent a dramatic external facelift, receiving a modern look, but one that remained uniquely Kentucky. Inside, the capacity of Kroger Field was reduced over the course of the two-year project to approximately 61,000, but the value of all remaining seats were increased, from the top of the upper deck to front-row seats at midfield. Concourses were revamped and widened throughout the stadium with improved concessions, restrooms and security. Players and coaches reaped the benefits of the new Kroger Field as well, as hometeam facilities were built, and a multi-purpose recruiting room hosts future Wildcats on their on-campus visits.

# **NEW LIGHTING, RIBBON BOARDS**

In 2024, Kroger Field will feature brand new lighting and ribbon boards. The LED lighting system will include the ability to do light shows during timeouts and breaks in play similar to those at games in Rupp Arena and Kentucky Proud Park. The new ribbon boards have greater functionality, featuring sharper visual resolution than the previous set and expanded capability for display of video and graphics.

# **FACTS AND FIGURES**

<u>Seating Capacity:</u> 61,000, including the Commonwealth Suites

<u>Playing Field:</u> UK switched from natural grass to synthetic turf for the 2015 season. Other SEC schools with a turf surface are: Arkansas, Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Missouri. The end zones and team sideline areas feature a checkerboard pattern in alternating shades of blue. It was designed to mimic the pattern of Secretariat's silks, which has been part of the football uniforms for five seasons. The school's

new interlocking "UK" logo is positioned in the center of the field.

<u>Video Boards:</u> Video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage.

<u>Sound System:</u> Sportsound system delivers pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

# **GAME DAY EXPERIENCES**

The "Cat Walk" on Talbott Todd Way: With the unveiling of the new \$45 million Kentucky Football Training Facility in August of 2016, the headquarters of the program moved next door to Kroger Field. Therefore, the Cat Walk was moved to Talbott Todd Way. The Cat Walk typically begins outside Gate 1 two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff, and the team proceeds past Gate 1 and between Kroger Field and Nutter Field House. It was dedicated to former Wildcat Talbott Todd (1963-65) who passed away from ALS in August of 2017 and was an avid supporter of the program. From Talbott Todd Way the team walks to the locker room in the Joe Craft Kentucky Football Training Facility.

Lift Them Up: A unique partnership with Toyota Motor Manufacturing Kentucky (TMMK), the Kentucky College of Engineering and the Kentucky Children's Hospital was launched in 2019 that brings special guests to the Cat Walk as the Kentucky football team arrives at Kroger Field. A specially built push cart vehicle provides a Kentucky Children's Hospital patient the chance to both accompany the Wildcats on the Cat Walk and attend a game at Kroger Field. A new patient is chosen by the Kentucky Children's Hospital each week to participate.

# **HEAD COACH MARK STOOPS / 12TH SEASON / IOWA, 1989**



The 2023 season marked yet another year of achievement for Coach Mark Stoops and the Kentucky football program.

Kentucky finished the regular season 7-5 and UK's bid to the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl extended Stoops' school record to seven official postseason appearances.

Now in his 12th season at Kentucky, Stoops has the longest term of any coach in school history and the longest term of any active coach in the Southeastern Conference.

Stoops also holds school record for wins (64), home wins (45), SEC wins (30) and wins over ranked opponents (11).

Called "the best program builder in all of college football" in 2021 by ESPN analyst Tom Luginbill, Stoops' success hasn't come easily.

Inheriting a program that was 2-10 the year before he arrived, Stoops' rebuilding efforts took time, but after reaching his first bowl bid in 2016, the coach and the Wildcats haven't looked back.

A partial accounting of Stoops' exploits features:

- A school-record, 16-game win streak against nonconference competition (2018-22), which
  was the nation's longest active streak at the time.
- First top-10 ranking in each the Associated Press poll and the coaches' poll since 2007 (Sept. 11, 2022)
- First consecutive top-10 rankings in each poll since 1977 (Sept. 18, 2022)
- First home win over Florida since 1986, also marking the first win over an Associated Press top 10-ranked opponent since 2010 (2021)
- First win at Tennessee since 1984 (2020)
- First New Year's Day Bowl win since 1951 (2018 season)
- First 10-win season since 1977 (2018)
- First SEC Coach of the Year since 1983 (2018)
- First final poll ranking since 1984 (2018)
- First bowl win since 2008 (2018 season)
- First win vs. Florida since 1986 (2018)
- First bowl appearance since 2010 (2016)
- Off the field, Stoops is a staunch supporter of the Kentucky Children's Hospital, helping raise
  more than \$500,000 annually for the kids. He was named the Honorary Coach of the 2022 AFCA
  Good Works Team.
- Kentucky's football team has fared well academically under Stoops, as each year UK's football score in the NCAA Academic Progress Rate has been well above the benchmark of 930.

Several of Stoops' players have also won All-America accolades, along with honors such as the Bronko Nagurski Award, Chuck Bednarik Award, Paul Hornung Award, Ronnie Lott Trophy, Ray Guy Award, Danny Wuerffel Trophy, Jason Witten Man of the Year, Pop Warner Award, Academic All-America and National Good Works Team.

Off the field, Stoops has been active in fundraising and events for the UK Children's Hospital and he was named Honorary Coach of the 2022 National Good Works Team.

The bountiful crop of victories and honors are the fruit of the last eight seasons, but the harvest didn't come easily. Arriving in 2013, taking over a team that had gone 2-10 the season before, it took three years of plowing, planting and growing before the results came.

Stoops earned his first bowl game as head coach in 2016, when the Wildcats overcame an 0-2 start to go 7-3 down the stretch and advance to the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl. UK duplicated seven wins in 2017, playing in the Franklin-American Mortgage Music City Bowl.

Led by linebacker Josh Allen, the National Defensive Player of the Year, and Benny Snell Jr., the school's all-time leading rusher, the 2018 squad went 10-3. It was UK's best season in 41 years, topped by a win over Penn State in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. It was only the third 10-win season in school history.

In addition, the 2018 campaign featured a win at Florida -- the Wildcats' first victory over the Gators in 32 years -- resulting in UK being named the National Team of the Week by the Football Writers Association of America. The regular season concluded with a 56-10 win at in-state rival Louisville, the largest margin of victory in the history of the Governor's Cup series.

UK was No. 11 in the final *USA Today* coaches' poll and No. 12 in the final Associated Press tabulation, the school's first appearance in the final rankings since 1984. The 2018 season also continued a remarkable trend -- since Stoops took over as coach of the Cats in 2013, UK was the only school in the nation that tied or improved its win total in six straight seasons.

CollegeFootballNews.com listed Stoops as the best coaching performance of the season and he was named Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year by The Associated Press, Athlon Sports and the league coaches.

The 2019 season was one of the most unusual in school history. A succession of injuries decimated the quarterbacks and Stoops turned to wide receiver Lynn Bowden Jr. to man the QB position. Running the ball almost exclusively, UK went 6-2 down the stretch and closed the season with four straight wins, topped by a dramatic come-from-behind Belk Bowl win over Virginia Tech when

Bowden threw the game-winning touchdown pass with only 15 seconds remaining.

Stoops followed with the Covid-shortened 2020 season that was capped by a Gator Bowl win over No. 23 North Carolina State.

More winning seasons and bowl appearances have followed, giving Stoops the school records in both categories.

How has Stoops accomplished all of this? The coach would tell you that there's been nothing magical about the process.

True to his blue-collar roots in Youngstown, Ohio, the methodical advancement made by Stoops' teams is a reflection of the coach's rocksteady work ethic, tireless recruiting, and ability to adapt.

Stoops came to Kentucky from Florida State, where he was defensive coordinator from 2010-12. He inherited a unit a unit ranked 108th in the nation in total defense and turned it into one of the nation's best. In the 2012 season. the Seminoles were second in the nation in total defense, allowing 254.1 yards per game, and sixth nationally in scoring defense at 14.7 points per game. Playing well against the run and the pass, FSU was third in the country in rushing defense and led the nation in pass defense. FSU led the ACC in seven defensive categories. Stoops also coached the defensive backs under head coach Jimbo Fisher.

Eight Seminoles on defense earned 2012 All-ACC honors, including four first-team selections, highlighted by one of the nation's top defensive end duos in Bjoern Werner and Cornellius Carradine, who combined for 24 sacks and 31 tackles for loss. Werner was a finalist for the 2012 Bronko Nagurski Award as the National Defensive Player of the Year and was among the national leaders in sacks with 13. Stoops also coached cornerback Ronald Darby to ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year. The Seminoles' prowess was a continuation of the 2011 season, when Stoops' defenders led the nation in fewest yards allowed per carry (2.3), ranked fourth in the nation in total defense (275 yards per game), second in rushing defense (82.7 ypg), fourth in scoring defense (15.1 points per game), and eighth in tackles for loss (8.6 per game) and quarterback sacks (3.1 per game). FSU led the ACC in eight defensive categories.

Stoops overhauled the Florida State defense in 2010, his first season as defensive coordinator. The Seminoles gave up 19.6 points per game, third-best in the ACC and 20th nationally. FSU ranked 42nd nationally in total defense that season; in contrast, the team was 108th nationally in total defense and 94th in scoring defense in 2009, the year before Stoops' arrival. FSU improved its overall defense by more than 80 yards per game, primarily by limiting opponents to 75 fewer rushing yards per game. The Seminoles ranked third in the nation in quarterback sacks and were 21st in tackles for loss. In the secondary, Stoops coached Xavier Rhodes to ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year honors and National Defensive Freshman of the Year accolades. During Stoops' three seasons, FSU went 10-4, 9-4 and 12-2, including wins over South Carolina in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl, Notre Dame in the 2011 Champs Sports Bowl and Northern Illinois in the 2013 Orange Bowl.

Stoops was defensive coordinator and DBs coach at Arizona from 2004-09, working for his brother, Mike, who was head coach of the Wildcats. During Mark's time there, Arizona's records improved steadily, going 3-8, 3-8, 6-6, 5-7, 8-5 and 8-5. The Wildcats advanced to the Las Vegas Bowl and Holiday Bowl during the last

Stoops inherited an Arizona unit that was 109th in the nation in total defense and 107th in scoring defense in 2003, the year before he arrived. By the end of his term at Arizona, the Wildcats ranked in the nation's top 25 in total

defense his final two seasons and ranked as high as 33rd in scoring defense.

Mark and Mike are also brothers of Bob Stoops, who spent 18 years as the Oklahoma head coach and has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame. The eldest Stoops brother, Ron Jr., is retired after coaching at Youngstown State. Mark and Mike have reunited in Lexington, as Mike joined the UK staff in 2022 as inside linebackers coach.

Prior to Arizona, Mark Stoops coached the defensive backs three years at Miami (Fla.). The 2001 national champion Hurricanes led the nation in pass efficiency defense, scoring defense and turnover margin. That team also established a school record with 27 interceptions and 45 total takeaways.

Stoops' 2002 secondary led the nation in pass defense and pass efficiency defense. Despite having to replace all four starters in the defensive backfield, the 2003 team led the nation in pass defense. In his three seasons, Miami went 35-3, including the 12-0 Rose Bowl title campaign, plus appearances in the Fiesta and Orange bowls. Ten Miami defensive backs who played at least one season under Stoops were eventually selected in the National Football League draft – seven in the first round.

Stoops got his first experience in leading a defense as co-defensive coordinator at Houston in the 2000 season. He coached the secondary at Wyoming from 1997-99 and the Cowboys notched three straight winning seasons. A highlight of his time there was a school-record 24 interceptions in the '97 season. His first fulltime coaching job was in 1996 at South Florida, helping USF in the start-up of its program before the Bulls had their first kickoff in '97.

Stoops has recruited and developed numerous outstanding defensive backs, many of whom went on to National Football League careers. Among the notables are Antoine Cason

and Michael Johnson at Arizona, Miami's Philip Buchanon, Kelly Jennings, Brandon Meriweather, Ed Reed, Antrel Rolle, Mike Rumph and Sean Taylor and Wyoming's Brian Lee.

Stoops was raised in Youngstown, Ohio. As did brothers Bob and Mike, Mark played in the secondary at the University of Iowa for Hall of Fame coach Hayden Fry. He participated in four bowl games as a player. Fry hired Stoops as a graduate assistant coach at Iowa in the 1990 and '91 seasons. The Hawkeyes won the 1990 Big Ten title and played in the Rose Bowl, duplicating feats Stoops also achieved as a player. Stoops went on to coach four years in high school before entering the collegiate ranks.

Stoops has two sons, Will and Zack.

Bush Hamdan is the newest member of Kentucky's coaching staff, hired as the new offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach on Feb. 14, 2024.

Hamdan comes to the Bluegrass with 15 years of collegiate and NFL coaching experience combined, most recently serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at his alma mater, Boise State.

Boise State tied for the 2023 regular-season championship of the Mountain West Conference, then won the league championship game with a victory at UNLV. The Broncos went on to play in the LA Bowl. The Broncos were second in the MWC in scoring offense and third in total offense.

Hamdan was a three-year letter winner and two-time team captain as a quarterback at Boise State from 2006-08. His last three seasons, all played under Petersen, the Broncos posted a 35-4 overall record, including a perfect 13-0 mark and a win over Oklahoma in the Fiesta Bowl in 2006. As a senior, he earned the Bronco Excellence Award for integrity and leadership.

VInce Marrow, aka the "Big Dawg," enters his 12th season at Kentucky, currently handling the duties of associate head coach/tight ends coach/recruiting coordinator/NFL liasison.

Marrow's tight ends have been a big factor in UK producing six seasons of 2,000 or more rushing yards with at least one 1,000-yard rusher in all six of those (Stanley "Boom" Williams -2016; Benny Snell Jr., - 2017, 2018; Lynn Bowden - 2019; Chris Rodriguez Jr. - 2021, Ray Davis - 2023). Marrow also has been instrumental in UK signing 11 straight top-50 recruiting classes, including the highest-rated class in UK history in 2021.

Marrow had a professional playing career as a member of NFL rosters on five teams, including Buffalo, Carolina, New York Jets, Chicago and San Francisco. After his NFL days ended, Marrow played for the Frankfurt Galaxy of NFL Europe in 1998, earning all-league honors with 32 receptions for 345 yards. He also played for the Orlando Rage in the XFL in 2001.

He began his collegiate playing career at Youngstown State before transferring to Toledo. Marrow played two seasons at Toledo, earning second-team All-MAC honors in 1991 before being drafted by the Bills in 1992.

# **KENTUCKY 31, SOUTHERN MISS O**

# AUG. 31, 2024 • LEXINGTON, KY. KROGER FIELD (61,627)



Brock Vandagriff passed for three touchdowns and the Kentucky defense was stout all night as the Cats beat Southern Miss 31-0 in a weather-shortened season opener at Kroger Field.

Vandagriff, making his first career start, connected on 12 of 18 passing for 169 yards and those three scores. Demie Sumo-Karngbaye rushed eight times for 59 yards and a score. The UK defense held Southern Miss to just 131 yards and no points.

Kentucky took the opening kickoff and, after a good return by freshman Willie Rodriguez, the Cats started at their own 48 yard line. The Cats would drive deep into Southern Miss territory before Vandagriff's pass intended for Ja'Mori Maclin was tipped and intercepted by the Golden Eagles' Dylan Lawrence at the USM 15.

On the second play of the Southern Miss drive, UK linebacker Jamon Dumas-Johnson intercepted a Tate Rodemaker pass and the Cats took over at their own 41.

Kentucky would get on the board on the ensuing drive. Big plays by Maclin, Sumo-Karngbaye and Vandagriff propelled the offense down the field. UK covered 59 yards in 10 plays, ending with a 12-yard touchdown pass from Vandagriff to Barion Brown. Alex Raynor added the point after and the Cats led 7-0 with 6:03 remaining in the first quarter.

On the next possession, it appeared that the Cats were going to force a Southern Miss punt but a Rodemaker pass to Kyirin Heath went for a 34-yard gain and the Golden Eagles were near midfield with a new set of downs. The USM drive would continue into the red zone as the first quarter came to a close with the Cats leading 7-0.

As the second quarter started, the Golden Eagles appeared ready to tie the game. But Rodemaker's pass was tipped by D'Eryk Jackson and intercepted by J.Q. Hardaway in the end zone, ending the threat.

The Cats would go to Sumo-Karngbaye on the next drive, and he would deliver. Rushes of 10, 22 and three yards got the Cats into Southern Miss territory. However, the drive would stall and the Cats would be forced to punt.

A Wilson Berry punt pinned Southern Miss inside their own 10, and the UK defense forced a three-and-out on the following possession. The Cats would get excellent field possession after a 23-yard USM punt.

Kentucky started its drive from the USM 36 yard line, but the Cats were not able to get a first down. UK would add to its lead when Raynor converted a 41-yard field goal, giving Kentucky a 10-0 advantage with 7:45 left in the first half.

The Kentucky defense would force another three-and-out on the next Southern Miss possession, with a Tre'vonn Rybka sack on third down forcing another change in possession.

UK took over at its own 25 yard line and Vandagriff connected with Dane Key for a 35-yard strike across the middle, getting the Cats into Southern Miss territory. The Cats then got three solid runs from Jamarion Wilcox (10 yards) and Jason Patterson (12 and 11 yards). The Cats would finish the drive with a one-yard touchdown rush from Sumo-Karngbaye. The Raynor PAT made it 17-0 with 3:07 to play in the half.

The Cats' defense forced another three-and-out on the next USM possession. On fourth down, the Golden Eagles attempted a fake punt, but UK's Cam Dooley sniffed it out, made the tackle and the Cats took over at the Southern Miss 29 with 1:52 left in the half.

UK would take advantage of the good field possession, covering 29 yards in just three plays, ending with a 12-yard touchdown pass from Vandagiff to Brown. Raynor made another PAT and the Cats led 24-0 with 31 seconds left in the half. That would be the halftime score.

Southern Miss got the first possession of the third quarter and the Golden Eagles promptly marched into UK territory. However, the UK defense again stopped the drive and forced another USM punt.

Kentucky would mount another scoring drive on its next possession. A Vandagriff to Maclin pass for 46 yards set the Cats up at the Southern Miss eight yard line. Two plays later, Vandagriff connected with tight end Jordan Dingle for a five-yard scoring pass. When Raynor added the point after, Kentucky led 31-0 with 9:56 left in the third quarter.

## **SOUTH CAROLINA 31, KENTUCKY 6**

## SEPT. 7, 2024 • LEXINGTON, KY. KROGER FIELD (61,349)



Demie Sumo-Karngbaye rushed for 70 yards but Kentucky lost its Southeastern Conference opener to South Carolina 31-6 at Kroger Field.

Neither team was able to get much going offensively. South Carolina had 252 yards of total offense while the Cats were held to 183 for the game, including just 44 yards passing.

The UK defense did its best to keep the Cats in the game, registering 12 tackles for loss, including three sacks.

Kentucky (1-1, 0-1 SEC) got the ball first and the Cats

were able to generate one first down before being forced to punt. In fact, the game's first three possessions would end with punts.

On its second possession, South Carolina got a 19-yard completion from LaNorris Sellers to Jared Brown to get the Gamecocks into UK territory. Three plays later, Sellers found Mazeo Bennett wide open for a 24-yard touchdown. Alex Herrera added the point after and South Carolina led 7-0 with 7:39 left in the first quarter.

Kentucky made it into South Carolina territory for the first time on the ensuing possession when Vandagriff connected with Dane Key down the left sideline for a 32-yard gain. However, the Cats were unable to convert and were forced to punt once again.

The Gamecocks started their next drive from their own nine yard line and, after a holding penalty negated a first down, South Carolina was forced to punt again. Kentucky took over at its own 43 yard line, its best field position of the game at that point. However, the Cats went three-and-out and was forced to punt again. South Carolina took possession and, shortly thereafter, the first quarter ended.

South Carolina (2-0, 1-0) punted early in the second quarter and the Cats took over at its own 10 yard line. The Cats were able to get one first down but, on fourth and one from its own 31, the Cats were stuffed and the Gamecocks took over in excellent field position. South Carolina would get inside the UK red zone, but would settle for a 29-yard field goal from Herrera, which was good, and the Gamecocks led 10-0 with 8:06 left in the half.

Kentucky went to the ground on its next drive. Demie Sumo-Karngbaye rushed for 11, six and eight yards before Jason Patterson carried for eight, three and six yards. Using exclusively running plays, Kentucky got inside the South Carolina 20 before the drive stalled. On fourth and two, the Cats got a 32-yard field goal from Alex Raynor, cutting the deficit to 10-3, with 1:55 left in the half.

On South Carolina's next possession, UK safety Ty Bryant intercepted Sellers and returned it to the South Carolina 27 yard line with 1:39 still to play in the half. The Cats got to the Gamecocks' 20 and from there, Raynor made another field goal, this one from 37 yards, to make it 10-6 Gamecocks. That would be the halftime score.

South Carolina got the ball to start the second half and, after getting one first down, the Gamecocks went backwards thanks to consecutive sacks by Maxwell Hairston and Zion Childress. The Gamecocks would eventually punt and Kentucky took over on its own 23 yard line.

The Cats went three-and-out and were forced to punt, with South Carolina taking over at the UK 46. The Gamecocks would get one first down before converting on a third and 14, getting inside the Kentucky red zone. On the next play, Sellers hit Joshua Simon for a 16-yard touchdown. Herrera added the point after and South Carolina led 17-6 with 6:49 left in the third quarter.

The Cats were pinned back on the next possession and eventually punted, with South Carolina taking over at the UK 43. The Gamecocks would take advantage of the prime field position, covering 43 yards in nine plays, ending with a Raheim Sanders touchdown rush from one yard out. Herrera added the point after and the Gamecocks led 24-6 with 28 seconds left in the third quarter.

South Carolina would add a pick six from Nick Emmanwori to lead 31-6.
