### The Georgia-UT Series

Georgia owns 28-23-2 edge in the series history with the Volunteers. Lately, it's the Bulldogs with the upperhand as they are 7-1 against UT under **Kirby Smart** including winning the past seven meetings. The seven-game winning streak is the longest streak for the Bulldogs in the series which dates to 1899.

### 2023 Georgia-Tennessee Flashback

**Carson Beck** threw three touchdown passes, wideout **Dillon Bell** caught one TD pass and threw for another as top-ranked Georgia dispatched the Vols 38-10 in Knoxville in front of a crowd of 101,915. The Bulldogs fell behind 7-0 after the first play from scrimmage when Jaylen Wright raced 75 yards for a score. However, Georgia responded with 24 unanswered points to take command. The Bulldogs blanked the Vols in the second half and added two more scores for the final.

With the victory, Georgia completed a third straight undefeated run through the SEC, marking the first time a team had accomplished that since the Bulldogs did it from 1980-82. Also, it was an SEC and school record 28th consecutive league win.

### We're Back Finally Between The Hedges

Georgia (7-2, 5-2 SEC) returns to Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium Saturday for the first time since Oct. 12. The Bulldogs have played an SEC-low three home games where they are 3-0. Georgia went 2-2 on the road and 2-0 at neutral sites (Atlanta & Jacksonville). The Bulldogs now finish the regular season with three home games against Tennessee, UMass and Georgia Tech.

Last Saturday, Georgia played its final road game of the regular season, capping a stretch that saw it play at Kentucky, #4 Alabama, #1 Texas, Florida in Jacksonville and No. 16 Ole Miss.

Both ESPN College Game Day and the traveling SEC road show "SEC Nation" will be in Athens this week for the matchup. On Oct. 19, the GameDay gang was in Austin for Georgia's big win over then top-ranked Texas as well as the Alabama game in Tuscaloosa in September. SEC Nation was in Oxford last Saturday for the Georgia-Ole Miss game and in Jacksonville for the Florida contest.

This marks only the seventh time in the regular season that GameDay and SEC Nation will visit the same game site and first time in 2024 Both crews were in Jacksonville in 2018 and in Athens for the UK game in 2021 and UT game in 2022. Last year, GameDay was in Athens for Georgia's win over the Rebels.

Georgia is 18-18 when GameDay is on site for a Georgia game including 7-2 in Athens. Georgia's first appearance with the show came on Sept. 9, 1995 in Knoxville when unranked Georgia nearly pulled off the upset that day as No. 8 UT hung for a 30-27 win. The Bulldogs are 27-12 when SEC Nation is present including 8-3 in Athens. This crew last visited Athens for the 2023 Kentucky game as the Bulldogs posted a 51-13 victory.

### Time To Bounce Back Again

In the **Kirby Smart** era, the Bulldogs are 14-3 after a loss and haven't lost back-to-back games in the regular season since 2016, his first year at the helm. The last eight times Georgia has lost a game, it has won its next contest. Back in 2016, Georgia fell to Vanderbilt in Athens on Oct. 15 and then to Florida in Jacksonville on Oct. 29. Georgia dropped its final two games of the 2018 postseason, falling to No. 1 Alabama in the SEC Championship Game and then were upset by No. 15 Texas in the Sugar Bowl. This season, Georgia lost at No. 4 Alabama and the next week beat Auburn in Athens. The Bulldogs will aim to bounce back from their road loss at No. 16 Ole Miss when it plays host to Tennessee.

The Volunteers (8-1, 5-1 SEC) capped a 4-0 homestand with a 33-14 win over Mississippi State last Saturday. Quarterback Nico Iamaleava and the SEC's leading rusher Dylan Sampson headline an offense that averages 37.6 ppg while the defense allows just 12.6 ppg. Sampson has rushed for 1,129 yards and 20 TDs. Edge rusher James Pearce Jr., anchors the defense with 7.5 TFL, 5.5 sacks and 27 stops while linebacker Arion Carter leads the team with 50 tackles.

### SMART Football

\*Georgia is riding a school record 28-game home winning streak dating to 2019, which leads in FBS.

\*Georgia's 2024 Senior Class is an FBS-leading 49-4 (43-2 in the regular season) since 2021. The next best in this span belongs to Michigan (45-8) and Alabama (43-8). Georgia's 2023 Senior Class set the school record at 50-4 with two national titles, an SEC crown plus went 6-0 in bowl/CFP games.

\*Georgia owns the nation's longest active bowl streak at 27 seasons and has won its last seven matchups

\*With a 7-2 mark at this point, the Bulldogs have guaranteed that postseason streak will be extended.

\*The Bulldogs are aiming to reach the College Football Playoff (CFP) for the fourth time under Smart. The Bulldogs made the four-team field in his second season coming in 2017 and advanced to the National Championship Game after a thrilling overtime win over Oklahoma in a CFP semifinal at the Rose Bowl. Then, Georgia became the first team in the CFP era to win back-to-back national championships in 2021-22, beating Michigan and Alabama in 2021 and Ohio State and TCU in 2022.

Fifth-year senior **Carson Beck**, a 6-4, 220-pound native of Jacksonville, Fla., owns a 20-3 record as a starter. Led Georgia to 13-1 mark in '23.

- \* 7-3 versus top-20 opponents with a 67.3 Completion Percentage (218-324) for 2,771 yards, 18 TDs, 9 INTs in those contests.

## Etienne Leads Backfield

Georgia's running backs to see the most action are **Trevor Etienne**, **Nate Frazier** and **Cash Jones**. Etienne has a team-high 477 yards (5.0 avg.) and 7 TDs. The longest Bulldog rush belongs to wideout **Anthony Evans III** (52 vs. MSU). **Branson Robinson** has missed the past three games with an injury and **Roderick Robinson II** has yet to play this year due to injury.

\* At #1 Texas, Etienne had a team-best 87 yards and 3 TDs including one on 4th-and-goal from the 1. He tallied 55 rushing yards and one TD on 12 carries plus two catches for 11 yards at #4 UA. He had 124 all-purpose yards in the win over AU (88-rushing and 2 TDs, 36-rec. on six catches).

\* Frazier had a career-high 19 carries for 82 yards and a TD in the win over UF and then had 12 carries for 47 yards at #16 Ole Miss. In the season-opening win over #14 CU, Frazier registered 83 yards on 11 carries including a 40-yard scamper and his first TD. For the year, he has 286 yards on 60 carries (4.8 avg.) with a pair of TDs.

\* Then there's freshman **Dwight Phillips Jr.**, who had a memorable first carry. It resulted in a four-yard TD versus UF to make it 34-20.

## Cash Is King

Redshirt junior running back **Cash Jones** has served as a game captain twice this year and his contributions have been aplenty. He is a key member on special teams. Also, Jones has 13 catches for 154 yards including a 22-yard TD against UF. He had a career-high three catches for 37 yards in the win over the Gators. With sophomore WR/KOR **Anthony Evans** out against UF and Ole Miss, he served as the KOR with one return for 5 yards. His lone carry against #14 Clemson was a 15-yard TD that featured an impressive stiff arm.

## O-Line Faces Another Big Test

Georgia is starting to return to full strength on the offensive line. Against UF, senior guard **Tate Ratledge** saw his first action after missing four games due to ankle/knee injuries and then returned to his starting role at #16 Ole Miss. Earlier this year, the line was down two starters when Ratledge and junior center **Jared Wilson** were out. RS-junior **Micah Morris** filled in for Ratledge during that time and then he missed the Ole Miss game. At #1 Texas, Wilson returned and the line surrendered just one sack.

After allowing just 10 sacks through eight games, Georgia faced the Rebel front that came in leading the FBS with 41 sacks. They added five to that total against the Bulldogs. Along with Ratledge, the rest of the starters up front features RS-sophomore **Earnest Greene III** (LT), RS-junior **Dylan Fairchild** (LG) and RS-senior **Xavier Truss** (RT). RS-sophomore **Drew Bobo** (C) and sophomore **Monroe Freeling** (T/G) are in the rotation.

## Top Targets

Senior QB **Carson Beck's** top targets have been senior **Dominic Lovett** (42-for-430 yards, 3 TDs), senior **Arian Smith** (34-for-535 yards, 3 TDs) and junior **Dillon Bell** (33-for-393 yards, 4 TDs). Also, Bell has 104 yards rushing on seven attempts including a 3-yarder for a score at #4 UA.

\* Lovett snagged a 10-yard TD for the go-ahead score in the win over UF.

\* Smith came through with a 21-yard catch on 3rd-and-10 from the UGA 11 early in the 4th quarter at #1 Texas. It was part of an 11 play, 89-yard TD drive to make it 30-15. He had a career-high 134 yards on five catches versus MSU.

\* In the thriller at #4 UA, Georgia had a pair of receivers with 100 yards for the first time since 2013 when Chris Conley and Tavarres King did it against





Nebraska in the Gator Bowl. Smith had a career-high 132 yards on six catches and a score while Bell had five for 100 yards including a 67-yard TD. Bell's bomb put the Bulldogs ahead 34-33 with 2:31 left before the Tide answered. Earlier against the Crimson Tide, he had his third career rushing TD to become the first Bulldog to score rushing and receiving in the same game since 2022 (Ladd McConkey at Miss. State).

## Luckie To Have You

\*Sophomore **Lawson Luckie** and junior **Oscar Delp** headline the tight ends. Luckie leads the room with 213 yards receiving on 15 catches and three TDs. After #1 Texas had trimmed Georgia's lead to 23-15 in the 4th quarter, Delp hauled in a 43-yard reception as part of a TD-answering drive that covered 89 yards on 11 plays in 5:03 to make it 30-15. Luckie is a second generation Bulldog as his father Mike (LB) was part of Bulldog triplets from 1996-98 with uncles Dustin (LB) and Miles (OL).

## 32-2 In Last 34 SEC Regular Season Games

\*Georgia saw its school and SEC record streak of 28 consecutive regular season wins in league play end this year at #4 UA. In the all-SEC 2020 schedule due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Bulldogs won their final three SEC regular season games and then went on a run that ended Sept. 28, 2024 in Tuscaloosa.

\* In 2021, Georgia posted its first perfect 8-0 mark in league play in school history. (The SEC went to eight games when it split into divisions in 1992). UA upset Georgia in the SECCG and then Georgia knocked off UA for the CFP title.

\* The 2022 Bulldogs followed it up with another 8-0 SEC mark, and the average margin of victory in those games was 25.5. They claimed the SEC title.

\* The 2023 Bulldogs made it three straight 8-0 league seasons (the only SEC school ever to accomplish that feat). It was the 10th undefeated league season in school history. UA defeated Georgia in the SEC Championship Game.

\* The 2024 Bulldogs are 5-2 in the SEC. They won their first league game by edging UK in Lexington, fell at #4 UA, bounced back with home wins over AU and MSU, then beat #1 Texas 30-15 in Austin in front of the largest crowd ever at DKR-Memorial Stadium (105, 215). Recently, Georgia outlasted Florida in Jacksonville and lost 28-10 at #16 Ole Miss. Up next, Georgia closes out conference play with Tennessee Saturday in Athens.

## Are We Punting? Nope.

In the **Kirby Smart** era, the Bulldogs have a 64% success rate on 4th Down (75-for-118) with 13 TDs. This year, the Bulldogs rank 7th nationally in 4th Down Conversions with an SEC best 75% (12-for-16 with 3 TDs). This Saturday's foe, Tennessee, is next in the SEC at 69% (9-for-13).

\*Faced with a 30-7 halftime deficit at No. 4 Alabama, Georgia attacked every drive in the second half with a four-down mentality. After going 1-for-1 on 4th down in the first half, Georgia went 4-for-4 in the second half to finish 5-for-5, the best ever under Smart. The Bulldogs came into the game 1-for-2.

\*Georgia was 2-for-2 on 4th Downs against AU and MSU.

\*Georgia was 1-2 with a TD at #1 Texas, and the score by **Trevor Etienne** capped an 11 play, 89-yard drive in the 4th quarter to make it 30-15.

\*The Bulldogs were 1-for-3 with a TD at #16 Ole Miss.

## Defensive Playmakers At Each Level

Georgia has had 42 players drafted over the past four seasons, including 23 on defense and eight of those defenders have gone in the first round.

\* The 2024 unit ranks 16th nationally in Scoring Defense (18.4 ppg).

\* Did not allow a TD until the fourth game of the year.

\* Posted first half shutouts versus #14 Clemson, TTU and at #1 Texas

\* Held #16 OM to 28 points including 5 field goals as they averaged 42.1 ppg

## Jackson Up For Burlsworth Trophy

With an Agribusiness degree in hand, graduate **Dan Jackson**, a native of nearby Gainesville, Ga., is enjoying his most productive year. A walk-on, he redshirted in 2019, "made the bus" and was on the scout team in 2020, started four games in 2021, and this year ranks third in tackles (43) and has 2 INTs.

\*A Burlsworth Trophy nominee, which goes to the most outstanding football player who began his career as a walk-on, Jackson's highlights this year:

\*Snagged an INT at #4 UA and tallied a career-high 10 stops

\*Blocked a field goal against Auburn; Had a fumble return versus Tenn. Tech

\*Logged six solo stops in road win over #1 Texas

\*13-yard INT return plus four tackles at #16 Ole Miss

## Stark(s) Industries

The defensive backfield is led by All-America safety **Malaki Starks** and the emergence of junior **Daylen Everette**.

\*Starks, a semifinalist for the 2024 Jim Thorpe Award, is a co-leader with 49 stops while Everette has 35 tackles including a career-high eight versus UK.

\*Starks served as the punt returner versus UF (3-for-21 yds.) and #16 OM.

\*Everette posted an impressive performance in the road win over #1 Texas, tallying a team-best seven stops, an interception and sack/strip fumble with a fumble recovery. His two turnovers led to 14 points in the 30-15 victory.

\* Freshmen **KJ Bolden** and **Ellis Robinson IV** are seeing more playing time of late. Bolden is a semifinalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club. Bolden made four tackles in his debut versus #14 Clemson and collected his first career INT in the win over MSU. Bolden and junior **JaCorey Thomas** started against UF with senior DB **Dan Jackson** and sophomore **Joel Aguero** sidelined for the first half due to targeting penalties called on them at #1 Texas.

\*Bolden and Thomas have played in all nine games with Thomas starting in the season-opening win over #14 Clemson. In his starting debut versus UF, Bolden matched his career high with five tackles and had five at #16 OM too.

## Meet Me At The Ball

Due to injuries, Georgia has yet to have a full complement of defensive linemen for a game this season. The group flashed its potential in the road win over #1 Texas as junior **Mykel Williams**, recently named a semifinalist for the Lombardi Award, made his presence known with his most action since the season opener when he went down with an ankle injury. Against Texas, Williams had three tackles, two sacks and a forced fumble. For the year, Williams is tied for second on the team in TFL with 5.5.

\*Senior **Nazir Stackhouse** has been the ironman with a starting streak of 36 games going back to 2022 that ended versus UF this year. The rest of the crew includes **Warren Brinson**, **Christen Miller**, and **Tyrion Ingram-Dawkins**. **Jordan Hall** made his 2024 debut at #16 OM after battling leg injuries. Williams and Brinson missed two games due to ankle injuries and returned against #4 UA. Stackhouse did see action versus UF with three tackles.

\*Ingram-Dawkins made his first career start against TTU and responded with a career-high four tackles including 3 TFL. Against UK, he had three tackles, a sack and seven QB pressures to earn SEC DL of the Week. He had two sacks in the win over Auburn.

## Who Is #11 On Defense? That's Jalon Walker

If you follow college football and didn't know #11 **Jalon Walker**, just about everybody does now as a Butkus Award semifinalist. The junior from Salisbury, N.C., became the first player in the last 20 years with three sacks and seven tackles against the No. 1 ranked AP team (*according to ESPN Stats and Info.*), and that was just in the first half in the 30-15 road win over Texas!

\*For the year, Walker has 40 tackles, a team-leading 4.5 sacks and 6.5 TFL. The three sacks in a game were the most by a Bulldog since Channing Tindall in 2021 against Tennessee. Walker swept defensive player of the week honors from the SEC to the Bednarik Award.

\* A self-described "hybrid linebacker" for his ability to play on the edge and in the box, Walker led the Bulldogs with six tackles and 1.5 sacks in a 34-3 win over #14 Clemson to earn Reese's Senior Bowl Defensive Player of the Week honors. He was credited with 10 QB pressures at UK. Additionally, he is among the semifinalists for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award.

## CJ Makes Tackles Along With His Fellow 'Backers

When All-America LB Jamon Dumas-Johnson got hurt last year, it provided more playing time for then freshmen **CJ Allen** and **Raylen Wilson**. This year with the Bulldogs missing senior **Smael Mondon Jr.**, for four games due to injury, the beneficiary is freshman **Chris Cole**.

\*Allen is the co-leader in tackles with 49 including eight at #16 OM. He had a team-high eight stops and his first career interception against UF. He made six stops in the road win over #1 Texas. Wilson posted a career-high seven tackles against the Gators. Wilson had five tackles, a forced fumble and sack for a loss of 28 yards that led to a change of possession and Georgia's first score in the road win over UK. He was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week.

\* Cole and **Justin Williams** are starting to make an impact. Smart has praised both as high character individuals with toughness and intangibles. Cole has elite speed and flexibility to help him cover along with great length.

### G'day Mate

With elite distance, hang time, placement and a strong coverage unit, junior punter **Brett Thorson** and the Bulldogs rank 7th nationally in Net Punting (44.29). Georgia is the only FBS team whose opponents have negative PR yards this season at minus eight on five returns.

\* Thorson, a native of Melbourne, Australia is averaging 46.6 yards on 31 punts, placing 17 inside the 20 with 11 fair catches and five returns for minus 8 yards. *His 46.6 average would rank 5th nationally, but the NCAA's minimum for stat leaders is 3.6 punts a game (Min. 32 punts in 9 games). Thorson has 31.*

\*Thorson's career average of 45.1 is third best in school history, trailing Butler and Jake Camarda's record mark of 45.8 set from 2018-21.

\*Could challenge the Bulldog record for Highest Punting Avg. in a Season (Drew Butler, the 2009 Ray Guy Award winner, at 48.1)

\* Thorson is known for his comedic slant about his lack of playing time because the Bulldogs punted a record low 32 times in 2023 after just 36 punts in 2022 (15 games), the two lowest totals dating back to at least 1948.

\* In 2024, Thorson punted four times against #14 Clemson for a 48.0 average with three placed inside the 20, two for 50+ yards and none were returned. He came up big at Kentucky with a career-high six punts for a 49.5 average.

\* Thanks in part to Thorson's punts and the entire punt coverage team including gunners **Arian Smith**, **Dominic Lovett** and **Cole Speer**, Georgia was the only team in the FBS that did not allow a punt return in 2023, the first school to do that since 2020 when COVID limited the amount of games teams played.

\*Georgia had its streak of not allowing a positive yard on a punt return end at at #16 OM, a span of 28 games. Prior to a two-yard return by Rebel Micah Davis, the last one came in a 45-19 road win over Miss. State on Nov. 12, 2022 when Zavion Thomas took one 63 yards for a score. This season at #4 Alabama, Ryan Williams had one punt return for -4 yards while at #1 UT, Silas Bolden had two for -5. UF's Chimere Dike had one for -1. Davis had just the one for 2 yards.

### Geaux Dawgs

**Peyton Woodring**, who hails from Lafayette, La., was a *Lou Groza Award* semifinalist as a freshman kicker. This year, he has a team-high 75 points, going 15/16 on FGs, 30/30 on PATs and handling kickoffs too (53 of 56 overall).

\*Tallied 10 points in 34-20 win over Florida in Jacksonville, hit a pair of field goals for team's only points in the first half including a 53-yarder.

\*Named one of the Groza "Stars of the Week" after 12 points in 30-15 road win over #1 Texas, hitting field goals of 33, 44 and 48 yards plus three PATs.

\*Woodring made his first nine FGs this year before missing a 55-yarder vs MSU.

\*Earned SEC Special Teams Player of the Week in the win over #14 Clemson with 10 points including the first six points of the season on field goals of 30 yards and a career-long 55-yarder -- the longest by a Bulldog since the 2018 Rose Bowl (Rodrigo Blankenship vs. Oklahoma).

\* The snapping duties are handled primarily by **Beau Gardner**, a graduate transfer from UCLA who is from San Francisco.

\* Graduate transfer **Charlie Ham**, a native of Atlanta, Ga., is back in the Peach State to provide depth. This year, he has three kickoffs with one touchback for a 61.3 average. He had a successful undergraduate career at Duke (2019-23).

### Evans Keys Return Game, Starks Makes Debut

Sophomore **Anthony Evans III** has 14 punt returns for 118 yards (8.4 avg.) with a career-long 46-yarder versus TTU. Evans has six KOR for 105 yards (17.5 avg.) with a long of 28 against #4 UA. He has nine catches for 88 yards and a 52-yard rush versus MSU.

\*Prior to the UF game, Evans was the lone Bulldog to have any PR or KOR. However, he missed that game and the OM contest due to injury. Junior **Malaki Starks** made his debut as a PR with three for 21 yards versus UF. Senior **Chaz Chambliss** fielded a short kickoff and made a four-yard return versus UF.

### Block That Punt...Block That Kick

Currently, four Bulldogs have blocked a kick or punt in their career.

\* **DB Joenel Agüero** blocked a Florida punt in 2023 that resulted in a safety. In 2022, DL **Nazir Stackhouse** blocked a field goal that was returned 96 yards for a touchdown by teammate Chris Smith in the opening quarter of the SEC Championship Game versus No. 14 LSU. OLB **Jalon Walker** blocked a punt that resulted in a safety versus Kent State in 2022. S **Dan Jackson** blocked a punt against No. 8 Arkansas in 2021 and a field goal versus Auburn in 2024.

### A Bobo Making Calls On The Field And From The Press Box

Redshirt sophomore center **Drew Bobo** made his first career start against Auburn this season while his father, **Mike**, is in his second year back as Georgia's John & Alice Sands Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks coach. The Bulldog offensive line was down a pair of starters against AU and MSU with senior right guard **Tate Ratledge** and redshirt junior center **Jared Wilson** sidelined with injuries. Redshirt junior **Micah Morris** filled in at guard for five games for Ratledge while Bobo, a graduate of Auburn High School, got the nod at center versus AU and MSU. Wilson returned to start at #1 Texas while Ratledge saw action against UF and then started at #16 OM.

*Did You Know?* Mike Bobo and head coach **Kirby Smart** were teammates at UGA from 1994-97. In 2006, Drew served as the ring bearer at Smart's wedding.

### Smart Among Fastest To Reach 100 Wins

With the road win over No. 1 Texas, **Kirby Smart** joined a select group of head coaches who were the fastest to reach the century mark in their career. Smart is the fastest SEC coach to do it. Currently, he is 101-18 in nine seasons.

ABC reported the UGA-Texas game delivered 13.2 million viewers (peak of 14.4m) making it the most-watched regular season primetime game on any network since 2014. Georgia's 30-15 win over top-ranked Texas in Austin this season came in front of the largest crowd ever at DKR-Memorial Stadium at 105,215. That ranks seventh in Bulldog history. Georgia has faced Tennessee in Knoxville multiple times in front of larger crowds with the biggest ever in 2005 when 108,470 watched No. 5 Georgia beat No. 7 Tennessee 27-14.

\***Terrence Edwards** (UGA 1999-2002) led Georgia in receiving for four consecutive seasons from 1999-2002, starting with an All-SEC Freshman campaign that ranked third in school history with 53 catches. He remains the only Bulldog to have a 1,000-yard season after catching passes for 1,004 with 11 TDs in 2002 to earn All-SEC First Team honors as a senior.

\*Edwards finished his career with school records in career receptions (204, No. 10 in SEC history), career receiving yards (3,093, No. 4 in SEC history after initially being a conference record that stood for 11 years) and career receiving touchdowns (30, No. 4 in SEC history).

\*After going undrafted in the 2003 NFL Draft, he signed with the Atlanta Falcons. He spent 11 years in the NFL and CFL. He played for the CFL's Winnipeg Blue Bombers and Montreal Alouettes, and he was a five-time CFL All-Star and inducted into the Blue Bombers Hall of Fame in 2017.

\*Edwards graduated with a degree from the University of Georgia in Housing in 2012 and was inducted into the Georgia/Florida Hall of Fame. He is the younger brother of Robert Edwards, a former first round pick of the New England Patriots and also a CFL veteran with Toronto and Montreal.

## Season Two For Uga XI, a.k.a "Boom"

Following the retirement of Uga X, 10-month old puppy **Boom** assumed the vaunted role of Georgia's on-field mascot in 2023. Currently, Uga XI has a career record of 20-3.

\*During a pregame ceremony at the annual "G Day" game, University of Georgia president Jere W. Morehead joined J. Reid Parker Director of Athletics Josh Brooks and his son, Davis, in the ceremonial collaring of Boom.

\*Boom is the 11th solid white English Bulldog to serve as Georgia's mascot since the line began in 1956 courtesy of the Seiler family of Savannah. In his first season, Boom saw the Bulldogs post their third-consecutive undefeated regular season, followed by a record-breaking 63-3 victory over FSU in the Orange Bowl. In the offseason, Boom resides with his family in Savannah.

## Coaching Staff Moves

The Bulldogs welcome back **James Coley** (wide receivers), who is in his second stint at UGA (first was 2016-19) during the **Kirby Smart** era. Also, **Josh Crawford** (run game coordinator/running backs), **Travaris Johnson** (co-defensive coordinator, safeties) and **Donte Williams** (defensive backs) are fresh additions. Also, **Kirk Benedict** has been promoted from special teams quality control to special teams coordinator. Meanwhile, former co-defensive coordinator **Will Muschamp** has transitioned into an off-field analyst to spend more time with family. Muschamp's youngest son, Whit, is a freshman quarterback at Vanderbilt while his oldest son, Jackson, was a quarterback at Georgia, finishing in 2023.

## Academic & Community Service In The Smart Era

\* The University of Georgia ranked No. 20 in *U.S. News & World Report's* 2024 ranking of the best public universities in the nation, marking the eighth consecutive year that UGA has placed in the top 20.

\*The 2024 Bulldogs feature nine players who will get to wear the "SEC Graduate" patch on their uniform: **Carson Beck, Warren Brinson, Luke Collins, Beau Gardner (UCLA), Charlie Ham** (Duke, also has a master's in management studies), **Dan Jackson, Micah Morris, Xavier Truss** and **Benjamin Yurosek** (Stanford).

\* In 2023, offensive lineman Chad Lindberg was named an Academic All-American.

\* A total of 242 players have made the SEC Academic Honor Roll including a high of 43 from the 2023 team.

\* Under Smart, 18 Bulldogs have been named National Football Foundation (NFF) Hampshire Society Members. The society is comprised of football players from all divisions who maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or better in their career, were starters or significant contributors and have completed their final year of eligibility. The most recent members were Chad Lindberg, Ladd McConkey, Sedrick Van Pran and Jared Zirkel.

\* McConkey, a 2nd round pick of the L.A. Chargers, became the 15th Bulldog since 1966 to be named a Campbell Trophy finalist and NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award winner. He received an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship to use when he's done playing professional football. Georgia leads the SEC and is tied for sixth nationally with its 15 honorees.

\* In the area of community service in 2024, **Malaki Starks** became the 24th Bulldog since 1992 to earn a spot on the AFCA Good Works Team, which honors 22 men annually. Georgia's 24 recipients leads the nation.

\* Members of the 2024 squad took part in the 20th annual Bulldogs Batting Breast Cancer charity golf tournament this past summer. It has raised more than \$2 million since the event began in 2004.

\*In October of 2023 and 2024, the team participated in the Chick-fil-A Dawg Bowl. It was led by former Bulldog coach Mark Richt and raised more than \$750,000 each year for Parkinson's and Crohn's disease.

\* Former Bulldog defensive lineman Travon Walker, who was the No. 1 overall draft pick in 2022 (Jacksonville) donated \$44,000 to the UGA Athletic Association with the money earmarked for athletic training.

\* Former All-American and NFL linebacker Jarvis Jones, who currently serves as UGA football's Player Connection Coordinator, was one of three former Bulldog greats selected to the UGA Athletic Association's 2023 class for the Circle of Honor. It is the highest honor a Bulldog can receive.

\* NFL veteran Fernando Velasco (UGA 2003-07) was named to UGA's 40 Under 40 Class of 2023. Currently, he is Director of Player Development for the Atlanta Falcons.

\* In September of 2020, it was announced that Kirby and Mary Beth Smart contributed \$1 million to UGA and the Athletic Association's new social justice program, scholarships for senior athletes whose seasons were affected by the pandemic and the expansion of the football program.

## Development Leads Bulldogs To NFL Career

- A total of 63 Bulldogs have been selected in the NFL Draft under Smart.
- Eight Bulldogs were selected in the 2024 NFL draft including two in the first round.
- Georgia's total of 25 players selected in the 2022 & 2023 NFL Draft were the most by a single school in consecutive drafts in the modern era (since 1967).

## No. 1 GEORGIA 34, No. 14 CLEMSON 3

Aug. 31, 2024 • Mercedes-Benz Stadium • Atlanta

ATLANTA, Ga. — Led by a stifling performance from its defense, the top-ranked Georgia football team opened its 2024 season Saturday with a dominant 34-3 win over No. 14 Clemson in the Aflac Kickoff Game in front of a sellout crowd of 78,827 inside Mercedes-Benz Stadium and a national audience on ABC.

The Bulldogs (1-0) were leading 20-3 in the fourth quarter when quarterback Carson Beck hit sophomore wide receiver London Humphreys for a 40-yard touchdown to lift much of the crowd of 78,827 to its feet and blow the game open with 9:57 remaining. Beck finished 23 of 33 passing for 278 yards and two touchdowns, the Georgia offense racked up 447 yards, and the Bulldog defense, which got an interception from safety Malaki Starks in the fourth quarter, held the Tigers (0-1) to just 188 yards.

The Bulldogs opened their season with a win for the 11th year in a row. In 2021, the Bulldogs pulled out a 10-3 win over the Tigers in Charlotte, N.C., to open the season. Not unlike that defense-dominated matchup, neither offense got much going early in this year's meeting, and the game was scoreless after the opening quarter. In the second, Georgia's offense continued what became a methodical, 12-play drive that ended with a 30-yard Peyton Woodring field goal and a 3-0 lead.

Later in the second, Woodring blasted a career-long 55-yard field goal to make it 6-0 Georgia with 4:16 to play in the quarter.

Georgia got the ball to start the second half and quickly went to work. Receiver Arian Smith ran the ball for seven yards on first down and then had a 32-yard reception on the next play. Wideout Dillon Bell ran for 27 yards up the left side, and soon after, Beck hit receiver Colbie Young for a seven-yard touchdown and a 13-0 lead with 12:01 to play in the third.

Clemson put together its best drive on the ensuing possession and had a first down at the Georgia 7. But the Bulldogs held the Tigers to a 26-yard Nolan Hauser field goal that cut the Georgia lead to 13-3 with 6:34 to go in the third quarter.

The Bulldogs responded with another touchdown drive. This one began with a short pass from Beck to tailback Nate Frazier that led to a 24-yard gain — and ended with a 1-yard Frazier run for the score and a 20-3 lead with 3:15 remaining in the quarter. Georgia also got a 23-yard completion from Beck to wideout London Humphrey on third-and-10 to keep the drive going.

Early in the fourth, Beck found Humphrey for the 40-yard score that made it 27-3. Later in the period, after Starks' interception, Cash Jones ran the ball in from the 15 to push the lead to 34-3. Linebacker Jalon Walker led the defense with six tackles, including 1.5 sacks.

### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"Anytime you play in Atlanta in this facility and it's part of a title-sponsor game where you're playing another top-15, top-20 (team), to me it feels like a playoff game. It's a great way to try to assess where you are as a team."



Freshman Nate Frazier ran for 83 yards and scored on a 1-yard run.

### Worth Noting...

- With the win, Georgia has won 11 straight season-openers and 40 consecutive regular-season games, a run that began in 2020. The Bulldogs have won 47 of their last 49 games.
- Linebacker Jalon Walker's six tackles led a group of 13 Bulldogs with at least two stops. Walker also led the defense with 1.5 sacks, while linebacker Mykel Williams had a team-high 2.0 tackles for loss.
- Malaki Starks' leaping fourth-quarter interception was the sixth of his career and looked almost exactly like his interception against Oregon in the 2021 Aflac Kickoff Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.
- Arian Smith led a large group of pass-catchers with a career-high five receptions for 56 yards. Nine different Bulldogs had at least one catch and eight caught at least two.
- Running back Brandon Robinson, in his first game since the 2022 College Football Playoff National Championship Game on Jan. 9, 2023, got the start in the backfield for Georgia. Robinson suffered a season-ending ruptured patella tendon less than two weeks before the 2023 opener. In his return, Robinson had seven carries for 12 yards.
- The captains for the Clemson game were quarterback Carson Beck, offensive lineman Tate Ratledge, Starks and Williams. All four were among Georgia's conference-leading 15 preseason All-SEC selections.
- Former Georgia coach Mark Richt gave the invocation on the field prior to kickoff Saturday, while legendary kicker Kevin Butler was the Bulldogs' honorary captain.



# No. 1 GEORGIA 48, TENNESSEE TECH 3

Sept. 7, 2024 • Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium • Athens

ATHENS, Ga. — Led by five touchdown passes from quarterback Carson Beck, the top-ranked Georgia football team earned its 26th consecutive win at Sanford Stadium on Saturday, routing Tennessee Tech 48-3 in the Bulldogs' home opener. The victory, in front of a crowd of 93,033 and a national audience on SEC Network+.

Beck completed his first 11 passes, for 111 yards, and threw three touchdown passes in the first half. Beck sat out much of the second half after the game was a runaway, ending up 18 of 25 passing for 242 yards and five touchdowns. Beck is the eighth Georgia passer to throw five TD passes in a game.

While the Georgia (2-0) offense piled up 498 yards, averaging 8.2 yards per play, the Bulldog defense held the Golden Eagles (0-2) to 134 yards of total offense and just 2.8 yards per play. Tech's only points came on a 32-yard field goal on the game's final play.

On Tech's first play from scrimmage, the Golden Eagles were stopped for a four-yard loss. The first time a Georgia player got his hands on the ball was when Anthony Evans III returned the Golden Eagles' first punt, going 46 yards down to the Tech 22-yard line. On the Bulldogs' first offensive play, Beck hit wide receiver Dillon Bell on the left edge of the end zone for a touchdown and a 7-0 lead less than three minutes into the game.

After the Bulldog defense forced another punt, the Georgia offense kept rolling. On third-and-11 at the UGA 41, Beck hit Oscar Delp for 13 yards. On the next play, Beck hit Dominic Lovett for 12, followed by a 14-yard completion to Arian Smith. A short pass to Brandon Robinson on the next play resulted in a 14-yard gain, and on first-and-goal at the 6, Beck connected with Colbie Young for a six-yard touchdown and a 14-0 lead.

The Bulldogs later got a 27-yard Peyton Woodring to push their lead to 17-0 with 11:45 to play in the half. And just before halftime, Georgia took a 24-0 lead after Beck hit Lovett for a 10-yard touchdown.

Georgia got the ball to open the second half, and soon another Beck pass was in the air for a touchdown. This time, on first down at the 50, Beck lofted one deep to Smith for the 50-yard score and a 31-0 lead.

Tech fumbled on its next drive, the game's first turnover, and safety Dan Jackson recovered the loose ball at the 27. Soon after, following a penalty, Beck lofted an easy pass to an open Lawson Luckie on the left side for a 37-yard touchdown and a 37-0 lead.

Gunner Stockton took over at quarterback midway through the third quarter and led the Bulldogs on another touchdown drive, with Branson Robinson scoring on a 13-yard rush. Stockton finished the game 10 of 12 passing for 90 yards. Woodring kicked a 32-yard field goal with 3:07 remaining in the game to make it 48-0 Bulldogs.

## Coach Kirby Smart said...

"It's awesome being home. Every time you walk into Sanford Stadium and see it packed — I give our fans credit, they were in the heat, they fought the heat and came and were loud, especially early. I think it was good entertainment; we scored on that first play on offense and got things rolling in the first half. I was proud of our fans."

## Worth Noting...

- The win was Georgia's 26th in a row at Sanford Stadium and the Bulldogs' 41st straight regular-season victory — both are the most in program history and are the longest active streaks among all FBS teams. Georgia has now won 48 of its last 50 games.
- Georgia's 2024 senior class is now 44-2, including a 38-0 record in the regular season. This year's seniors are chasing the all-time mark set by the Class of 2023, which went 50-4 overall, won two national titles, an SEC crown, and went 6-0 in bowl/CFP games.
- In his first appearance as a Bulldog, running back Trevor Etienne rushed for 78 yards on five carries, including a 45-yarder, and caught two passes for 14 yards. As a group, Georgia's backs rushed for 166 yards on 24 attempts.
- This was Georgia's third win over Tennessee Tech in three meetings. The Bulldogs won 67-0 in 1943 and 38-0 in 2009.
- During a timeout in the opening quarter, longtime Georgia Director of Sports Communications Claude Felton, who retired in January after 45 years on the job, was recognized on the field. Saturday also marked the debut of the Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium Press Box, which has a floor honoring Felton and one honoring his predecessor, Dan Magill.
- The captains were offensive lineman Xavier Truss, running back Cash Jones, nose guard Nazir Stackhouse and linebacker Chaz Chambliss. The Bulldogs won the toss and elected to defer to the second half.



## No. 1 GEORGIA 13, KENTUCKY 12

Sept. 14, 2024 • Kroger Field • Lexington, Ky.

LEXINGTON, Ky. — The top-ranked Georgia football team scratched and clawed its way to a 13-12 win over Kentucky in the Bulldogs' SEC opener Saturday night in front of a crowd of 61,663 at Kroger Field and a national television audience on ABC. Down 9-3 in the third quarter of a game dominated by the defenses, the Bulldogs got a 30-yard Peyton Woodring field goal and a three-yard Branson Robinson touchdown to take the lead for good.

The win is Georgia's 42nd in a row during the regular season, 28th straight in SEC regular-season games, and the program's 15th straight over Kentucky. Georgia had just 63 yards of offense in the first half before finding some rhythm and hitting some big plays in the second to finish with 262.

Georgia's defense held Kentucky to 284 yards, 3.9 yards per play, and forced a turnover that led to a Bulldog field goal. Cornerback Daylen Everette led the defense with eight tackles, including six solo. Eleven Bulldogs had at least four stops.

Kentucky took a 3-0 lead on a school-record 55-yard Alex Raynor field goal with 2:45 left in the opening quarter. The field goal marked the first first-half points that the Bulldogs had allowed this season.

In the second quarter, consecutive 15-yard penalties on Georgia's defense, plus a 15-yard Brock Vandagriff run on third-and-12, put the Wildcats in Georgia territory. A Tyron Ingram-Dawkins sack led to a six-yard loss. On the next play, Raylen Wilson sacked and stripped Vandagriff, and Damon Wilson II recovered the ball for Georgia at the Kentucky 23.

The turnover led to a 34-yard Woodring field goal, tying the game 3-3 with 3:48 to play in the half. The Wildcats answered with a drive inside the Georgia 20 and another Raynor field goal, this one a 32-yarder that put Kentucky ahead 6-3 at the half.

The Wildcats got the ball to start the second half and drove down to the Bulldog 22 before having to settle for a 40-yard Raynor field goal that pushed the Kentucky lead to 9-3.

Georgia's offense had its best drive of the game on the ensuing possession, with Beck completing a 33-yard pass to Lovett, followed soon after by a 20-yard completion to Dillon Bell. However, the Bulldogs eventually had to settle for a 30-yard Woodring field goal.

The Bulldog defense forced a three-and-out on Kentucky's next drive, and the offense took over at the Georgia 32. Trevor Etienne touched the ball on five straight plays on the drive, resulting in 49 yards, and Robinson ran the ball in from the 3 for a touchdown and the Bulldogs' first lead of the game, 13-9, with 12:20 to play.

Kentucky answered with an 11-play drive that resulted in a 51-yard Raynor field goal, cutting the Bulldog lead to 13-12 with 8:01 remaining. Neither team was able to produce any points after that.

### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"I don't know that we can rest and recover (next week). I mean, that's what people think bye weeks mean. We've got to find a way to improve and get better. You know, we were really beat up coming into this game, specifically at one position (defensive line), and it was a really tough week for us."

### Worth Noting...

- The Bulldogs were held to three first downs and 63 total yards in the first half, their lowest yardage output in an opening half since 2009. The offense produced some big plays (and 199 yards) in the second half, including a pair of 33-yard completions to Dominic Lovett. Lovett led all receivers with six catches for 89 yards.
- Facing off against his former (and hometown) team, Kentucky quarterback Brock Vandagriff threw for 114 yards and ran for 26. Georgia sacked Vandagriff three times and forced a fumble on two of them, one of which the Bulldogs recovered and led to a field goal in the second quarter.
- Eight Bulldogs had at least five tackles, led by cornerback Daylen Everett and safety Malaki Starks with eight each. Georgia's defense has yet to allow a touchdown through three games.
- After punting a total of five times in Georgia's first two games, Brett Thorson punted six times against Kentucky. He averaged 49.5 yards per boot, with a long a 58. Seven of Thorson's 11 punts this season have been downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line.
- Not only has Georgia won 15 straight games against Kentucky, the Bulldogs have also won eight in a row in the Wildcats' stadium. Georgia is 22-4 all-time at Kroger Field.
- The captains against Kentucky were linebacker Smael Mondon Jr., safety Malaki Starks, running back Trevor Etienne and offensive lineman Tate Ratledge. Kentucky won the toss and deferred to the second half.





## No. 4 ALABAMA 41, No. 2 GEORGIA 34

Sept. 28, 2024 • Bryant-Denny Stadium • Tuscaloosa, Ala.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — The No. 2-ranked Georgia football team suffered its first regular-season defeat since 2020 on Saturday night, falling 41-34 to No. 4 Alabama in a wild game in front of a crowd of 100,077 at Bryant-Denny Stadium and a national audience on ABC.

The Crimson Tide jumped out in front early with three first-quarter touchdowns, forcing the Bulldogs to play catch-up. Despite outscoring the Tide 27-11 in the second half, and briefly taking the lead late in the fourth quarter, the Bulldogs came up short in the end.

In a game with more than 1,000 yards of offense, Alabama finished with 547, while Georgia gained 519. Georgia's defense had allowed just 18 points on six field goals coming into the game, and the offense had zero turnovers through three games before committing four Saturday.

Quarterback Jalen Milroe scored on a seven-yard run for a Tide 7-0 lead with 10:11 left in the first quarter. Alabama went ahead 14-0 on a Milroe 16-yard touchdown pass to Jamarion Miller.

The Bulldogs' next drive ended when Domani Jackson intercepted a Carson Beck pass in Georgia territory and returned it to the UGA 22. Three plays later, Germie Bernard ran for a seven-yard touchdown and a 21-0 lead. Alabama scored again on its next drive when Milroe got free on fourth-and-1 and ran 36 yards for the touchdown and a 28-0 lead.

The Bulldog offense got going on its next possession, scoring on Trevor Etienne's seven-yard run to cut the lead to 28-7 with 6:43 left in the half. Alabama's final points of the half came on a safety, pushing the lead to 30-7 at halftime.

The Bulldogs cut Alabama's lead to 30-15 with 5:06 left in the third on a 12-yard touchdown catch by Arian Smith. Georgia converted two fourth-down plays on the drive and drew a penalty on Alabama on a third attempt. Beck hit Lawson Luckie in the end zone to convert the two-point attempt.

Alabama's Graham Nicholson kicked a 28-yard field goal with 1:23 to play in the third to push the Tide's lead to 33-15. Georgia cut the lead to 33-21 with 9:46 left in the game when Beck hit Luckie for an eight-yard touchdown.

Two big completions got the Bulldogs to the Tide 1 on their next drive. Beck connected with Cash Jones for a 30-yard gain, followed immediately by a 47-yard strike to Smith. Two plays later, Dillon Bell ran the ball in for a three-yard touchdown, trimming Alabama's lead to 33-27 with 5:39 to go.

Georgia's defense forced Alabama to punt on its next drive and the Bulldogs got the ball back at their 33 with a chance for the lead with 2:42 remaining. And on the first play, Beck hit Bell down the middle for a 67-yard touchdown to take a 34-33 lead with 2:31 remaining.

But the lead was short-lived. On the first play of Alabama's ensuing drive, Milroe connected with Ryan Williams for a 75-yard touchdown, and a successful two-point conversion made it 41-34 Tide with 2:18 to play.

Georgia had one last possession and drove into Alabama territory. On fourth-and-8 at the Tide 34, Beck hit Luckie for 14 yards to the 22. Beck's next pass was intercepted in the end zone with 43 seconds left.

### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"In the second half, we played some tighter coverage. We made some stops. We possessed the ball on offense. When you make stops, you give yourself a chance."

### Worth Noting...

- The loss snapped a run of 42 consecutive regular-season wins, as well as 28 straight in SEC regular-season games, for the Bulldogs. Georgia's last regular-season loss came against Florida on Nov. 7, 2020. The game was the first regular-season loss for Georgia's 2024 senior class, which is now 45-3 overall and 39-1 in the regular season.
- After getting behind 28-0 and trailing 30-7 at halftime, the Bulldogs outscored Alabama 27-11 in the second half.
- Georgia and Alabama combined for more than 1,000 yards of offense, with the Tide gaining 547 and Georgia getting 519 after being held to just 153 in the first half.
- The Bulldogs had two receivers finish with at least 100 yards: Arian Smith caught six passes for a career-high 132 and Dillon Bell had five receptions for a career-high 100.
- Six Georgia defenders had at least five tackles, led by Dan Jackson's career-high 10 and Malaki Starks' eight. Jackson also intercepted the third pass of his career.
- The captains for the game were quarterback Carson Beck, running back Trevor Etienne, linebacker Jalon Walker and safety Malaki Starks. Georgia won the toss and deferred to the second half.

## No. 5 GEORGIA 31, AUBURN 13

Oct. 5, 2024 • Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium • Athens

ATHENS, Ga. — Trevor Etienne rushed for two touchdowns, Carson Beck threw for two more, and the No. 5-ranked Georgia football team earned its eighth straight win over Auburn, 31-13, in front of a sellout, homecoming crowd of 93,033 at Sanford Stadium and a national audience on ABC.

Georgia finished with 381 yards, while the Tigers gained 337. Georgia now leads the all-time series with Auburn 65-56-8. Beck completed 23 of 29 passes for 240 yards and the two touchdowns, while Etienne did it all, rushing 16 times for 88 yards and the two TDs and catching six passes for 36. Defensive end Tyrion Ingram-Dawkins had a pair of sacks to help pace the strong showing from the defense.

The Bulldog offense got the scoring started with an 11-play, 75-yard drive that ended with an Etienne two-yard rush up the middle for a touchdown and a 7-0 lead with 6:24 remaining in the first quarter. Etienne had three rushes and two receptions on the drive, including a nine-yarder on a screen pass down to the 1-yard line.

The Tigers drove deep into Georgia territory on their next possession and had a first down at the 12. On third-and-6 at the 8, defensive end Mykel Williams tackled Thorne for a 1-yard loss. Auburn's Towns McGough kicked a 27-yard field goal to cut the Georgia lead to 7-3.

The second quarter was scoreless until the Bulldogs got the ball back with 1:02 on the clock. On first down at the Auburn 49, Beck hit Dominic Lovett for eight yards, followed by a one-yard completion to Etienne. On the next play, Etienne got loose on the right side for a 23-yard gain to the Tiger 17. Two plays later, Beck found Lovett on the left hash for an 11-yard touchdown, and a 14-3 lead.

Auburn managed to complete a couple of passes to get into field-goal range before halftime, and McGough's 54-yard attempt as time expired was blocked by safety Dan Jackson.

With 9:45 left in the third, Tigers running back Jarquez Hunter got free around the right side and went 38 yards for a touchdown, cutting the UGA lead to 14-10. But the game got no closer.

Georgia ran the ball on nine of 12 plays on the ensuing drive and scored a touchdown on Etienne's one-yard plunge. The back's second TD of the game pushed the Bulldogs' lead to 21-10 with 3:50 to play in the third.

Auburn got aggressive on its next possession and went for it on fourth and-1 at its 44-yard line. A Thorne run play was blown up from the start and linebacker Raylen Wilson got the tackle for a loss of four at the 40. Georgia took advantage of the great field position and later scored on a three-yard pass from Beck to Bell, making it a 28-10 game with 12:34 remaining.

The Tigers cut the lead to 28-13 with 7:38 left on McGough's 26-yard field goal. Auburn had a first-and-goal at the 10 but the Bulldog defense kept them out of the end zone. Kicker Peyton Woodring added a bit of insurance with a 47-yard field goal with 1:50 to make it 31-13.

### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"I thought the run game was good for us. I thought we were really close to hitting those explosives, and I feel like we left more out there. We have good backs. ... A couple of those times I thought we could cash them in, but we did make a lot of plays in the run game."

### Worth Noting...

- Trevor Etienne led the Bulldogs in rushing and receptions. On the ground, the running back had 16 carries for 88 yards and two touchdowns. Through the air, he caught six passes for 36 yards.
- Twenty Bulldogs had at least one tackle, including seven with three or more stops each. Safeties Dan Jackson and Malaki Starks led the way with seven and six, respectively. Jackson also blocked a 54-yard field-goal attempt on the final play of the first half. Georgia's defense held Auburn to a season-low 13 points.
- Saturday's win extended the Bulldogs run of consecutive wins between the hedges to 27 games, the longest streak in the FBS. It was also Georgia's eighth win in a row over the Tigers.

- Georgia's captains against Auburn were linebacker CJ Allen, Jackson, offensive lineman Earnest Greene III and wide receiver Dillon Bell. Georgia won the toss and elected to defer to the second half.





## No. 5 GEORGIA 41, MISS STATE 31

Oct. 12, 2024 • Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium • Athens

ATHENS, Ga. — Fifth-ranked Georgia amassed 605 yards of offense in a 41-31 win over Mississippi State in front of a sellout crowd of 93,033 at Sanford Stadium and a national audience on SEC Network.

Quarterback Carson Beck threw for a career-high 459 yards and three touchdowns, completing passes to 11 different receivers. Five different Bulldogs caught four or more passes; wideout Arian Smith had five for a career-high 134 yards and a touchdown.

On Georgia's second offensive play, a Beck pass was tipped and intercepted by cornerback Brice Pollock at the UGA 26-yard line. State's Kyle Ferrie later kicked a 47-yard field goal to put MSU ahead 3-0.

Georgia answered with a 10-play drive that ended with a 45-yard Peyton Woodring field goal to tie the game. Woodring later added a 32-yarder in the second quarter.

After the defense got another quick stop — State had a total of seven yards after three possessions — Georgia's offense drove 81 yards for the game's first touchdown. Branson Robinson put Georgia up 10-3 with a 5-yard run with 2:13 left in the quarter.

State cut the lead to 13-10 on a 24-yard touchdown pass from Michael Van Buren Jr. to Kelly Akharaiyi. Georgia produced some big plays of its own on the ensuing possession, and Beck hit Dillon Bell in the back of the end zone for a 31-yard score and a 20-10 lead.

Later in the second, Beck found Smith down the left hash for a 55-yard gain to the MSU 25. A few plays later, running back Cash Jones caught a direct snap in the backfield, handed the ball off to Beck, and the quarterback then lofted a pass to tight end Oscar Delp for a 17-yard gain to the 1. Tight end Lawson Luckie caught a 1-yard TD pass for a 27-10 lead.

Safety KJ Bolden picked off the first pass of his career on State's final drive of the half, giving UGA the ball at its 19 with 27 seconds left. Woodring attempted a 55-yard field goal as time expired but was wide left.

During the Bulldogs' first drive of the third, Beck hit tight end Ben Yurosek up the left side for a 29-yard gain, and on the next play, Beck found Smith for a 42-yard touchdown and a 34-10 lead.

State answered with a 19-yard rushing touchdown by Johnnie Daniels, cutting Georgia's lead to 34-17 with 8:27 left in the third. After another Beck interception, Van Buren hit running back Davon Booth for a touchdown on fourth-and-goal from the 2.

At the end of the 16-play, 81-yard drive that took 7:26 off the clock, running back Trevor Etienne plowed into the end zone from the 1 to give Georgia a 41-24 lead with 3:33 to play. Beck's 36th completion of the game, a 21-yarder to Bell on the left side to the MSU 4, gave the quarterback a new career-high in passing yardage and tied the school single-game record for completions.

State's final touchdown was a 35-yard completion to Akharaiyi with 1:47 remaining that made it a 41-31 game.

### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"We started fast and did some good things. ... I thought we gave them 14 points on defense, and if you take those 14 points away, I feel pretty good about the game. But we absolutely just handed them 14."

### Worth Noting...

- With the win, Georgia extended its school-record win streak on Dooley Field to 28 games. The Bulldogs haven't lost between the hedges since 2019.
- Not only did Carson Beck throw for a career-high 459 yards, topping the 439 he threw for at Alabama this season, he also tied the Georgia single-game record for completions with 36.
- Kicker Peyton Woodring connected on attempts of 45 and 32 yards, making him 9-for-9 this season, before missing wide left on a 55-yard attempt at the end of the first half.
- This was the 27th meeting between Georgia and Mississippi State, and Georgia's 21st win. Georgia is now 13-2 in the battle of the Bulldogs in Athens, and has won five straight overall in the series.
- The Bulldogs wore green ribbon decals on their helmets to raise awareness that Mental Health Matters in conjunction with Hilinski's Hope, a national organization whose mission is to promote mental health support and suicide prevention for student-athletes.
- Georgia's captains were defensive lineman Nazir Stackhouse, linebacker Chaz Chambliss, running back Cash Jones and wide receiver Arian Smith. Georgia won the toss and deferred to the second half.



## No. 5 GEORGIA 30, No. 1 TEXAS 15

Oct. 19, 2024 • DKR-Texas Memorial Stadium • Austin, Texas

AUSTIN, Texas — The fifth-ranked Georgia football team went on the road and knocked off top-ranked Texas, 30-15, in front of a sellout crowd of 105,215 at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium and a national audience on ABC.

The Bulldogs overcame three interceptions by Carson Beck thanks in large part to a defensive effort that largely held one of college football's top offenses — 43.2 points per game coming into the game — in check. Georgia finished with 10 tackles for loss and seven sacks, with linebacker Jalon Walker getting three sacks and a fumble recovery.

Georgia was held to 283 yards of offense and converted just 6 of 17 third-down attempts, but it made enough plays when it had to, including running back Trevor Etienne's three touchdown runs. And kicker Peyton Woodring connected on field goals from 33, 48 and 44 yards. Texas, which was held to 38 yards in the first half, finished with 259.

The win was No. 100 for Kirby Smart, who improved to 100-17 in his ninth season as Georgia's head coach.

Two of Beck's interceptions came in the first quarter, but the UGA defense didn't allow Texas to capitalize. Meanwhile, the Bulldogs forced their own turnover when cornerback Daylen Everette blitzed, sacked quarterback Quinn Ewers, forced a fumble, and recovered it at the Texas 13.

Georgia made the most of the turnover, scoring on a two-yard run by Etienne to take a 7-0 lead with six seconds left in the quarter. Etienne had 33 yards rushing and 23 receiving on seven touches in the opening quarter. Woodring's 33-yard field goal pushed the Bulldogs' lead to 10-0 with 10:46 left in the half.

Everette produced another turnover on Texas' next drive, intercepting Ewers at the Longhorn 34. Three plays later, after a 17-yard completion to Dominic Lovett, Etienne ran the ball in for a 15-yard touchdown. After another defensive stop, Woodring booted a 48-yard field goal to push the lead to 20-0.

Later in the half, Damon Wilson II sacked Arch Manning and forced a fumble that Walker recovered at the Texas 30 with 25 seconds left. Georgia then closed out the half with a 44-yard Woodring field goal to go up 23-0.

The Longhorns' first drive of the second half ended with a two-yard touchdown pass to Isaiah Bond, followed by a successful two-point attempt, cutting the Georgia lead to 23-8. Late in the third, after a controversial UT interception, Ewers hit Jaydon Blue for a 17-yard touchdown, cutting the lead to 23-15.

Georgia's final touchdown came on fourth down at the 1, when Etienne scored to make it 30-15 with 12:04 remaining. The Bulldog defense held off the Longhorns the rest of the way.

### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"It's pretty cool to hit that number (100 wins) because when I started I thought that was unreachable, unattainable. Now in 10 years, 9 years, I don't know how many years it is, we get there. It's a credit to this university and the support we have that we've been able to do that."



Jalon Walker led the defense with three sacks and a fumble recovery.

### Worth Noting...

- Georgia's defense spent a lot of time in Texas' backfield, sacking the quarterback seven times and finishing with 10 tackles for loss. Linebacker Jalon Walker led the way with three sacks, four QB hurries and seven tackles. Defensive lineman Mykel Williams added two sacks and a forced fumble. Cornerback Daylen Everette added a sack, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery, seven tackles and an interception.
- Running back Trevor Etienne paced the Bulldog offense with 110 yards of total offense and three touchdowns. He left his mark on the game early with 33 yards rushing and 23 receiving on seven touches in the opening quarter.
- At halftime, Georgia had 170 yards of offense to just 38 for Texas. The Bulldogs held UT to just 1.1 yards per play in the half and got stops for loss on seven of the Longhorns' 34 offensive plays, with five sacks.
- Georgia has now won 45 of its past 46 games including 31 of its past 32 SEC regular season games. The Bulldogs are 52-3 in their last 55 games. With the latest victory, Georgia's 2024 senior class improves to 48-3 overall and 42-1 in the regular season.
- Punter Brett Thorson averaged 54 yards on four punts, with two returned for minus-9 yards. Georgia has not allowed a positive yard on a return this season.
- Georgia's captains were quarterback Carson Beck, safety Malaki Starks, Walker and Etienne. The Longhorns won the toss and elected to defer to the second half.



## No. 2 GEORGIA 34, FLORIDA 20

Nov. 2, 2024 • EverBank Stadium • Jacksonville, Fla.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. — The No. 2-ranked Georgia football came up with several big plays late in the game to knock off Florida, 34-20, on Saturday afternoon in front of a crowd of 73,607 at EverBank Stadium and a national audience on ABC.

With the game tied 20-20, Georgia quarterback Carson Beck connected with wide receiver Dominic Lovett for a 10-yard touchdown with 4:01 to go. That was followed soon after by an interception by linebacker CJ Allen, and Dwight Phillips, Jr. later scored on a 4-yard run to seal the victory.

The Bulldogs moved the ball all the way down to the Florida 5-yard line on their second drive of the game before having to settle for a 23-yard Peyton Woodring field goal and a 3-0 lead with 2:10 left in the first quarter.

Florida produced the first turnover of the game early in the second quarter, intercepting a Beck pass at the Georgia 43. On the next play, Gator quarterback DJ Lagway hit wideout Aidan Mizell for a 43-yard touchdown and a 7-3 Florida lead with 13:42 left in the half.

The Gators picked off another Beck pass on Georgia's next drive, taking over at the Florida 49. The Gators drove inside the 15 before the Bulldog defense forced them to settle for a 32-yard Trey Smack field goal.

With 43 seconds left in the half, Woodring kicked a 53-yard field goal to cut the Florida lead to 10-6. The Gators, playing with backup quarterback Aidan Warner after Lagway left the game earlier in the quarter with an injury, answered with a 53-yarder from Smack to make it 13-6 Florida at halftime.

The Gators forced another turnover over on Georgia's first drive of the third, intercepting Beck, who was hit as he threw, for the third time. The Bulldog defense forced a quick three-and-out, with cornerback Daylen Everette tackling Warner for a 3-yard loss on third down, to get the ball back.

Georgia then tied things up 13-13 with 7:01 left in the third. Beck completed passes of 9 and 17 yards to Lovett, Dillon Bell ran 33 yards to the Florida 15 and later caught an 11-yard pass to the 2, and Frazier capped the drive with a 2-yard touchdown run.

Florida's next drive ended with a bad snap on a long field-goal attempt, with the Gators losing 31 yards on the play and Georgia taking over at the Florida 36. The Bulldogs then went ahead 20-13 on a 22-yard touchdown catch by Cash Jones out of the backfield.

The Gators tied the game on a 15-yard Ja'Kobi Jackson touchdown run, making it 20-20 with 7:29 remaining. Georgia then drove 75 yards in seven plays and scored on the 10-yard touchdown pass from Beck to Lovett. Earlier in the drive, facing a third-and-7 at the Bulldog 28, Beck connected with Arian Smith for a 34-yard gain to the Gator 38. That was followed by a 21-yard completion to Lawson Luckie down to the 17.

Allen picked off Warner on Florida's next drive, and Phillips ran the ball in soon after to put the game away with 3:03 remaining.

### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"The difference in the game was our fans gave us some momentum, gave us some energy there, (and we) had some big defensive stops. Obviously you cannot turn the ball over and beat good teams. And make no mistake about it, Florida's a much improved team."



Dominic Lovett had seven catches for 52 yards and a touchdown.

## No. 16 OLE MISS 28, No. 3 GEORGIA 10

Nov. 9, 2024 • Vaught-Hemingway Stadium • Oxford, Miss.

OXFORD, Miss. — The No. 3-ranked Georgia football team fell to No. 16 Ole Miss, 28-10, on a rainy Saturday afternoon in front of a crowd of 68,126 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium and a national audience on ABC.

The Bulldogs went ahead 7-0 early but struggled to get much going after that, suffering a second regular-season loss for the first time since 2020. Quarterback Carson Beck completed 20 of 31 passes for 185 yards, while the Georgia rushing attack was held to 76 yards on 31 attempts.

The Georgia defense got off to a great start, stopping Rebel quarterback Jaxson Dart for a 1-yard run on the first play, sacking him for a loss of 6 on the second, and then safety Dan Jackson intercepted a Dart pass at the Rebel 34 and returned it 13 yards to the 21 on the third play.

Georgia's offense took full advantage of the turnover. Trevor Etienne ran the ball four times in a row to get to the Rebel 4. Later, on fourth-and-goal at the 2, Nate Frazier ran the ball in on the right side for a touchdown and a 7-0 lead with 10:32 left in the opening quarter.

Austin Simmons took over at quarterback for Ole Miss on its second drive and led the Rebels 75 yards for a touchdown. The Rebels converted a fourth-and-1 at the Georgia 44 and later scored on a 9-yard run by Ulysses Bentley, tying the game with 6:53 to play in the first.

Dart returned for the Rebels' third drive and led them down to the UGA 6-yard line, where the Bulldogs forced Ole Miss to settle for a 33-yard Caden Davis field goal and a 10-7 Rebel lead with 3:01 on the clock.

The Rebels added a 43-yard Davis field goal with 12:12 left in the half to push their lead to 13-7. Ole Miss later got a 53-yard Davis field goal to make it 16-7 with 2:55 to play until halftime.

Georgia opened the second half with a 70-yard drive that included four plays of at least 12 yards, but the Bulldogs ultimately had to settle for a 23-yard Peyton Woodring field goal that cut the Rebels' lead to 16-10.

Ole Miss answered with a 75-yard touchdown drive that ended with a 10-yard pass to Antwane Wells in the back of the end zone. Georgia stopped the two-point attempt, holding the Rebels' lead to 22-10.

After being held to 69 yards in the first half, Georgia gained 138 in the third quarter, but only managed a field goal. The Bulldogs had the ball as the fourth began and moved the ball down to the Rebel 27, but a fourth-and-10 Beck pass was tipped and intercepted with 7:22 left in the game.

Ole Miss added a 25-yard Davis field goal with 3:22 remaining to extend the Rebels' lead to 25-10. Ole Miss sacked and stripped Beck on Georgia's next drive, recovering the fumble at the Georgia 19. The Rebels tacked on a 32-yard Davis field goal with 1:11 remaining to make it 28-10.

Linebacker CJ Allen led the Georgia defense with eight tackles and two QB hurries. Linebacker Jalon Walker and defensive back Malaki Starks had six tackled each.

### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"We obviously struggled in a lot of areas. We had miscues, mistakes, penalties, things that are really hard to overcome, especially when you play a really good football team — and they are."

### Worth Noting...

- Senior Tate Rattledge returned to start at right guard, his first start since the Kentucky game on Sept. 14. He missed the next four games with an ankle injury and then saw action last week versus Florida. Also of note, senior linebacker Smael Mondon Jr., saw his first action after missing the past four games due to injury.
