We're Coming To Your City

For the first time since 1958, Georgia will face Texas in Austin. Saturday night will be a top five matchup, and ESPN College GameDay will be there too. The teams last met in the 2019 Sugar Bowl in New Orleans with UT holding off the Bulldogs 28-21. The Longhorns own a 4-1 edge in the series.

Georgia is 17-18 all-time with the College GameDay crew on site including 0-1 this year (@ #4 UA). Last year, they were in Athens to see Georgia whip No. 9 Ole Miss 52-17 and in Atlanta when it fell to UA in the SEC Championship Game.

Aiming To Be Elite Against One Tough Slate

The Bulldogs opened the 2024 season ranked No. 1 in the AP and US LBM Coaches poll for the third time in school history (2008, 2023). Georgia dropped to No. 2 in the AP poll after its 13-12 road win over Kentucky on Sept. 14 and remained there for another week before falling to No. 4 Alabama on Sept. 28. In this week's AP poll, the Bulldogs are at No. 5 for the third straight week. Georgia was No. 1 in the US LBM Coaches poll until its first loss when it dropped to No. 5. For the second week in a row, Georgia occupies the No. 4 spot. This week's opponent, Texas, is in the top spot in both polls.

The Bulldogs have the longest active streak of being ranked in the AP top 10 (57 straight polls). Last Saturday in Athens, Georgia used an aerial attack of 459 yards (3rd most in school history and most since 1994) to defeat Miss. State 41-31 while Texas dispatched Oklahoma 34-3 in Dallas. UT now leads the nation in Scoring Defense at 6.3 ppg and is seventh in Scoring Offense at 43.2 ppg.

Georgia-Texas Tidbits

***First Meeting:** Georgia entered the 1949 Orange Bowl on an eight-game winning streak and No. 8 AP ranking. Texas was 6-3-1 and playing in its first Orange Bowl and posted a 41-28 win. UT ran 58 times for 324 yards and five TDs, including 107 yards and a score by Tom Landry (eventual Dallas Cowboys Hall of Fame coach) in his final game.

***Second Meeting:** The 1957 contest came at Grant Field in Atlanta in front of a crowd of 33,000 and was the first game of 33-year-old Darrell Royal's tenure at UT as the Longhorns won 26-7.

***Third Meeting:** In 1958 in Austin, Georgia was trailing 6-0 early in the 4th quarter when future Hall of Famer Fran Tarkenton put himself in (coaches had planned to redshirt him as the 3rd-string QB) when he saw starting QB Charlie Britt still sitting on the bench as the team took the field. He ran in and told his teammates, "I've come to win this game." He directed a 21-play, 95-yard TD drive along with a two-point conversion for an 8-6 edge. UT answered with a 17-play, 72-yard TD drive capped by a 1-yard run by Bobby Gurwitz to lift 11th-ranked Texas to a 13-8 win.

***Fourth Meeting:** Ask a Georgia fan what time it is in Texas and you'll likely hear it's Ten to Nine! In the 1984 Cotton Bowl, UT entered 11-0 and ranked No. 2 with a shot at its fifth national championship if it beat No. 7 Georgia (9-1-1). Down 9-3 with less than five minutes left, the Bulldogs took advantage of a muffed punt return by Craig Curry at the UT 24. Gary Moss recovered it and Georgia later scored on a 17-yard scamper by QB John Lastinger with 3:22 remaining for a 10-9 lead as Vince Dooley's Dogs claimed the upset and finished with a No. 4 ranking.

***Fifth Meeting:** Sam Ehlinger finished with three rushing TDs and 169 passing yards to lead Tom Herman's UT squad to a 28-21 upset of No. 6 Georgia in the 2019 Sugar Bowl. The Bulldogs finished 11-3 and ranked No. 7 while UT ended the season 10-4 and No. 9.

SMART Football: Streaks 'n Stuff

*The 2024 Senior Class is an FBS-leading 47-3 (41-1 in the regular season) since 2021. The next best marks in this span belong to Michigan (44-5) and Alabama (41-7). Georgia's only three losses since 2021 have come to Alabama. Georgia's 2023 Senior Class set the school record at 50-4 with two national titles, an SEC crown plus went 6-0 in bowl/CFP games.

*Georgia is 51-3 in its last 54 games. A school record streak of 42 consecutive regular season victories ended Sept. 28 this year with a 41-34 defeat at No. 4 Alabama. Also, Georgia had an SEC and school record streak of 28 consecutive SEC regular season wins snap that night.

*Georgia is the only team to have finished in the top 7 of the final AP poll in each of the past 7 seasons.

*Head coach **Kirby Smart** is unbeaten against all active head coaches over the past five years except Kalen DeBoer (Alabama). Georgia is 67-7 in that span. The coaches no longer active who have wins over Georgia during this stretch: Nick Saban (3) along with **Will Muschamp**, Ed Orgeron and Dan Mullen.

*Georgia is riding a school record 28-game home winning streak dating to 2019, which leads in FBS.

*Georgia owns the nation's longest active bowl streak at 27 seasons and has won its last seven matchups.

*In the Smart era, the Georgia defense has ended the year ranked in the top five nationally in Scoring Defense five times including leading the nation twice (2019 at 12.6 ppg & 2021 at 10.2 ppg). Also, Georgia has been ranked in the final top 10 in Scoring Offense from 2021-23.

*The Bulldogs were the only FBS team to finish the 2023 season nationally ranked in the top five in both Scoring Offense (40.1 ppg/5th) and Scoring Defense (15.6 ppg/5th).

Beck By Popular Demand

Fifth-year senior **Carson Beck**, a 6-4, 220-pound native of Jacksonville, Fla., owns an 18-2 record as a starter. Led Georgia to 13-1 mark in '23.

Stockton saw action in four games last year and completed 63% of his passes (12-for-19) for 148 yards and two TDs. This year, Stockton is 10-for-12 for 90 yards, 0 TDs, 0 INT.

Etienne Leads Backfield With The "Hard Yards"

Georgia's top running backs are **Trevor Etienne**, **Branson Robinson**, who was sidelined in 2023 due to a knee injury, **Cash Jones** and freshman **Nate Frazier**. Etienne has a team-high 335 yards (5.3 avg.) and 4 TDs. The longest Bulldog rush belongs to wideout **Anthony Evans III** (52 vs. MSU).

Georgia has been down two starters on the line the past two games (senior guard **Tate Ratledge** {out 3 games} and junior center **Jared Wilson**).

After the AU game, Georgia coach Kirby Smart complimented Etienne, saying "the touchdowns are great, but that's not what it's about. It's about the hard yards. It's about the 3rd-and-10 catch that he gets and makes it 4th-and-1. It's about the 4th-and-1 play that he gets it and makes one."

*Etienne had a team-best 55 rushing yards and one TD on 12 carries plus two catches for 11 yards at #4 UA. He had 124 all-purpose yards in the win over AU (88-rushing and 2 TDs, 36-rec. on six catches).

*In the season-opening win over #14 CU, Frazier registered 83 yards on 11 carries including a 40-yard scamper and his first TD. Frazier had 38 yards on seven carries against AU. He now has 194 yards on 37 carries (5.2 avg.)

*Jones' lone carry against Clemson was a 15-yard TD that featured an impressive stiff arm. Jones has been a key contributor on special teams.

I Like It, I Lovett

Senior QB **Carson Beck's** top targets have been senior **Dominic Lovett** (27-for-302 yards, 2 TDs), senior **Arian Smith** (23-for-412 yards, 3 TDs) and junior **Dillon Bell** (23-for-298 yards, 4 TDs). Also, Bell has 54 yards rushing on four attempts including a 3-yarder for a score at #4 UA.

*Smith posted a career-high 134 yards on five catches in the win over MSU.

*In the thriller at #4 UA, Georgia had a pair of receivers with 100 yards for the first time since 2013 when Chris Conley and Tavarres King did it against Nebraska in the Gator Bowl. Smith had a career-high 132 yards on six catches and a score while Bell had five for 100 yards including a 67-yard TD. Bell's bomb put the Bulldogs ahead 34-33 with 2:31 left before the Tide answered. Earlier against the Crimson Tide, he had his third career rushing TD to become the first Bulldog to score rushing and receiving in the same game since 2022 (Ladd McConkey at Miss. State).

*Against Tennessee Tech, a school record 15 different Bulldogs caught a pass.

*Nine Bulldogs registered a reception in the win over #14 Clemson including a career-high five by Smith for 56 yards. Bell tallied four catches for 32 yards against the Tigers. Recently, 11 Bulldogs had a catch against MSU.

*Sophomore transfer **London Humphreys** (Vanderbilt) scored a 40-yard touchdown in his Bulldog debut against #14 Clemson in the season opener. Humphreys missed the UA game and returned against AU with two catches for 40 yards. For the year, he has six receptions for 128 yards and 1 TD.

Luckie To Have You

*Sophomore **Lawson Luckie** and junior **Oscar Delp** headline the tight ends. Georgia opened in a two tight-end set versus Auburn with Stanford graduate transfer **Ben Yurosek** making his first Bulldog start. Luckie leads the room with 144 yards receiving on 10 catches (14.4 avg.) and three TDs. Luckie is a second generation Bulldog as his father Mike (LB) was part of Bulldog triplets from 1996-98 with uncles Dustin (LB) and Miles (OL).



Are We Punting? Nope.

In the **Kirby Smart** era, the Bulldogs have a 65% success rate in 4th Down Conversions (73-for-113) with 11 TDs. This year, the Bulldogs rank third nationally in 4th Down Conversions at 91% (10-for-11).

Faced with a 30-7 halftime deficit at No. 4 Alabama, Georgia attacked every drive in the second half with a four-down mentality. After going 1-for-1 on 4th down in the first half, Georgia went 4-for-4 in the second half to finish 5-for-5, the best ever under Smart. The Bulldogs came into the game 1-for-2 on 4th Downs. Georgia was 2-for-2 on 4th Downs against AU and MSU.

Defensive Playmakers At Each Level

Georgia has had 42 players drafted over the past four seasons, including 23 on defense and eight of those defenders have gone in the first round.

- * The 2024 unit ranks T20th in Scoring Defense (17.2 ppg).
- * Did not allow a TD until the fourth game of the year.
- * The 2023 unit ranked fifth nationally in Scoring Defense (15.6 ppg).

Action Jackson Continues To Impress

With an Agribusiness degree in hand, graduate **Dan Jackson**, a native of nearby Gainesville, Ga., is enjoying his most productive year. A walk-on who redshirted in 2019, “made the bus” and started four games in 2021, is now second in tackles (31). Also, he has an interception, a fumble return and blocked a field goal this year. Jackson was the leading tackler with a career-high 10 stops plus an INT versus #4 UA.

Stark(s) Reality Of Throwing It Near #24

The defensive backfield is led by All-America safety **Malaki Starks** and **Daylen Everette**, who each started all 14 games last year. Starks’ first career interception (vs. #11 Oregon - Bo Nix in 2022) and most recent pick (vs. #14 Clemson - Cade Klubnik in 2024), both in Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta, are worth checking out. Starks leads the team with 32 stops while Everette is fourth with 22 tackles including a career-high eight tackles versus UK.

- * Starks has six career interceptions. He is on the watch list for several national awards and following the win over Clemson, he was named the Jim Thorpe Award National DB of the Week. In 2023, he was a *Bronko Nagurski Trophy* and *Jim Thorpe Award* finalist and a *Chuck Bednarik Award* semifinalist.
- * Freshmen **KJ Bolden** and **Ellis Robinson IV** are seeing more playing time of late. Bolden made four tackles in his debut versus #14 Clemson and collected his first career INT in the win over MSU.

Meet Me At The Ball

Mykel Williams, **Nazir Stackhouse**, **Warren Brinson**, **Christen Miller**, and **Tyrion Ingram-Dawkins** anchor the front while several freshmen have seen action too. Williams and Brinson missed two games due to ankle injuries and returned against #4 UA. Ingram-Dawkins made his first career start against TT and responded with a career-high four tackles including 3 TFL. Against UK, Ingram-Dawkins had three tackles, a sack and seven QB pressures to earn SEC DL of the Week. He had two sacks in the win over Auburn.

- * The veteran linebackers are **Smael Mondon Jr.**, **Jalon Walker**, **CJ Allen**, **Raylen Wilson**, **Damon Wilson II** and **Chaz Chambliss**. Raylen Wilson had a career-high five tackles, a forced fumble and sack for a loss of 28 yards that led to a change of possession and Georgia’s first score in the road win over UK. He was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week. Mondon has missed the last two games due to injury and Williams has played sparingly of late.
- * Walker, a 6-2, 245-pounder is a self-described “hybrid linebacker” for his ability to play on the edge and in the box. Walker enjoyed a solid showing in the 2024 season opener, leading the Bulldogs with six tackles and 1.5 sacks in a 34-3 win over #14 Clemson to earn Reese’s Senior Bowl Defensive Player

of the Week honors. He was credited with 10 QB pressures at UK.

- * Freshmen linebackers **Chris Cole** and **Justin Williams** plus lineman **Joseph Jonah-Ajonye** and **Xzavier McLeod** are starting to make an impact too.

G'day Mate

Junior punter **Brett Thorson** and the Bulldogs rank 8th nationally in Net Punting (43.94). Georgia is the only FBS team whose opponents have negative PR yards this season.

- * Thorson, a native of Melbourne, Australia is averaging 47.1 yards on 18 punts, placing 11 inside the 20 with seven fair catches and one return for minus 4 yards.
- * Thorson is known for his comedic slant about his lack of playing time because the Bulldogs punted a record low 32 times in 2023 after just 36 punts in 2022 (15 games), the two lowest totals dating back to at least 1948.
- * In 2024, Thorson punted four times against #14 Clemson for a 48.0 average with three placed inside the 20, two for 50+ yards and none were returned. He came up big at Kentucky with a career-high six punts for a 49.5 average.
- * Thanks in part to Thorson’s punts and the entire punt coverage team including gunners **Arian Smith**, **Dominic Lovett** and **Cole Speer**, Georgia was the only team in the FBS that did not allow a punt return in 2023, the first school to do that since 2020 when COVID limited the amount of games teams played. Georgia has not allowed a positive yard on a punt return in 25 games. The last one came in a 45-19 road win over Miss. State on Nov. 12, 2022 when Zavion Thomas took one 63 yards for a score. This season at #4 Alabama, Ryan Williams had one punt return for minus four yards.

Geaux Dawgs

Peyton Woodring, who hails from Lafayette, La., was a *Lou Groza Award* semifinalist as a freshman kicker. This year, he has a team-high 49 points and handling the kickoffs too (39 of 41 overall with 19 touchbacks and one OB).

- * Woodring made his first nine FGs this year before missing a 55-yarder vs MSU.
- * He earned 2024 SEC Special Teams Player of the Week in the opening win over #14 Clemson. He accounted for 10 points including the first six points of the season on field goals of 30 yards and a career-long 55-yarder -- the longest by a Bulldog since the 2018 Rose Bowl (Rodrigo Blankenship vs. Oklahoma).
- * In 2023, he scored a team-high 134 points, going 21-for-25 on FG and 71-for-71 on PATs. He ranked sixth nationally in Scoring and third among kickers.
- * The snapping duties are handled primarily by **Beau Gardner**, a graduate transfer from UCLA who is from San Francisco.
- * Graduate transfer **Charlie Ham**, a native of Atlanta, Ga., is back in the Peach State to provide depth. This year, he has two kickoffs with one touchback. He had a successful undergraduate career at Duke (2019-23). He appeared in 46 games, going 36-for-50 on field goals (LG-50), 91-for-93 on PATs and tallied 193 kickoffs with a 61.2 average and 98 touchbacks.

The Return Game

Sophomore WR/PR/KOR **Anthony Evans III** has 12 punt returns for 97 yards (8.1 avg.) with a career-long 46-yarder versus TTU. Against #14 Clemson, he had three returns for 23 yards. Evans has five KOR for 94 yards (18.8 avg.) with the first three coming at #4 UA. He has seven catches for 80 yards.

*Georgia saw its school and SEC record streak of 28 consecutive regular season wins in league play end this year at #4 UA. In the all-SEC 2020 schedule due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Bulldogs won their final three SEC regular season games and then went on a run that ended Sept. 28, 2024 in Tuscaloosa.

* In 2021, Georgia posted its first perfect 8-0 mark in league play in school history. (The SEC went to eight games when it split into divisions in 1992). UA upset Georgia in the SECCG and then Georgia knocked off UA for the CFP title.

* The 2022 Bulldogs followed it up with another 8-0 SEC mark, and the average margin of victory in those games was 25.5. They claimed the SEC title.

* The 2023 Bulldogs made it three straight 8-0 league seasons (the only SEC school ever to accomplish that feat). It was the 10th undefeated league season in school history. UA defeated Georgia in the SEC Championship Game.

* The 2024 Bulldogs are 3-1 in the SEC. They won their first one, edging UK in Lexington, fell at #4 UA and bounced back with home wins over AU and MSU the past two Saturdays. This year's slate also features trips to #1 Texas this Saturday and then #9 Ole Miss (Nov. 9) plus the neutral site game with Florida in Jacksonville (Nov. 2). Georgia will play host to #8 Tennessee on Nov. 16 to close out the conference slate.

A Bobo Making Calls On The Field And From The Press Box

Redshirt sophomore center **Drew Bobo** made his first career career against Auburn this season while his father, **Mike**, is in his second year back as Georgia's John & Alice Sands Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks coach. The Bulldog offensive line was down a pair of starters against Auburn and MSU with senior right guard **Tate Ratledge** and redshirt junior center **Jared Wilson** sidelined with injuries. Redshirt junior **Micah Morris** has filled in at guard the past three games for Ratledge while Bobo, a graduate of Auburn High School, has gotten the nod at center the past two contests.

Did You Know? Mike Bobo and head coach **Kirby Smart** were teammates at UGA from 1994-97. In 2006, Drew served as the ring bearer at Smart's wedding.

Season Two For Uga XI, a.k.a "Boom"

Following the retirement of Uga X, 10-month old puppy **Boom** assumed the vaunted role of Georgia's on-field mascot in 2023. Currently, Uga XI has a career record of 18-2.

*During a pregame ceremony at the annual "G Day" game, University of Georgia president Jere W. Morehead joined J. Reid Parker Director of Athletics Josh Brooks and his son, Davis, in the ceremonial collaring of Boom.

*Boom is the 11th solid white English Bulldog to serve as Georgia's mascot since the line began in 1956 courtesy of the Seiler family of Savannah. In his first season, Boom saw the Bulldogs post their third-consecutive undefeated regular season, followed by a record-breaking 63-3 victory over FSU in the Orange Bowl. In the offseason, Boom resides with his family in Savannah.

*The 2024 Bulldogs feature nine players who will get to wear the "SEC Graduate" patch on their uniform: **Carson Beck, Warren Brinson, Luke Collins, Beau Gardner** (UCLA), **Charlie Ham** (Duke, also has a master's in management studies), **Dan Jackson, Micah Morris, Xavier Truss** and **Benjamin Yurosek** (Stanford).

* In 2023, offensive lineman Chad Lindberg was named an Academic All-American.

* A total of 242 players have made the SEC Academic Honor Roll in the Kirby Smart era including a high of 43 from the 2023 team.

* Under Smart, 18 Bulldogs have been named National Football Foundation (NFF) Hampshire Society Members. The society is comprised of football players from all divisions who maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or better throughout their career, were starters or significant contributors and have completed their final year of playing eligibility. The most recent members were Chad Lindberg, Ladd McConkey, Sedrick Van Pran and Jared Zirkel.

* McConkey, a 2nd round pick of the L.A. Chargers, became the 15th Bulldog since 1966 to be named a Campbell Trophy finalist and NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award winner. He received an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship to use when he's done playing professional football. Georgia leads the SEC and is tied for sixth nationally with its 15 honorees.

* In the area of community service in 2024, **Malaki Starks** became the 24th Bulldog since 1992 to earn a spot on the AFCA Good Works Team, which honors 22 men annually. Georgia's 24 recipients leads the nation.

* Members of the 2024 squad took part in the 20th annual Bulldogs Battling Breast Cancer charity golf tournament this past summer. It has raised more than \$2 million since the event began in 2004.

*In October of 2023, the team participated in the Chick-fil-A Dawg Bowl. It was led by former Bulldog coach Mark Richt and raised more than \$750,000 for Parkinson's and Crohn's disease awareness.

* Former Bulldog defensive lineman Travon Walker, who was the No. 1 overall draft pick in 2022 (Jacksonville) donated \$44,000 to the UGA Athletic Association with the money earmarked for athletic training. It was a part of a series of donations made by his foundation.

* Former All-American and NFL linebacker Jarvis Jones, who currently serves as UGA football's Player Connection Coordinator, was one of three former Bulldog greats selected to the UGA Athletic Association's 2023 class for the Circle of Honor. It is the highest honor a Bulldog can receive.

* NFL veteran Fernando Velasco (UGA 2003-07) was named to UGA's 40 Under 40 Class of 2023. Currently, he is Director of Player Development for the Atlanta Falcons.

* In September of 2020, it was announced that Kirby and Mary Beth Smart contributed \$1 million to UGA to go towards the Athletic Association's new social justice program, scholarships for senior athletes whose seasons were affected by the pandemic and the expansion of the football program.

Development Leads Bulldogs To NFL Career

- In the Kirby Smart era, 63 Bulldogs have been selected in the NFL Draft.
- Eight Bulldogs were selected in the 2024 NFL draft including two in the first round.
- Georgia's total of 25 players selected in the 2022 & 2023 NFL Draft were the most by a single school in consecutive drafts in the modern era (since 1967).
- Georgia had a record 15 players selected in the 2022 draft including five in the first round starting with the No. 1 overall pick, Travon Walker, DL (Jacksonville).
- Ten Bulldogs were selected in the 2023 NFL draft with three in the first round.

No. 1 GEORGIA 34, No. 14 CLEMSON 3

Aug. 31, 2024 • Mercedes-Benz Stadium • Atlanta

ATLANTA, Ga. — Led by a stifling performance from its defense, the top-ranked Georgia football team opened its 2024 season Saturday with a dominant 34-3 win over No. 14 Clemson in the Aflac Kickoff Game in front of a sellout crowd of 78,827 inside Mercedes-Benz Stadium and a national audience on ABC.

The Bulldogs (1-0) were leading 20-3 in the fourth quarter when quarterback Carson Beck hit sophomore wide receiver London Humphreys for a 40-yard touchdown to lift much of the crowd of 78,827 to its feet and blow the game open with 9:57 remaining. Beck finished 23 of 33 passing for 278 yards and two touchdowns, the Georgia offense racked up 447 yards, and the Bulldog defense, which got an interception from safety Malaki Starks in the fourth quarter, held the Tigers (0-1) to just 188 yards.

The Bulldogs opened their season with a win for the 11th year in a row. In 2021, the Bulldogs pulled out a 10-3 win over the Tigers in Charlotte, N.C., to open the season. Not unlike that defense-dominated matchup, neither offense got much going early in this year's meeting, and the game was scoreless after the opening quarter. In the second, Georgia's offense continued what became a methodical, 12-play drive that ended with a 30-yard Peyton Woodring field goal and a 3-0 lead.

Later in the second, Woodring blasted a career-long 55-yard field goal to make it 6-0 Georgia with 4:16 to play in the quarter.

Georgia got the ball to start the second half and quickly went to work. Receiver Arian Smith ran the ball for seven yards on first down and then had a 32-yard reception on the next play. Wideout Dillon Bell ran for 27 yards up the left side, and soon after, Beck hit receiver Colbie Young for a seven-yard touchdown and a 13-0 lead with 12:01 to play in the third.

Clemson put together its best drive on the ensuing possession and had a first down at the Georgia 7. But the Bulldogs held the Tigers to a 26-yard Nolan Hauser field goal that cut the Georgia lead to 13-3 with 6:34 to go in the third quarter.

The Bulldogs responded with another touchdown drive. This one began with a short pass from Beck to tailback Nate Frazier that led to a 24-yard gain — and ended with a 1-yard Frazier run for the score and a 20-3 lead with 3:15 remaining in the quarter. Georgia also got a 23-yard completion from Beck to wideout London Humphrey on third-and-10 to keep the drive going.

Early in the fourth, Beck found Humphrey for the 40-yard score that made it 27-3. Later in the period, after Starks' interception, Cash Jones ran the ball in from the 15 to push the lead to 34-3. Linebacker Jalon Walker led the defense with six tackles, including 1.5 sacks.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"Anytime you play in Atlanta in this facility and it's part of a title-sponsor game where you're playing another top-15, top-20 (team), to me it feels like a playoff game. It's a great way to try to assess where you are as a team."



Freshman Nate Frazier ran for 83 yards and scored on a 1-yard run.

Worth Noting...

- With the win, Georgia has won 11 straight season-openers and 40 consecutive regular-season games, a run that began in 2020. The Bulldogs have won 47 of their last 49 games.
- Linebacker Jalon Walker's six tackles led a group of 13 Bulldogs with at least two stops. Walker also led the defense with 1.5 sacks, while linebacker Mykel Williams had a team-high 2.0 tackles for loss.
- Malaki Starks' leaping fourth-quarter interception was the sixth of his career and looked almost exactly like his interception against Oregon in the 2021 Aflac Kickoff Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.
- Arian Smith led a large group of pass-catchers with a career-high five receptions for 56 yards. Nine different Bulldogs had at least one catch and eight caught at least two.
- Running back Brandon Robinson, in his first game since the 2022 College Football Playoff National Championship Game on Jan. 9, 2023, got the start in the backfield for Georgia. Robinson suffered a season-ending ruptured patella tendon less than two weeks before the 2023 opener. In his return, Robinson had seven carries for 12 yards.
- The captains for the Clemson game were quarterback Carson Beck, offensive lineman Tate Ratledge, Starks and Williams. All four were among Georgia's conference-leading 15 preseason All-SEC selections.
- Former Georgia coach Mark Richt gave the invocation on the field prior to kickoff Saturday, while legendary kicker Kevin Butler was the Bulldogs' honorary captain.



No. 1 GEORGIA 48, TENNESSEE TECH 3

Sept. 7, 2024 • Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium • Athens

ATHENS, Ga. — Led by five touchdown passes from quarterback Carson Beck, the top-ranked Georgia football team earned its 26th consecutive win at Sanford Stadium on Saturday, routing Tennessee Tech 48-3 in the Bulldogs' home opener. The victory, in front of a crowd of 93,033 and a national audience on SEC Network+.

Beck completed his first 11 passes, for 111 yards, and threw three touchdown passes in the first half. Beck sat out much of the second half after the game was a runaway, ending up 18 of 25 passing for 242 yards and five touchdowns. Beck is the eighth Georgia passer to throw five TD passes in a game.

While the Georgia (2-0) offense piled up 498 yards, averaging 8.2 yards per play, the Bulldog defense held the Golden Eagles (0-2) to 134 yards of total offense and just 2.8 yards per play. Tech's only points came on a 32-yard field goal on the game's final play.

On Tech's first play from scrimmage, the Golden Eagles were stopped for a four-yard loss. The first time a Georgia player got his hands on the ball was when Anthony Evans III returned the Golden Eagles' first punt, going 46 yards down to the Tech 22-yard line. On the Bulldogs' first offensive play, Beck hit wide receiver Dillon Bell on the left edge of the end zone for a touchdown and a 7-0 lead less than three minutes into the game.

After the Bulldog defense forced another punt, the Georgia offense kept rolling. On third-and-11 at the UGA 41, Beck hit Oscar Delp for 13 yards. On the next play, Beck hit Dominic Lovett for 12, followed by a 14-yard completion to Arian Smith. A short pass to Brandon Robinson on the next play resulted in a 14-yard gain, and on first-and-goal at the 6, Beck connected with Colbie Young for a six-yard touchdown and a 14-0 lead.

The Bulldogs later got a 27-yard Peyton Woodring to push their lead to 17-0 with 11:45 to play in the half. And just before halftime, Georgia took a 24-0 lead after Beck hit Lovett for a 10-yard touchdown.

Georgia got the ball to open the second half, and soon another Beck pass was in the air for a touchdown. This time, on first down at the 50, Beck lofted one deep to Smith for the 50-yard score and a 31-0 lead.

Tech fumbled on its next drive, the game's first turnover, and safety Dan Jackson recovered the loose ball at the 27. Soon after, following a penalty, Beck lofted an easy pass to an open Lawson Luckie on the left side for a 37-yard touchdown and a 37-0 lead.

Gunner Stockton took over at quarterback midway through the third quarter and led the Bulldogs on another touchdown drive, with Branson Robinson scoring on a 13-yard rush. Stockton finished the game 10 of 12 passing for 90 yards. Woodring kicked a 32-yard field goal with 3:07 remaining in the game to make it 48-0 Bulldogs.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"It's awesome being home. Every time you walk into Sanford Stadium and see it packed — I give our fans credit, they were in the heat, they fought the heat and came and were loud, especially early. I think it was good entertainment; we scored on that first play on offense and got things rolling in the first half. I was proud of our fans."

Worth Noting...

- The win was Georgia's 26th in a row at Sanford Stadium and the Bulldogs' 41st straight regular-season victory — both are the most in program history and are the longest active streaks among all FBS teams. Georgia has now won 48 of its last 50 games.
- Georgia's 2024 senior class is now 44-2, including a 38-0 record in the regular season. This year's seniors are chasing the all-time mark set by the Class of 2023, which went 50-4 overall, won two national titles, an SEC crown, and went 6-0 in bowl/CFP games.
- In his first appearance as a Bulldog, running back Trevor Etienne rushed for 78 yards on five carries, including a 45-yarder, and caught two passes for 14 yards. As a group, Georgia's backs rushed for 166 yards on 24 attempts.
- This was Georgia's third win over Tennessee Tech in three meetings. The Bulldogs won 67-0 in 1943 and 38-0 in 2009.
- During a timeout in the opening quarter, longtime Georgia Director of Sports Communications Claude Felton, who retired in January after 45 years on the job, was recognized on the field. Saturday also marked the debut of the Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium Press Box, which has a floor honoring Felton and one honoring his predecessor, Dan Magill.
- The captains were offensive lineman Xavier Truss, running back Cash Jones, nose guard Nazir Stackhouse and linebacker Chaz Chambliss. The Bulldogs won the toss and elected to defer to the second half.

No. 1 GEORGIA 13, KENTUCKY 12

Sept. 14, 2024 • Kroger Field • Lexington, Ky.

LEXINGTON, Ky. — The top-ranked Georgia football team scratched and clawed its way to a 13-12 win over Kentucky in the Bulldogs' SEC opener Saturday night in front of a crowd of 61,663 at Kroger Field and a national television audience on ABC. Down 9-3 in the third quarter of a game dominated by the defenses, the Bulldogs got a 30-yard Peyton Woodring field goal and a three-yard Branson Robinson touchdown to take the lead for good.

The win is Georgia's 42nd in a row during the regular season, 28th straight in SEC regular-season games, and the program's 15th straight over Kentucky. Georgia had just 63 yards of offense in the first half before finding some rhythm and hitting some big plays in the second to finish with 262.

Georgia's defense held Kentucky to 284 yards, 3.9 yards per play, and forced a turnover that led to a Bulldog field goal. Cornerback Daylen Everette led the defense with eight tackles, including six solo. Eleven Bulldogs had at least four stops.

Kentucky took a 3-0 lead on a school-record 55-yard Alex Raynor field goal with 2:45 left in the opening quarter. The field goal marked the first first-half points that the Bulldogs had allowed this season.

In the second quarter, consecutive 15-yard penalties on Georgia's defense, plus a 15-yard Brock Vandagriff run on third-and-12, put the Wildcats in Georgia territory. A Tyron Ingram-Dawkins sack led to a six-yard loss. On the next play, Raylen Wilson sacked and stripped Vandagriff, and Damon Wilson II recovered the ball for Georgia at the Kentucky 23.

The turnover led to a 34-yard Woodring field goal, tying the game 3-3 with 3:48 to play in the half. The Wildcats answered with a drive inside the Georgia 20 and another Raynor field goal, this one a 32-yarder that put Kentucky ahead 6-3 at the half.

The Wildcats got the ball to start the second half and drove down to the Bulldog 22 before having to settle for a 40-yard Raynor field goal that pushed the Kentucky lead to 9-3.

Georgia's offense had its best drive of the game on the ensuing possession, with Beck completing a 33-yard pass to Lovett, followed soon after by a 20-yard completion to Dillon Bell. However, the Bulldogs eventually had to settle for a 30-yard Woodring field goal.

The Bulldog defense forced a three-and-out on Kentucky's next drive, and the offense took over at the Georgia 32. Trevor Etienne touched the ball on five straight plays on the drive, resulting in 49 yards, and Robinson ran the ball in from the 3 for a touchdown and the Bulldogs' first lead of the game, 13-9, with 12:20 to play.

Kentucky answered with an 11-play drive that resulted in a 51-yard Raynor field goal, cutting the Bulldog lead to 13-12 with 8:01 remaining. Neither team was able to produce any points after that.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"I don't know that we can rest and recover (next week). I mean, that's what people think bye weeks mean. We've got to find a way to improve and get better. You know, we were really beat up coming into this game, specifically at one position (defensive line), and it was a really tough week for us."

Worth Noting...

- The Bulldogs were held to three first downs and 63 total yards in the first half, their lowest yardage output in an opening half since 2009. The offense produced some big plays (and 199 yards) in the second half, including a pair of 33-yard completions to Dominic Lovett. Lovett led all receivers with six catches for 89 yards.
- Facing off against his former (and hometown) team, Kentucky quarterback Brock Vandagriff threw for 114 yards and ran for 26. Georgia sacked Vandagriff three times and forced a fumble on two of them, one of which the Bulldogs recovered and led to a field goal in the second quarter.
- Eight Bulldogs had at least five tackles, led by cornerback Daylen Everett and safety Malaki Starks with eight each. Georgia's defense has yet to allow a touchdown through three games.
- After punting a total of five times in Georgia's first two games, Brett Thorson punted six times against Kentucky. He averaged 49.5 yards per boot, with a long a 58. Seven of Thorson's 11 punts this season have been downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line.
- Not only has Georgia won 15 straight games against Kentucky, the Bulldogs have also won eight in a row in the Wildcats' stadium. Georgia is 22-4 all-time at Kroger Field.
- The captains against Kentucky were linebacker Smael Mondon Jr., safety Malaki Starks, running back Trevor Etienne and offensive lineman Tate Ratledge. Kentucky won the toss and deferred to the second half.



No. 4 ALABAMA 41, No. 2 GEORGIA 34

Sept. 28, 2024 • Bryant-Denny Stadium • Tuscaloosa, Ala.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — The No. 2-ranked Georgia football team suffered its first regular-season defeat since 2020 on Saturday night, falling 41-34 to No. 4 Alabama in a wild game in front of a crowd of 100,077 at Bryant-Denny Stadium and a national audience on ABC.

The Crimson Tide jumped out in front early with three first-quarter touchdowns, forcing the Bulldogs to play catch-up. Despite outscoring the Tide 27-11 in the second half, and briefly taking the lead late in the fourth quarter, the Bulldogs came up short in the end.

In a game with more than 1,000 yards of offense, Alabama finished with 547, while Georgia gained 519. Georgia's defense had allowed just 18 points on six field goals coming into the game, and the offense had zero turnovers through three games before committing four Saturday.

Quarterback Jalen Milroe scored on a seven-yard run for a Tide 7-0 lead with 10:11 left in the first quarter. Alabama went ahead 14-0 on a Milroe 16-yard touchdown pass to Jamarion Miller.

The Bulldogs' next drive ended when Domani Jackson intercepted a Carson Beck pass in Georgia territory and returned it to the UGA 22. Three plays later, Germie Bernard ran for a seven-yard touchdown and a 21-0 lead. Alabama scored again on its next drive when Milroe got free on fourth-and-1 and ran 36 yards for the touchdown and a 28-0 lead.

The Bulldog offense got going on its next possession, scoring on Trevor Etienne's seven-yard run to cut the lead to 28-7 with 6:43 left in the half. Alabama's final points of the half came on a safety, pushing the lead to 30-7 at halftime.

The Bulldogs cut Alabama's lead to 30-15 with 5:06 left in the third on a 12-yard touchdown catch by Arian Smith. Georgia converted two fourth-down plays on the drive and drew a penalty on Alabama on a third attempt. Beck hit Lawson Luckie in the end zone to convert the two-point attempt.

Alabama's Graham Nicholson kicked a 28-yard field goal with 1:23 to play in the third to push the Tide's lead to 33-15. Georgia cut the lead to 33-21 with 9:46 left in the game when Beck hit Luckie for an eight-yard touchdown.

Two big completions got the Bulldogs to the Tide 1 on their next drive. Beck connected with Cash Jones for a 30-yard gain, followed immediately by a 47-yard strike to Smith. Two plays later, Dillon Bell ran the ball in for a three-yard touchdown, trimming Alabama's lead to 33-27 with 5:39 to go.

Georgia's defense forced Alabama to punt on its next drive and the Bulldogs got the ball back at their 33 with a chance for the lead with 2:42 remaining. And on the first play, Beck hit Bell down the middle for a 67-yard touchdown to take a 34-33 lead with 2:31 remaining.

But the lead was short-lived. On the first play of Alabama's ensuing drive, Milroe connected with Ryan Williams for a 75-yard touchdown, and a successful two-point conversion made it 41-34 Tide with 2:18 to play.

Georgia had one last possession and drove into Alabama territory. On fourth-and-8 at the Tide 34, Beck hit Luckie for 14 yards to the 22. Beck's next pass was intercepted in the end zone with 43 seconds left.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"In the second half, we played some tighter coverage. We made some stops. We possessed the ball on offense. When you make stops, you give yourself a chance."



Dan Jackson had a career-high 10 tackles and an interception.

Worth Noting...

- The loss snapped a run of 42 consecutive regular-season wins, as well as 28 straight in SEC regular-season games, for the Bulldogs. Georgia's last regular-season loss came against Florida on Nov. 7, 2020. The game was the first regular-season loss for Georgia's 2024 senior class, which is now 45-3 overall and 39-1 in the regular season.
- After getting behind 28-0 and trailing 30-7 at halftime, the Bulldogs outscored Alabama 27-11 in the second half.

No. 5 GEORGIA 31, AUBURN 13

Oct. 5, 2024 • Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium • Athens

ATHENS, Ga. — Trevor Etienne rushed for two touchdowns, Carson Beck threw for two more, and the No. 5-ranked Georgia football team earned its eighth straight win over Auburn, 31-13, in front of a sellout, homecoming crowd of 93,033 at Sanford Stadium and a national audience on ABC.

Georgia finished with 381 yards, while the Tigers gained 337. Georgia now leads the all-time series with Auburn 65-56-8. Beck completed 23 of 29 passes for 240 yards and the two touchdowns, while Etienne did it all, rushing 16 times for 88 yards and the two TDs and catching six passes for 36. Defensive end Tyrion Ingram-Dawkins had a pair of sacks to help pace the strong showing from the defense.

The Bulldog offense got the scoring started with an 11-play, 75-yard drive that ended with an Etienne two-yard rush up the middle for a touchdown and a 7-0 lead with 6:24 remaining in the first quarter. Etienne had three rushes and two receptions on the drive, including a nine-yarder on a screen pass down to the 1-yard line.

The Tigers drove deep into Georgia territory on their next possession and had a first down at the 12. On third-and-6 at the 8, defensive end Mykel Williams tackled Thorne for a 1-yard loss. Auburn's Towns McGough kicked a 27-yard field goal to cut the Georgia lead to 7-3.

The second quarter was scoreless until the Bulldogs got the ball back with 1:02 on the clock. On first down at the Auburn 49, Beck hit Dominic Lovett for eight yards, followed by a one-yard completion to Etienne. On the next play, Etienne got loose on the right side for a 23-yard gain to the Tiger 17. Two plays later, Beck found Lovett on the left hash for an 11-yard touchdown, and a 14-3 lead.

Auburn managed to complete a couple of passes to get into field-goal range before halftime, and McGough's 54-yard attempt as time expired was blocked by safety Dan Jackson.

With 9:45 left in the third, Tigers running back Jarquez Hunter got free around the right side and went 38 yards for a touchdown, cutting the UGA lead to 14-10. But the game got no closer.

Georgia ran the ball on nine of 12 plays on the ensuing drive and scored a touchdown on Etienne's one-yard plunge. The back's second TD of the game pushed the Bulldogs' lead to 21-10 with 3:50 to play in the third.

Auburn got aggressive on its next possession and went for it on fourth and-1 at its 44-yard line. A Thorne run play was blown up from the start and linebacker Raylen Wilson got the tackle for a loss of four at the 40. Georgia took advantage of the great field position and later scored on a three-yard pass from Beck to Bell, making it a 28-10 game with 12:34 remaining.

The Tigers cut the lead to 28-13 with 7:38 left on McGough's 26-yard field goal. Auburn had a first-and-goal at the 10 but the Bulldog defense kept them out of the end zone. Kicker Peyton Woodring added a bit of insurance with a 47-yard field goal with 1:50 to make it 31-13.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"I thought the run game was good for us. I thought we were really close to hitting those explosives, and I feel like we left more out there. We have good backs. ... A couple of those times I thought we could cash them in, but we did make a lot of plays in the run game."

No. 5 GEORGIA 41, MISS STATE 31

Oct. 12, 2024 • Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium • Athens

ATHENS, Ga. — Fifth-ranked Georgia amassed 605 yards of offense in a 41-31 win over Mississippi State in front of a sellout crowd of 93,033 at Sanford Stadium and a national audience on SEC Network.

Quarterback Carson Beck threw for a career-high 459 yards and three touchdowns, completing passes to 11 different receivers. Five different Bulldogs caught four or more passes; wideout Arian Smith had five for a career-high 134 yards and a touchdown.

On Georgia's second offensive play, a Beck pass was tipped and intercepted by cornerback Brice Pollock at the UGA 26-yard line. State's Kyle Ferrie later kicked a 47-yard field goal to put MSU ahead 3-0.

Georgia answered with a 10-play drive that ended with a 45-yard Peyton Woodring field goal to tie the game. Woodring later added a 32-yarder in the second quarter.

After the defense got another quick stop — State had a total of seven yards after three possessions — Georgia's offense drove 81 yards for the game's first touchdown. Branson Robinson put Georgia up 10-3 with a 5-yard run with 2:13 left in the quarter.

State cut the lead to 13-10 on a 24-yard touchdown pass from Michael Van Buren Jr. to Kelly Akharaiyi. Georgia produced some big plays of its own on the ensuing possession, and Beck hit Dillon Bell in the back of the end zone for a 31-yard score and a 20-10 lead.

Later in the second, Beck found Smith down the left hash for a 55-yard gain to the MSU 25. A few plays later, running back Cash Jones caught a direct snap in the backfield, handed the ball off to Beck, and the quarterback then lofted a pass to tight end Oscar Delp for a 17-yard gain to the 1. Tight end Lawson Luckie caught a 1-yard TD pass for a 27-10 lead.

Safety KJ Bolden picked off the first pass of his career on State's final drive of the half, giving UGA the ball at its 19 with 27 seconds left. Woodring attempted a 55-yard field goal as time expired but was wide left.

During the Bulldogs' first drive of the third, Beck hit tight end Ben Yurosek up the left side for a 29-yard gain, and on the next play, Beck found Smith for a 42-yard touchdown and a 34-10 lead.

State answered with a 19-yard rushing touchdown by Johnnie Daniels, cutting Georgia's lead to 34-17 with 8:27 left in the third. After another Beck interception, Van Buren hit running back Davon Booth for a touchdown on fourth-and-goal from the 2.

At the end of the 16-play, 81-yard drive that took 7:26 off the clock, running back Trevor Etienne plowed into the end zone from the 1 to give Georgia a 41-24 lead with 3:33 to play. Beck's 36th completion of the game, a 21-yarder to Bell on the left side to the MSU 4, gave the quarterback a new career-high in passing yardage and tied the school single-game record for completions.

State's final touchdown was a 35-yard completion to Akharaiyi with 1:47 remaining that made it a 41-31 game.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"We started fast and did some good things. ... I thought we gave them 14 points on defense, and if you take those 14 points away, I feel pretty good about the game. But we absolutely just handed them 14."



Branson Robinson scored on a 5-yard run in the second quarter.

Worth Noting...

- With the win, Georgia extended its school-record win streak on Dooley Field to 28 games. The Bulldogs haven't lost between the hedges since 2019.
- Not only did Carson Beck throw for a career-high 459 yards, topping the 439 he threw for at Alabama this season, he also tied the Georgia single-game record for completions with 36.
- Kicker Peyton Woodring connected on attempts of 45 and 32 yards, making him 9-for-9 this season, before missing wide left on a 55-yard attempt at the end of the first half.
- This was the 27th meeting between Georgia and Mississippi State, and Georgia's 21st win. Georgia is now 13-2 in the battle of the Bulldogs in Athens, and has won five straight overall in the series.
- The Bulldogs wore green ribbon decals on their helmets to raise awareness that Mental Health Matters in conjunction with Hilinski's Hope, a national organization whose mission is to promote mental health support and suicide prevention for student-athletes.
- Georgia's captains were defensive lineman Nazir Stackhouse, linebacker Chaz Chambliss, running back Cash Jones and wide receiver Arian Smith. Georgia won the toss and deferred to the second half.
