Division Title On The Line In Lexington

On Saturday, Georgia aims to go undefeated in a season against the SEC East for the second straight year. The 2017 Bulldogs became the first UGA team to go 6-0 versus the East since the league split into divisions in 1992. The Bulldogs face a Kentucky team ranked #11 and one that is enjoying its finest start to a season at 7-1 since their 1976 squad went 10-1. The Wildcats lead the nation in Scoring Defense allowing only 13.0 points per game. They have held every opponent to 20 points or less. Last Saturday, Missouri had the ball eight times in the second half against Kentucky and went three-and-out all eight tries. The Bulldogs are averaging the second-most points in the SEC this year (38.6) and are also second in SEC games only (35.8). The Wildcats are giving up just 12.3 points a game in SEC games.

Last year, Georgia clinched the SEC East in the first Saturday of November after it defeated South Carolina and Kentucky lost to Ole Miss. The Bulldogs lead the all-time series against Kentucky 57-12-2, including winning the last eight meetings. The Wildcats' last win over Georgia came in Athens with a 34-27 victory in 2009.

Georgia At A Glance

Georgia bounced back from its first loss with a 36-17 win over #9 Florida in Jacksonville last weekend. The Bulldogs accounted for 429 yards of total offense, forced three Gator turnovers and turned them into 10 points. This will only be the third time in the UGA-UK series history that both teams will be ranked (2007: #8 UGA 24, #22 UK 13; 1946: #8 UGA 28, #19 UK 13).

Kentucky At A Glance

On Sept. 8, the Wildcats registered a 27-16 upset of then No. 25 Florida in Gainesville to end a 31-year losing streak to the Gators. Entering the Nov. 3 game with Georgia, the No. 11 Wildcats (7-1, 5-1 SEC) will battle for the SEC East crown with the Bulldogs.

Overall, Kentucky leads the nation in scoring defense, allowing just 13.0 points a game. In fact, Kentucky is the only FBS school in the country not to allow more than 20 points in a game this year. The 2018 Wildcats feature a Heisman candidate in junior running back Benny Snell, who leads the SEC in rushing with 935 yards (116.9 avg./game), and a defense led by projected NFL first round draft pick senior linebacker Josh Allen, who currently ranks among the national leaders with 10 sacks, 14.5 tackles for loss and five forced fumbles.

2016 Series Flashback: Georgia Rallies Past Wildcats 27-24

Georgia staged a fourth-quarter comeback to edge the Wildcats in Lexington as red-shirt freshman **Rodrigo Blankenship** drilled a 25-yard field goal as time expired. The Bulldogs started the game-winning drive on their own 25-yard line with 2:27 left in the contest and the scored tied at 24-all. Freshman QB Jacob Eason drove the Bulldogs 67 yards on nine plays to put them in field goal position. Blankenship set career highs by going 4-for-4 on field goals. Georgia entered the fourth quarter trailing 21-16, took a 24-21 lead with 9:12 left before the Wildcats tied the game with their own 25-yard field goal with under three minutes remaining. It capped a 14-play, 68-yard drive. Defensively for the Bulldogs, freshman **Julian Rochester** had eight tackles while **Deandre Baker** had his first career interception. Both teams saw their record go to 5-4 overall.

Last Time Versus The Wildcats: 2017 - #7 Georgia 42, Kentucky 13

Seventh-ranked Georgia bounced back from its first loss of the season to beat Kentucky 42-13 in Athens. The Wildcats got on the scoreboard first with a field goal. However, it would be their final lead of the game. The Bulldogs held Kentucky scoreless in the second and fourth quarters and totaled six touchdowns of their own.

Georgia's record-setting tandem backfield tandem of Sony Michel and Nick Chubb combined for five of those scores and 238 yards. Chubb put the Bulldogs on the scoreboard with an 8-yard run in the opening period and finished with 151 yards and two touchdowns. Michel scored three times and had 87 yards. Roquan Smith led the defense with nine stops while Aaron Davis added an interception.

Head Football Coach



When Georgia looked for a new head coach after the 2015 season, the arrows pointed to Kirby Smart, longtime Alabama defensive coordinator and former UGA player and assistant. The 2017 *Associated Press* SEC Coach of the Year has not disappointed.

In his first year leading the Bulldogs in 2016, Georgia extended its school record to 20 consecutive bowl appearances and posted five fourth-quarter comebacks including wins over No. 8 Auburn and No. 22 North Carolina. He led UGA to an 8-5 final record, which included a

victory over TCU in the Liberty Bowl.

In 2017, Smart directed UGA to a 13-2 record, an SEC title, a win at The Rose Bowl Game during the CFP semifinal and a spot in the National Championship. He was named the *Maxwell Football Club's George Munger National Coach of the Year*. Before 2017, the Bulldogs last SEC title was 2005.

He has also made an immediate impact in recruiting, posting the nation's top-ranked class in 2018 and the third-ranked class in 2017. In addition to coaching, Smart oversees the Kirby Smart Family Foundation, which is focused on being champions in the community by supporting and giving back to needy children and families.

Smart officially came home to Georgia on Dec. 6, 2015. But he still had unfinished business at Alabama, which was chasing a national title. He juggled two jobs for a month until January 11, 2016, when the Tide won its fourth national championship in a seven-year span. Twelve hours later, he was at work in Athens.

*2017 *Georgia Munger National Coach of the Year* finalist, leading UGA to a 13-2 record, a Rose Bowl Game victory and an appearance the CFP National Championship Game.
 *The Bulldogs' No. 2 AP ranking in 2017 was the team's top AP ranking since week three of the 2008 season when Georgia was No. 2.
 *Bulldogs captured the SEC Eastern Division by going 7-1 in 2017, including a perfect 6-0 in the division for the first time since the league split into divisions in 1992.
 *Seven fourth-quarter comebacks, including wins over #8 AU (2016), #22 UNC in Atlanta (2016), @ #24 Notre Dame (2017), vs. #2 Oklahoma in 2018 Rose Bowl Game.
 *Led UGA to its first win over a ranked team in a season opener away from Sanford Stadium in school history, posting a 33-24 win over #22 UNC during the 2016 Chick-Fil-A Kickoff Classic.

High Octane Offense

* Georgia is on pace to set a record for scoring average in a season. The Bulldogs have scored 40+ points in five of their eight games this year. However, their average took a hit at #13 LSU as Georgia only managed 16 points in its loss. Georgia is averaging 38.6 points/game (2nd in the SEC). The 2012 team owns the school record at 37.8. Kentucky's Scoring Defense is tied for the national lead, allowing just 13 points a gam, and has allowed no more than 20 points in a game this season.

*The Bulldog offense has scored 35 touchdowns in 2018 while the defense and special teams have each chipped in two scores.

* Georgia did not trail in a game until Vanderbilt took a 3-0 in game six this year. The Bulldogs responded 15 seconds later with a touchdown pass from sophomore QB **Jake Fromm** to senior WR **Terry Godwin** with 10:15 left in the opening period. Against #13 LSU, Georgia trailed the entire game.

* #9 Florida took a 14-13 lead early in the second half and Georgia responded with a seven-play, 72-yard TD drive to reclaim the lead for good en route to a 36-17 win in Jacksonville.

Efficient Signal Callers

* **Jake Fromm** is hovering around the school record for Completion Percentage in 2018. He is ranked second in the SEC at 67.4 percent. Georgia's school record is 67.9 by Hutson Mason in 2014. The SEC record is 72.3 percent held by Tim Couch (UK, 1998).

* Fromm is 19-3 as a starter, including 6-3 versus Top 25 teams.

* The Warner Robins, Ga., native is ranked fifth nationally on the active list in Passing Efficiency at 174.0.

* His three TD passes versus #9 Florida all came on third downs covering 12, 16 and 24 yards.

* Georgia also has freshman QB **Justin Fields**, who was one of the nation's top recruits. After enrolling in January, he has seen action in seven of eight games and is 18-for-25 with 200 yards and two scores and three rushing touchdowns. He averages 7.6 yards a carry.

* Fields scampered for a career-high 45 yards on five carries during the win over the Vols and finished with two scoring runs.

* In his career, Fromm has led his team to two comebacks when trailing at the half. One of Georgia's signature wins came with his 2018 Rose Bowl Game performance after the Bulldogs trailed #2 Oklahoma 31-17 at the half and rallied to a 54-48 win in double overtime. Georgia trailed 45-38 with 3:22 remaining in the game before Fromm directed a game-tying drive.

* Fromm's first career start came last year at #24 Notre Dame. Trailing 19-17 with 6:47 left in the contest, Fromm directed a nine play, 63-yard drive to set up the go-ahead field goal. He was 3-for-4 for 45 yards during the drive.

Next Man Up On The Line

*The Bulldogs returned four of five starters on the offensive line, including Freshman All-American and 2018 *Sporting News* Midseason All-American tackle **Andrew Thomas**. Georgia has started three different alignments on the OL but has had the same starters the last four games.

* Georgia ranks second in the SEC in Rushing Offense at 221.6 yards/game and leads in SEC games only (204.7).

* Georgia's starting line has featured Thomas/freshman **Cade Mays** (LT), redshirt sophomore **Solomon Kindley** (LG), senior **Lamont Gaillard** (C), redshirt sophomore **Ben Cleveland/Mays** (RG) and redshirt freshman **Isaiah Wilson** (RT).

* The Bulldogs have rotated a number of players on the line due to injuries. Thomas went down with a left ankle injury against #24 South Carolina and then a right ankle injury versus #9 Florida, and freshman **Cade Mays** filled in both times. Mays started at LT versus Middle Tennessee State in game three as Thomas recovered from his first ankle injury. Thomas started and played briefly in the road win over Missouri and was back in his normal role against Tennessee.

In the second half of the win at Missouri, Cleveland went down with a leg injury and has missed the last three games. Sophomore **Justin Shaffer** filled in and Mays has taken most of the snaps there since then. Kindley left the Vandy game with a knee injury and freshman **Trey Hill** played in his spot. Versus the Gators, senior **Kendall Baker** and Mays split time at LT after Thomas went down. However, Thomas did return.

Spreading The Wealth

* Georgia's quarterbacks have done a good job of spreading the ball around to receivers. Junior **Riley Ridley** leads the group with 27 catches for 374 yards and five touchdowns. Junior **Mecole Hardman** checks in with 26 receptions for 368 yards and four scores.

* Hardman had a career day at #24 South Carolina, hauling in six catches for 103 yards, including a 34-yard touchdown. This was Georgia's first 100-yard receiver since the 2016 Liberty Bowl versus TCU (Isaiah McKenzie, 4-103). He had a 70-yard PR for a TD versus MTSU and a 54-yard touchdown catch at Missouri.

* Senior **Terry Godwin** came up with a career-long 75-yard touchdown catch in the win over Vanderbilt and a 24-yard scoring reception to ice the 36-17 win over #9 Florida.

* Sophomore **Jeremiah Holloman** has emerged into another target for the Bulldogs. He has 15 catches for 282 yards and four scores, including a pair that came in the win over the Gators.

* The Bulldog tight ends have shown the ability to block and be options in the passing game. Junior **Isaac Nauta** had a career-high five catches for 73 yards against #9 Florida.

Bulldogs Among Leaders In Scoring Defense

* Georgia is fifth in the SEC in Scoring Defense, allowing just 16.4 points/game. UGA has held opponents scoreless in 13 of 32 quarters this season.

* The Bulldogs held #9 Florida to a season-low 275 total yards in their 36-17 victory over the Gators in Jacksonville. UGA forced UF into turnovers on its first two possessions.

* Georgia kept Tennessee scoreless in the first half, making it the second time they have held an opponent scoreless in the first two quarters in 2018 (Austin Peay). With the Vols coming in averaging 205 yards rushing a game, the Bulldogs held them to 66 on the ground and only 209 total yards.

* In the first half of the Bulldogs' win at Missouri, the Tigers ran 38 plays for 159 yards and were held to a single touchdown. Missouri entered the contest averaging 43.7 points. In the second half, the Tigers tallied 22 points and finished the game with 393 total yards on 85 plays.

* In the Bulldogs' 41-13 win over Vanderbilt, the Commodores were held to a pair of field goals until they scored their first touchdown with :02 left.

Walker Making An Impact

* Senior OLB **D'Andre Walker** has emerged as the leader on the outside. During the loss at #13 LSU, Walker had four stops, including his team-leading fifth sack. He recorded four tackles, including two sacks, and forced two fumbles in the win at Missouri.

* Walker's three forced fumbles is tied for eighth nationally. Also of note, he has 24 total tackles and 6.5 of those are TFLs.

* Georgia has senior **Juwan Taylor**, sophomore **Monty Rice**, junior **Tae Crowder** and senior **Natrez Patrick** splitting time at ILB. Rice is second on the team with 43 stops in only seven games while Taylor is fifth with 28.

* In the victory over #9 Florida, Rice established a career high 11 stops and forced a fumble while Crowder recovered a fumble on the Gator 1-yard line.

* Taylor recovered his second fumble versus Tennessee, which is tied with S **Richard LeCounte** for the team lead.

* Crowder highlighted the Missouri game with a 43-yard interception return, marking the first pick of his career.

* Rice had eight tackles versus USC while Taylor was credited with a touchdown after DB **Deandre Baker** dropped the ball at the 1 yard line following a 55-yard INT return.

Starting Up Front

* Veterans **Tyler Clark** and **Jonathan Ledbetter** anchor the defensive line. Clark has 18 stops, including 3.0 TFL, while Ledbetter has 28 tackles and one tackle for loss, including seven against the Gators. Ledbetter posted a career-high 10 stops at #13 LSU. On a 3rd-and-1 situation from the UGA 5-yard line versus Vanderbilt, Clark shot behind the line and picked a tackle for loss to force the Commodores into a field goal.

* True freshman **Jordan Davis** has seen his playing time increase in the past three games and started versus #9 Florida. In the contest at #13 LSU, Davis recorded seven tackles. Against the Commodores, he came up with a key stop on 4th-and-1 on the Bulldog 14-yard line with the score 7-3. Davis stalled a drive that had gone 81 yards and Georgia then responded by going 86 yards on eight plays to go up 14-3.

* In addition to Clark and Ledbetter, junior **Julian Rochester**, Georgia is rotating in juniors **Michael Barnett**, **Michail Carter** and sophomore **Devonte Wyatt**.

* The Bulldogs held Missouri QB Drew Lock to no touchdown passes in their trip to Columbia.

Baker, Reed Leading Defensive Backfield

* Senior DB **Deandre Baker**, who was named a preseason and now a midseason All-American, has 26 tackles on the year and a team-best two interceptions and eight pass break-ups. Bak-

er is the SEC leader in passes defended with 10.

* He had six stops, two pass breakups and the team's first interception in 2018 (*along with a 55-yard return*) at #24 South Carolina. Baker was named the *Athlon National Defensive Player of the Week* following the contest. He followed that performance up with another pick and a fumble recovery in the win over MTSU.

* Junior safety **J.R. Reed** ranks third on the team with 37 tackles. He has been the leading tackler three times. Reed's lone pick on the year came in the end zone at South Carolina.

* Sophomore **Richard LeCounte** has started every game this year and leads the squad with 47 tackles. He has been the leading tackler twice this year, including six stops and a forced fumble versus Vanderbilt. LeCounte had seven tackles and a 32-yard fumble return in the win over #9 Florida.

* Freshman **Tyson Campbell** posted a career-high 11 tackles in the loss at #13 LSU, including eight solo stops.

* Campbell and redshirt freshman **Eric Stokes** had career highlights in the win at Missouri. Campbell started the game by forcing a fumble, recovering it and scampering 64 yards for a touchdown. Stokes blocked a punt and returned it eight yards for another of the Dogs' scores.

Blankenship One Of The Best

* Preseason All-American candidate PK **Rodrigo Blankenship** enters the game with 75 points on the year (13 FGs, 36 PATs). He was named the *SEC Special Teams Player of the Week* following the 41-17 rout at #24 South Carolina.

* In the win over Vanderbilt, he had a season-long 53 yarder.

* Honored as one of 11 players nationwide named to the **2018 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team**.

* Has connected on a school record 125 consecutive PATs, topping Blair Walsh's record of 119 (2008-11).

* Second in NCAA with 53 touchbacks out of 59 KO's in 2018.

* Last year, 67 of his kickoffs were touchbacks, which was a new school record. The old mark was by Kevin Butler (51 in 1981).

* Set a Rose Bowl Game record by drilling a career-long 55-yard field goal during the 2OT win over #2 Oklahoma. His performance included a 38-yard FG in overtime.

* True freshman **Jake Camarda** started his career versus APSU with three punts for a 55 yard average (*fifth best in UGA history*), including a long of 63. He is averaging 42.1 this year.

SEC's Leading Punt Returner Back

* Junior returner/receiver **Mecole Hardman** is leading the SEC in Punt Return average at 22.4. He is back in the lineup after having 23 punt returns for 271 yards and an 11.8 average in 2017 (*all of those led the SEC*). Also, Hardman is averaging 26.0 on six kickoff returns this year.

* Had a 70-yard PR for a touchdown versus MTSU.

Common Connections

* The Wildcats have several connections with the Bulldogs and their coaching staff.

* Kentucky assistant head coach/running backs Eddie Gran crossed paths with Bulldog offensive coordinator/tight ends coach **Jim Chaney** at Tennessee in 2009 when Chaney was offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. Wildcats assistant coach Darrin Hinshaw also served on the Vols staff with Chaney from 2010-12.

* Kentucky wide receivers coach Michael Smith worked with Georgia offensive line coach **Sam Pittman** from 2013-15 while the two were at Arkansas. Pittman also coached the OL for the Razorbacks.

* Wildcats defensive line coach Derrick LeBlanc spent one year with Bulldog defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach **Mel Tucker** at LSU in 2000. Tucker was the Tigers' DB coach.

Tailback By Committee

* While Georgia counted on a record-setting tandem in the backfield over the last couple of years, the Bulldogs are calling on a variety of tailbacks to lead the attack in 2018, including sophomore **D'Andre Swift** and juniors **Elijah Holyfield**.

* After eight games, including starting the last four, Holyfield is now the leading rusher with 559 yards on 85 carries (6.6 avg).

* Swift has started four games, has 83 carries for 466 yards and a team-leading five touchdowns.

* Swift posted his first 100-yard game after tallying 104 yards and a score on 12 carries versus #9 Florida.

* Holyfield's season highlights include his first career 100-yard rushing performance (8 for 100) versus MTSU.

* Georgia is replacing tailbacks Nick Chubb (*currently a Cleveland Brown*) and Sony Michel (*currently a New England Patriot*). They completed their Bulldog career in 2017 as the top pair in college football history, amassing 8,407 rushing yards and 77 rushing touchdowns.

N.O.T. Just Scoring On Offense

* The Bulldogs' 39 touchdowns this season have included 31 by the offense, two by the defense and two by special teams.

* The last N.O.T.s (*Non-Offensive Touchdowns*) came in the 43-29 road win over Missouri. Georgia had a 20-7 lead at halftime and the offense did not have a touchdown. The Bulldogs' first score came on a forced fumble/64-yard return for a touchdown by freshman **Tyson Campbell**.

In the second quarter, redshirt freshman **Eric Stokes** blocked his first career punt and returned it eight yards for a score. This marked the 10th defensive/special teams score in the **Kirby Smart** era. In fact, Georgia's first TD in both of the first two SEC games this year were scored by the defense.

* Also, it was the first time since 2015 at Tennessee that Georgia had registered a special teams touchdown and a defensive score in the same game. That year, current Chicago Bears linebacker Leonard Floyd had a 96-yard fumble return and Reggie Davis had a 70-yard punt return.

Blankenship Latest Good Works Team Rep

* When junior PK **Rodrigo Blankenship** was named to the **2018 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team** for his dedication to the community, he joined a long list of Bulldogs who have garnered this honor.

* In fact, Georgia leads the nation with 19 recipients since the award's inception in 1992.

Record Watch

* The Bulldogs are now eight games into their 2018 slate and junior PK **Rodrigo Blankenship** has set one all-time school career record and has another on the horizon.

* He now has 125 consecutive PATs, which topped Blair Walsh's 119 from 2008-10. The next record to keep an eye on is career touchbacks. The record is held by Kevin Butler (1981-94) who had 169 during his career. Currently, Blankenship has 141. Last year, Blankenship set the season touchback record with 67 breaking the mark held by Butler who had 51. Incidentally, Blankenship already has the nation's second-most touchbacks with 53 this year.

Bulldog Graduates

* Georgia has three players on this year's roster who have already earned their undergraduate degrees.

* The players who received their undergraduate degrees include: DL **Jay Hayes** (Notre Dame-Film, Television, Theater), P **Landon Stratton** (Murray State-Occupational and Health Safety) and OL **Sean Fogarty** (UGA-History). Hayes is pursuing a Master's degree in Financial Planning while Stratton is enrolled in the Master's program for Learning, Leadership and Organizational Development. Fogarty is taking a full load of undergraduate courses.

* All of the SEC players who have achieved an undergraduate degree will be sporting the SEC Graduate patch on their uniforms.



UGA 13th In US News & World Report rankings

* UGA jumped three spots to No. 13 in the *U.S. News & World Report* 2019 ranking of best public national universities, the highest ranking in UGA's history. This is the third consecutive year the university has risen in the U.S. News ranking.

No. 7 Georgia 42, Kentucky 13

Nov. 18, 2017 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

ATHENS, Ga. - Senior running backs Nick Chubb and Sony Michel combined for 238 yards and five touchdowns to lead the seventh-ranked Georgia Bulldogs to a 42-13 win against Kentucky in the 2017 home finale at Sanford Stadium Saturday evening.

The Southeastern Conference Eastern Division champion Bulldogs improve to 10-1 overall and 7-1 in the SEC. This squad also became the first Georgia team to go undefeated in a season against the rest of the SEC East with a perfect 6-0 mark.

With Saturday's win on Senior Day, the current Georgia senior class improved to 38-12 in their careers, including an unblemished record at home this season.

Freshman quarterback Jake Fromm threw an interception on Georgia's first possession of the game, setting the Wildcats up deep in Bulldog territory. Kentucky capitalized on the opportunity with a 37-yard field goal from Austin MacGinnis.

The Bulldogs could get nothing going on their next offensive series, until Kentucky roughed punter Cameron Nizialek to give Georgia a fresh pair of downs at its own 34-yard line. Fromm marched his team down the field on a 12-play, 75 yard drive capped off by an eight-yard touchdown rush by Chubb.

Blake Bone hauled in a 45-yard pass on UK's next possession to set up another field goal - this time a 35-yarder from MacGinnis to put the score at 7-6 in the Bulldogs' favor at the end of the first quarter.

Georgia's offense started clicking in the second quarter as the Bulldogs put together two scoring drives to take a 21-6 lead at the half. One score came through the air and the other on the ground when Javon Wims caught a 27-yard TD pass from Fromm and Michel bounced it outside for a 37-yard TD rush.

Chubb was not done. The Bulldog senior surged over left tackle to start the fourth quarter and raced 55 yards down the field to put him over 1,000 yards for the season as Georgia went up 35-13.

Michel added another touchdown early in the fourth quarter and the Bulldogs left Sanford Stadium with a 42-13 victory.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"What a great way for these seniors to go out - winning the SEC East by going undefeated against the East," head coach Kirby Smart said. "Our seniors have given us tremendous leadership, and I'm happy and proud of them. Our seniors have set the standard and our young players have bought in. It helps to have such great leadership."

Worth Noting...

- Along with going undefeated in the SEC East, Georgia also became the first team to go undefeated in Sanford Stadium (6-0) in a season since 2012.
- Chubb became only the second Bulldog running back in history (Herschel Walker) to rush for 1,000 or more yards in three different seasons after finishing with 15 carries for 151 yards, including scoring runs of eight and a season-long 55 yards. His two touchdowns give him 45 TDs in his career (team-leading 12th of the year), moving him to second behind Herschel Walker (52). Chubb has now scored two touchdowns in a game 14 times and gone over the 100-yard mark 23 times in his career. At this point in the season, Chubb has rushed for 1,045 yards.
- Sony Michel finished with 87 yards on 12 carries with three scores. He stands tied for fifth on Georgia's all-time all-purpose yards with 3,834 yards. Michel's first scoring run came at the end of a 12-play, 75-yard drive that lasted 6:21, which is Georgia's longest TD drive of the year.
- The Georgia defense held Kentucky to just six points on two field goals and 140 yards (53 on the ground) in the first half and UK added only a touchdown in the second half and finished with 262 yards of total offense. UK came in averaging 27.9 points/game and 361 yards of total offense. The Wildcats were 3-for-12 (25%) on third downs.

No. 6/7 Georgia 36, No. 9/11 Florida 17

Oct. 27, 2018 • TIAA Bank Stadium - Jacksonville, Fla.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - The No. 6/7 Georgia Bulldogs dominated a top-10 matchup with the No. 9/11 Florida Gators on Saturday 36-17 in front of a crowd of 84,463 at TIAA Bank Stadium, a CBS national television audience and with ESPN College Gameday and SEC Nation in attendance.

The Bulldogs improved to 7-1 overall and 5-1 in Southeastern Conference play with the victory against UF, which drops to 6-2 overall and 4-2 in league competition.

Sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm connected on three touchdown passes (all on third down), with a 17-24 passing clip for 240 yards, two of those going to sophomore wide receiver Jeremiah Holloman for 12 and 16 yards, respectively.

The Georgia run game controlled the first drive for the Bulldog offense, split between junior Elijah Holyfield and sophomore D'Andre Swift. Through 12 plays and 71 yards, the pair of tailbacks marched the Bulldogs to the Florida 4-yard line, where junior place kicker Rodrigo Blankenship drilled a 21-yard field goal.

Three plays later, sophomore linebacker Monty Rice instigated a fumble that found sophomore defensive back Richard LeCounte, who ran for 32 yards. Set up in the red zone, the Bulldog offense produced a 16-yard touchdown from Fromm to sophomore wide receiver Jeremiah Holloman. The Blankenship PAT secured the 10-0 lead headed into the second quarter.

The Bulldogs utilized junior tight end Isaac Nauta on four-straight completions from Fromm on the right side. Blankenship sent the Bulldogs into the break with a 13-7 lead.

The Gators opened the half with a 36-yard touchdown pass, but Georgia countered by way off Fromm's second touchdown completion to Holloman, a 12-yard back-shoulder throw for a 20-14 lead. Shortly after, junior defensive back Tyrique McGhee forced a fumble recovered by junior linebacker Tae Crowder at the UF 1-yard-line, leading to another Blankenship kick from 18 yards out.

Florida made it a one-possession game with a 42-yard field goal from Evan McPherson, but the Bulldog offense kicked into gear with a 24-yard strike from Fromm to senior wide receiver Terry Godwin with 8:39 left and capped off by a 33-yard Swift run towards a 36-17 final.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"The difference was we got kids with character. Everybody questioned these kids because we didn't play our best game (two weeks ago vs. LSU), and all we did was work. Everybody questioned and questioned it. They are tough, physical kids. We still have a long way to go. But we got better today...They played their heart out. I'm so proud of the way they played. I'm proud for the University of Georgia."

Worth Noting...

- Georgia's 36-17 win over No. 9 Florida gave the Bulldogs their second straight win in the series and fifth victory in the last seven contests. The Bulldogs, currently ranked No. 5/6, now lead the all-time series 52-43-2.
- Sophomore QB Jake Fromm finished 17-for-24 for 240 yards and 3 TDs. In the first half, he went 8-for-11 for 97 yards as Georgia built a 13-7 edge. The three TD passes by Fromm ties the Bulldog mark in the UF series in the modern era, also done by Aaron Murray (2010), Matt Stafford (2007) and Buck Belue (1980).

No. 2 Georgia 16, No. 12 LSU 36

Oct. 13, 2018 • Tiger Stadium - Baton Rouge, La.

BATON ROUGE, La. - The second-ranked Georgia Bulldogs faltered in Death Valley, suffering a 36-16 upset loss to No. 12 LSU in front of a crowd of 102,321 at Tiger Stadium and a nationally-televised CBS audience.

Georgia forced a three-and-out on the game's opening drive, but the momentum didn't matriculate to the rest of the half. The Bulldogs' most successful first half drive came on its second possession, which spanned 12 plays for 59 yards – all on the ground – however a failed fake field goal attempt halted the Bulldogs.

Georgia trailed 16-0 at intermission, putting the Bulldogs in a hole that they didn't overcome. Jake Fromm was 5 for 16 for just 47 passing yards, while most of the production occurred on the ground with D'Andre Swift tallying 47 yards on seven carries and Elijah Holyfield mustering 33 yards on five attempts.

The Bulldogs took the opening possession of the third quarter 52 yards on 12 plays, setting up a 40-yard Rodrigo Blankenship field goal to make it 16-3. After a Fromm interception gave the Tigers a short field, the Bulldogs defense held LSU to its fourth field goal inside Georgia's 25-yard line.

Holyfield finished off a seven-play 75-yard drive on the ensuing possession with a 10-yard touchdown run to make it a 19-9 game due to the failed two-point try. Two plays earlier on a 3rd-and-6, a scrambling Fromm found Swift for an eight-yard pickup. Holyfield followed with a 13-yard run that was aided by a pushing offensive line, which set up the touchdown on the next play.

After each team traded punts to start the fourth quarter, LSU capitalized with a touchdown to move ahead 26-9. The Tigers tacked on another field goal off a Georgia special teams turnover, which put LSU well ahead and able to control the clock until the final whistle.

With today's 36-16 loss to LSU, the Tigers take a 17-13-1 edge in the series history that dates back to 1928. This was the 11th meeting where both teams were ranked in the top 25 and LSU now leads that 6-5.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"We didn't play our best game. You have to give LSU credit. They are a great football team. We didn't do well against their hurry up offense, which caused us to not be able to play as many guys as we normally do. They did a great job of mixing up their play calls with run and pass. Offensively, we had a drought and they capitalized. We didn't come out physical today. We just have to execute better and get better overall."

Worth Noting...

- The final score marks Georgia's first 20-point loss since losing at Auburn last season, 40-17.
- Defensively, Georgia gave up a season-high 475 total yards and 36 points, however the Bulldogs forced five LSU field goals inside the Georgia 25-yard line and were on the field for a season-high 33 minutes and 41 seconds. Freshman cornerback Tyson Campbell had a team-high and career-high 11 tackles, while senior defensive end Jonathan Ledbetter tallied 10 tackles – also a career high.
- For the first time since the 2016 Auburn game on Nov. 12, Georgia was shut out in the first half. Auburn led 7-0 at the half that day, and the Bulldogs rallied back for a 13-7 victory. The Bulldogs came in today averaging 42.8 points a game.
- Georgia's leading tacklers with career-highs were freshman DB Tyson Campbell with 11 and senior DE Jonathan Ledbetter had 10. The Bulldogs had three sacks in the first half as D'Andre Walkergot his team-leading fifth while Tyler Clark and Keyon Richardsons split a sack and freshman OLB Robert Beal, Jr. registered his first.

No. 2 Georgia 41, Vanderbilt 13

Oct. 6, 2018 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

Athens, Ga. - In the opening period, Vanderbilt became the first team to lead against the Bulldogs this season, capping a 50-yard scoring drive with a 25-yard field goal.

Following a Rodrigo Blankenship touchback, Fromm found Godwin for a 75-yard touchdown. A Blankenship PAT ensured a 7-3 margin.

The Bulldog defense provided two forced fumbles from junior inside linebacker Tae Crowder and LeCounte. Georgia's defense halted a 12-play, 81-yard Vanderbilt drive at the Georgia 14-yard line on a failed fourth-down attempt.

On offense, Holyfield settled an 8-play, 86-yard drive with an airborne, horizontal dive into the end zone for a 24-yard touchdown run for Georgia's 14-3 lead.

Before the half, junior tight end Isaac Nauta and junior wide receivers, Mecole Hardman and Ridley, marched to the Vanderbilt 10-yard line. Ridley reined in a 10-yard touchdown, keeping one foot in, to send Georgia into halftime with a 21-6 advantage.

In the second half, Georgia opened the frame with an 8-play, 75-yard trudge to the Vanderbilt end zone, finalized by a 35-yard D'Andre Swift explosion for the touchdown and 28-6 score.

A Blankenship 53-yarder made the game 31-6, before Herrien fought for the touchdown after dropping and recovering the ball for the 38-6 clip, complete with a Blankenship extra point.

Blankenship's second field goal of the day added insurance before Vanderbilt produced a final touchdown in the final seven seconds of the game.

Cochair Kirby Smart said...

"We played sloppy and I was disappointed with the way we played. It's sad when you have undisciplined penalties. We're trying to teach our team a lesson - you don't beat good football teams having those errors. We did a few good things, too, and I don't want to overshadow that. We ran the ball against a team that said, 'You're not going to run on us.' But we've got to continue to improve. It starts with discipline... with tying your shoes before practice, being on time for practice... following the rules and regulations. When you do those things, you don't have penalties."

Worth Noting...

- Georgia posted a 41-13 win to run its record to 6-0 (4-0 SEC). It marks the 12th time in school history that Georgia has raced out to a 6-0 start, and it's the first time the Bulldogs have done it in back-to-back seasons.
- Junior PK Rodrigo Blankenship connected on five extra points to make him 32-for-32 on the year and to give him 121 straight. This topped Blair Walsh's school record of 119. Blankenship also had touchbacks on seven of eight kickoffs, giving him 44 on the year and 132 in his career.
- Georgia now leads the all-time series with Vanderbilt 57-20-2 including 21-4 when it's Homecoming. Overall, Georgia is 77-18-2 in Homecoming contests.
- Georgia's defense held Vanderbilt scoreless on their second trip to the Red Zone. The Bulldogs stalled a drive that started on Vanderbilt's 5-yard line by stopping the Commodores on the Georgia 14-yard line during a 4th-and-1 situation. This was Georgia's third Red Zone stop of the year.
- Following a touchback on the ensuing kickoff, Fromm connected with senior WR Terry Godwin for a 75-yard touchdown on the first play of the drive, which marked the longest passing play of the 2018 season thus far. This was a career-long catch for Godwin and the longest for the Bulldogs since Fromm connected with Mecole Hardman for an 80-yard score in the 2018 CFP National Championship versus Alabama.

No. 2 Georgia 38, Tennessee 12

Sept. 29, 2018 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

ATHENS, Ga. - The No. 2 Georgia Bulldogs fended off the Tennessee Volunteers Saturday afternoon 38-12 in front of a crowd of 92,746 at Sanford Stadium and a CBS national television audience.

The Bulldogs improved to 5-0 overall and 3-0 in Southeastern Conference play with the victory against UT, which drops to 2-3 overall and 0-2 in league competition.

With the Volunteers entering the contest averaging 205 yards on the ground each game this season, Georgia limited Tennessee to 66 rushing yards while producing five rushing touchdowns on offense.

The rushing attack featured the first multi-touchdown outings on the ground for sophomore D'Andre Swift and freshman quarterback Justin Fields. Swift found the end zone on a 1-yard pitch in the second quarter, and later returned with a 14-yard score in the final period. Fields, who rushed five times for 45 yards, scored on a 12-yard scamper in the third quarter and followed with a 15-yard touchdown run to cement the 38-12 win.

On 3rd-and-9 in the first quarter, Tennessee redshirt junior linebacker Darrell Taylor forced the ball out of Fromm's hands, but the fumble found junior tight end Isaac Nauta, who ran for a 31-yard touchdown.

After Rodrigo Blankenship booted a 43-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter, Fields jumpstarted the scoring drive to end the half, contributing a 13-yard run. Fromm continued it, connecting with senior wide receiver Riley Ridley and sophomore wide receiver Jeremiah Holloman for 12 yards apiece. Swift finalized the 17-0 halftime margin with his first touchdown run pitched by Fromm and sealed by a Blankenship PAT.

Back from intermission, Georgia resumed on offense with a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped off by Fields' touchdown with an elevated horizontal dive into the end zone. The Volunteers then connected on passing touchdowns of 37 and 35 yards, respectively, to cut the lead to 24-12 (Georgia denied both two-point conversions).

Nevertheless, the Bulldogs drove 75 yards in 7:39, finished by Swift's second TD, for a 31-12 lead. On the ensuing Tennessee drive, senior OLB D'Andre Walker forced a fumble recovered by senior ILB Juwan Taylor, and Fields sealed a 38-12 decision with his 15-yard score.

Cochair Kirby Smart said...

"We struggled at times. We didn't hit some of the plays we thought we could have. We must execute at a higher level to be successful. There were times when we didn't have much movement up front. But when we had to play well in the second half, we challenged them and they did so. It's big when you answer a challenge, but it shouldn't have to come to that. We preach good habits, competitiveness, physicality."

Worth Noting...

- The Bulldogs scored 38 in their latest win over Tennessee to improve to 5-0 overall, 3-0 in the SEC. Georgia has tallied 216 points for the year, for an average of 43.2. Georgia's point total through five games is the most since 2014 (225 and that squad was 4-1).

- Georgia's first points came in an unorthodox fashion. Junior TE Isaac Nauta scooped up a Jake Fromm fumble and ran it 31 yards for a touchdown on a fumble advance to give Georgia a 7-0 edge at the 8:52 mark in the first period. This marks the third consecutive SEC game that the Bulldogs have scored their first touchdown on a return following a fumble.

- Sophomore QB Jake Fromm completed the game 16-for-22 for 185 yards and got his 19th consecutive start at QB. Freshman QB Justin Fields also took some snaps and finished 1-for-2 for 5 yards and ran the ball five times for 45 yards, including scoring runs of 12 and 15 yards.

- Senior OLB D'Andre Walker had five stops, including a sack and forced fumble. Walker has 13 tackles on the year with five tackles for loss and four sacks.

- Junior DB Tyrique McGhee made his third career start and first since the 2017 Tennessee game. Freshman Cade Mays started at RG in place of the injured Ben Cleveland.

2018 GAME SUMMARIES

No. 2 Georgia 43, Missouri 29

Sept. 22, 2018 • Memorial Stadium - Columbia, Mo.

COLUMBIA, Mo. - A defensive first half and offensive onslaught in the second half pushed the second-ranked Georgia Bulldogs past the Missouri Tigers, 43-29, Saturday afternoon at Faurot Field at Memorial Stadium in front of a nationally televised ESPN audience.

The Bulldogs headed into the half with a 20-7 lead after defense and special teams dominated the pace of the game. On third-and-nine, Campbell stripped Missouri's Albert Okwuegbunam and scoop-scored for a 64-yard fumble return to put the first points on the board.

After the Tigers evened the score, junior place kicker Rodrigo Blankenship connected on a 44-yard field goal to move Georgia back in front 10-7. On the ensuing drive, the Georgia defense produced another turnover – this time a 43-yard interception return by linebacker Tae Crowder. The takeaway turned into another Blankenship try, a 21-yard field goal, for the 13-7 lead early in the second quarter.

Special teams then made its splash later in the second to put the Bulldogs up 20-7. Georgia bombarded Mizzou punter Corey Fatony with Eric Stokes blocking the kick and scooping the football for an 8-yard touchdown.

A back-and-forth third quarter saw both teams trade touchdowns. First, Georgia with a 33-yard touchdown pass from Fromm to Ridley capped the five-play, 59-yard drive. Mizzou responded with a long drive and score, but the Bulldogs struck on their second play from scrimmage. Fromm threw a jump ball to sophomore receiver Jeremiah Holloman who eluded the sideline to run free for a 61-yard touchdown.

The Tigers got the last touchdown in the third to put the score at 33-22, and the scoring commenced immediately in the fourth quarter. On the first play, Fromm connected with a wide-open Mecole Hardman for a 54-yard touchdown pass to finish the Bulldogs' longest drive of the game that spanned 77 yards in just five plays.

Missouri quarterback Drew Lock pulled the game to a 40-29 margin on an 11-yard run with 10:47 left in the game, but the Bulldogs ate nearly five minutes off the clock before Mizzou blocked a field goal, but the Georgia defense forced a turnover on downs to mitigate the loss. Another drive taking up 3:17 ended with a 40-yard Blankenship field goal, putting the game at 43-29 with less than two minutes remaining.

Cochair Kirby Smart said...

"The flow of the game was about what I thought it would be, there was a lot of emotional big plays. I didn't see us having the big plays in the turnover game with the fumble recovery and blocked punt, but they were really big plays. We struggled some to stop the run today, which is not indicative of defense we want to have, and we struggled to run the ball. When you have that combination then you are going struggle some and we did. Give Missouri credit, they have a good football team. We knew that coming in. I've always respected them. They've won nine of the last 10 games and you don't do that by accident."

Worth Noting...

- For the fourth straight game this year, Georgia (4-0, 2-0 SEC) scored at least 40 points for the first time since the 2012 season. In 2012, Georgia opened the year with five straight games of scoring at least 40 apiece. This season, Georgia now is averaging 44.5 points a game. The school record is 37.8, set in 2012.
- Missouri ran a total of 85 plays, which is four more than No. 2 Oklahoma ran in the Rose Bowl double-overtime game, the previous high against a Kirby Smart team.
- Eric Stokes' blocked punt with a TD marked the first since CJ Byrd in 2006 against UAB. Alongside Tyson Campbell's 68-yard fumble return, it was the first time since the 2015 road game at Tennessee that Georgia has scored a defensive TD and special teams TD in the same game. That year, Leonard Floyd had a 96-yard fumble return and Reggie Davis had a 70-yard punt return.
- The Georgia defense held senior quarterback Drew Lock without a touchdown in the air. Senior outside linebacker D'Andre Walker had two forced fumbles and two sacks of Lock. The Bulldogs had one sack coming in to the game, which also belonged to Walker.
- After a 6-for-14 first half, sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm went 7-for-9 for 194 yards and three touchdowns in the second.

No. 3 Georgia 49, Middle Tennessee 7

Sept. 15, 2018 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

ATHENS, Ga. - Forty-nine Bulldog points and a definitive Georgia defense backed a resounding 49-7 victory against the Middle Tennessee Blue Raiders at Sanford Stadium.

The Bulldog offense completed the contest with 484 total yards, including 382 in the first half. Averaging 45.3 points per game this season, the Bulldogs have scored 40-plus points through three consecutive matchups.

Junior tailback Elijah Holyfield led the Bulldog run game, becoming the first Georgia running back to record a 100-yard game this season, reaching the mark in the first half.

He was joined by sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm, who threw for an efficient 10-for-12 clip with three touchdowns and 128 yards. Sophomore wide receiver Jeremiah Holloman paced the pass game with 90 yards on three catches, becoming the third different Bulldog receiver to do so in as many games.

The Bulldogs opened the contest with a seven-play, 87-yard drive, highlighted by Holyfield's career-long 66-yard rush. Three plays later, tight end Charlie Woerner provided a block to set up the Fromm-Hardman five-yard connection. Junior wide receiver Mecole Hardman leads the receivers with three touchdowns this season.

Senior defensive back Deandre Baker snagged his second interception of the season, which he returned for 26 yards. Holloman cemented the 14-0 lead with his first career touchdown.

To usher in the second quarter, junior wide receiver Tyler Simmons broke free for a career-long 56-yard rushing touchdown, the first of his career. Hardman widened the Georgia lead to 28 on a 70-yard punt return, the first since Isaiah McKenzie in 2016.

Senior wide receiver Riley Ridley capped a 4-play, 74-yard drive with a 12-yard touchdown on a pass from Fromm for the 35-7 advantage. Freshman quarterback Justin Fields sent the Bulldogs into intermission with his first rushing touchdown of his career.

Georgia tacked on another career-first touchdown with a nine-yard pass from Fromm to senior wide receiver Jayson Stanley in the middle of the end zone.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"Every player who goes in needs to perform like a starter. There's no room for error because we're one play away from those guys... I like the toughness we show during the week. We've created a standard the last couple of years, and now we're owning it with players holding other players accountable."

Worth Noting...

- The 49-7 victory over Middle Tennessee gives Georgia its third consecutive win with at least 40 points. The Bulldogs last did that when they started the 2012 season with five straight 40+ point games.
- Junior TB Elijah Holyfield had a career-long 66-yard run on the Bulldogs' first possession to set up atouchdown three plays later. Holyfield completed the half with eight carries for a career-high 100 yards. The last back to hit the century mark was Sony Michel (181) and Nick Chubb (145) in the Rose Bowl Game win over Oklahoma last year.
- Junior WR Tyler Simmons took a handoff at the beginning of the second quarter a career long 56 yards for his first career touchdown of any kind. This capped a season-long scoring drive of 94 yards, which was six plays and lasted 2:40, and was Georgia's longest scoring drive since the Bulldogs went 98 yards on 11 plays in 6:34 versus Auburn in 2014.
- Mecole Hardman, junior WR who led the SEC in punt returns/yards/avg. last year, returned a punt 70 yards in the second quarter for his first career PR for a touchdown to give the Bulldogs a 28-0 edge. Isaiah McKenzie was the last Georgia player to return a punt for a score after he went 82 yards versus UL-Lafayette in 2016.

2018 GAME SUMMARIES

No. 3 Georgia 41, No. 24 South Carolina 17

Sept. 8, 2018 • Williams-Brice Stadium - Columbia, S.C.

Columbia, S.C. - The No. 3 Georgia Bulldogs routed the 24th-ranked South Carolina Gamecocks Saturday afternoon 41-17 in front of a crowd of 83,140 at Williams-Brice Stadium and a CBS national audience.

The Bulldogs improved to 2-0 overall and earned their first Southeastern Conference win over USC (1-1, 0-1). The victory marks Georgia's seventh ranked win in 30 games under head coach Kirby Smart.

With an efficient 15-for-18 clip, 194 yards and a touchdown, sophomore quarterback Jake Fromm guided Georgia (2-0, 1-0 SEC) to its highest point production in Columbia, dating back to 1894.

Five more Bulldogs joined Fromm with trips to the end zone: senior linebacker Juwan Taylor, running backs D'Andre Swift, Elijah Holyfield, Brian Herrien and wide receiver Mecole Hardman, who also led the receiving group with six completions for 103 yards – both career bests.

The Georgia defense produced a 7-0 Bulldog lead within the game's first minute. A deflected pass from Jake Bentley intended for running back Rico Dowdle found the hands of senior defensive back Deandre Baker, who returned it for 55 yards but fumbled inches before the end zone. Taylor trailed it and completed the touchdown.

Following a South Carolina three-and-out, a 30-yard Fromm-Hardman completion and a 15-yard Gamecock penalty positioned Georgia in the red zone. The next play, Swift sealed the two-touchdown lead with an untouched 17-yard rush. Place kicker Rodrigo Blankenship soon followed with a 45-yard strike for a 17-0 lead.

South Carolina answered back with 10 points on a halfback pass play from Deebo Samuel to Bryan Edwards and a Parker White 26-yard kick, but Blankenship boomed a second 45-yard field goal for the 20-10 lead at the halftime buzzer.

Back from the locker room, the Bulldogs directed a 6-play, 75-yard possession, capped by a 34-yard pass from Fromm to Hardman for the 27-10 advantage. Holyfield and Herrien each added trips to the end zone in the third quarter, and Georgia cruised from there to a 41-17 final.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"At the end of the day, they (South Carolina) just wore down ... You could just see the air coming out of them a little bit as they wore down physically. The big stop of the game to me was either the first or second drive in the second half. We had third-and-2 or third-and-3 and stopped them. They had to punt it right back to us. The defense was right back out there. That takes its toll. I think our conditioning showed through. A lot of credit goes to coach (Scott) Sinclair and the strength staff. They worked those kids hard all summer, so they could prepare for second halves like that.

Worth Noting...

- Georgia carried a 20-10 advantage to halftime and posted a 41-17 win, marking the most points it has ever scored in Columbia in the series that dates back to 1894. The 24-point margin of victory was the most in Columbia since 1971. Georgia improved to 2-0 (1-0 SEC) on the year and has won four in a row over USC.

- Junior WR Mecole Hardman established a career-high for receiving yards with 103 on six catches. Hardman was the first Bulldog receiver to have a 100-yard game since Isaiah McKenzie (103) vs. TCU in the 2016 Liberty Bowl win.

- Senior DB Deandre Baker made his first interception of the year and the sixth of his career in the first quarter, returning it 55 yards before dropping it before crossing the goal line. Senior ILB Juwan Taylor scooped up the fumble and scored to put Georgia up 7-0. Taylor's touchdown marked Georgia's first INT returned for a TD since Maurice Smith took one 35 yards vs. Auburn in 2016.

- Junior PK Rodrigo Blankenship gave the Bulldogs a 17-7 lead late in the opening period on a 45-yard field goal and then made a 44-yarder as the first half expired. He is now 3-for-3 on the year and 12-for-18 in his career from 40+. He logged six more touchbacks on kickoffs today, improving to 14-14 on the season.

- Sophomores DB Richard LeCounte and ILB Monty Rice led the team with career highs in tackles: 10 and 8, respectively.

2018 GAME SUMMARIES

Georgia 45, Austin Peay 0

Sept. 1, 2018 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

ATHENS, Ga. - A stout defensive effort coupled with an explosive Georgia offense lifted the Bulldogs to a 45-0 victory against the Austin Peay Governors in the season opener at Sanford Stadium on Saturday afternoon in front of a capacity crowd of 92,746 and an ESPN national televised audience.

As the Georgia defense held the Governors scoreless in the first half, every offensive possession from the Red and Black resulted in a Georgia score. The first of the 2018-19 season, a Rodrigo Blankenship 34-yard field goal capped a 10-play, 41-yard offensive drive directed by Fromm.

Following the first of many stands from the Bulldog defense, the Georgia offense conducted an 11-play, 80-yard march, featuring 46 total yards from Swift. Junior Riley Ridley claimed the first touchdown of the season and a 10-0 lead with a 10-yard connection with Fromm.

Thirty-nine seconds later, senior outside linebacker D'Andre Walker placed the ball back into the hands of the Bulldog offense, recovering a fumble from Austin Peay quarterback Jeremiah Oatsvall. The next play, Swift ran for an 8-yard touchdown, sending Blankenship to the field to secure the extra point and the 17-0 margin.

The Bulldog debuts continued into the second quarter: Fields entered the game and placed the ball in the hands of junior wide receiver Demetris Robertson. With a pair of blocks from the tight end tandem of Isaac Nauta and Charlie Woerner, the open field presented itself for the Cal transfer, cementing his first Georgia score on a career-high 72-yard run to set up the 24-0 lead.

After a three-and-out from Austin Peay, a 9-play, 69-yard drive was finalized with a handoff to Holyfield, who eluded multiple Governor defenders on his way to the end zone with a 17-yard touchdown. Junior Mecole Hardman closed out the half for the Bulldogs, using his speed to out-run the Austin Peay secondary to a 38-0 advantage with the help of a Blankenship extra point.

In the second half, a 36-yard run from Cook positioned the Bulldogs in Austin Peay territory, set up for a Fields-Nauta 12-yard touchdown. Blankenship sealed the final at 45-0.

Cochair Kirby Smart said...

"We're happy to get the win. It was a good way to start. The kids played hard. But there are a lot of things we can improve on. We knew we couldn't get better until we played a game. We'll learn from this one, learn from our mistakes. We'll get some things ironed out."

Worth Noting...

- The shutout marked the first in a season opener since 2003 against Clemson. Before Austin Peay, the most recent shutout for the Bulldogs came against Tennessee in 2017 (41-0), and the most recent team to be held scoreless for two quarters was Alabama in the College Football Playoff National Championship Game.
- The Bulldog defense held the Governors to 152 total yards and seven first downs on 50 plays. In the first half alone, Georgia limited Austin Peay to 81 yards with one trip to the Red Zone.
- Offensive production was spread between 11 receivers from three different quarterbacks: sophomore Jake Fromm and freshmen Justin Fields and Matthew Downing.
- D'Andre Swift paced the backfield with eight carries and a career-high four completions. The Philadelphia, Penn. native primarily shared responsibilities with juniors Brian Herrien and Elijah Holyfield and freshman James Cook.
- Demetris Robertson's lone carry brought a 72-yard career high touchdown, the longest run by a Bulldog since Sony Michel went 75 yards in the Rose Bowl against Oklahoma.
- Georgia had six first-time starters on offense and defense, including one true freshman, as well as true freshman punter Jake Camarda: redshirt freshman OT Isaiah Wilson, junior WR Tyler Simmons, senior WR (and team captain for Austin Peay) Ahkil Crumpton, senior OLB D'Andre Walker, freshman DB Tyson Campbell and sophomore OLB Walter Grant.
