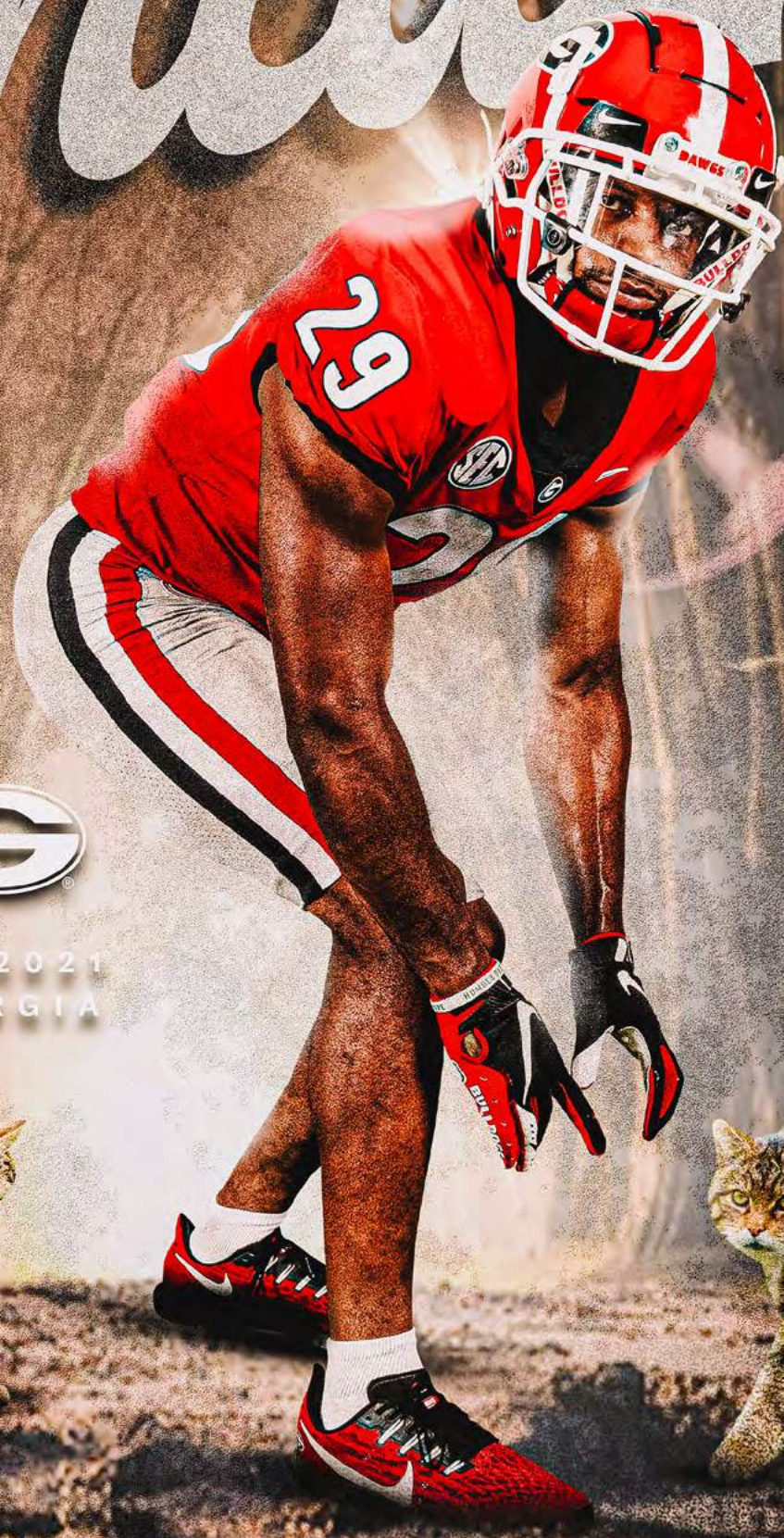

THE GEORGIA-KENTUCKY SERIES



In 1964, a funny thing happened following Kentucky's first drive of the game. The Wildcats won the toss, elected to receive, and drove down the field for a touchdown.

The visitors appeared as dominant on that drive as Georgia did on its first drive versus Arkansas a fortnight ago. Rather than slumping in their collective seats to carp and complain about the porous defense, the Bulldog supporters in the South stands jumped to their feet and cheered their team as if they were gallant heroes who had just stopped the Green Bay Packers on fourth and one at the goal line.

Even Ripley would not have believed it. Vince Dooley was in awe. Erk Russell, the defensive coordinator was as perplexed as he ever was. "I was stunned. We couldn't believe what was taking

place," Erk later said.

Perhaps, the new coaching staff should have gotten an indication of the fighting spirit of the Bulldog fan base when a week earlier, the underdog Georgia team came within an eyelash of upsetting one of Florida State's best teams, pre-Bobby Bowden. On a late drive, Steve Tensi, the rangy Seminole quarterback, hit Fred Biletnikoff, one of the greatest receivers ever to play college football, for a touchdown pass to steal the thunder from the upstart Bulldogs. Defensive back, Wayne Swinford, said years later, "I know the scoreboard says that FSU was the winner, but we won that game."

After the game, the cheerleaders were consoling the Bulldog players while students poured on the field to thank the team for its effort. That

scene and the Kentucky episode were evidence that Georgia's past frustrations were forgettable and that a new era had arrived. "We were hungry, and we were anxious to turn things around," said Barry Wilson, captain of the team.

The Georgia-Kentucky series has gone Georgia's way often, but Kentucky has had a few defining moments to boast about. The all-time series is decidedly in the Bulldogs' favor, 60-12-2. The 'Dawgs have a better record wherever the teams have played including Kroger Field, the Wildcats' newest facility. In fact, Georgia has a 29-7-0 record for games played in Lexington. The Dawgs have won the last ten meetings.

There is lot of sentiment for Kentucky throughout the Southeastern Conference. The Bluegrass State has a lot to offer a visiting team. Beautiful countryside, horse farms and bourbon distilleries. You can book tours for the horse farms and the distilleries which will make your day. For years, Georgia played Kentucky on the last day of racing of the fall meeting. Fans would spend time at Keeneland before going to the Georgia game at night.

Fall color has often been peaking on the trip to Lexington, with fans concluding that the drive up for the game a pleasant experience that got you in the mood for a big weekend. SEC scheduling changes in recent years took away that premier fall option a few years ago, but die-hard Georgia fans, with a penchant for the horse track, still make the trip which allows for a drive over to Louisville where there is racing at Churchill Downs.

Churchill Downs for the Kentucky Derby in the spring

can bring about an unforgettable experience, the Derby being one of the most exciting sporting events in America. ("The Greatest Two Minutes in Sports"). There is a lot of class connected with the Derby. However, for a football weekend, nothing like spending an afternoon at Keeneland.

With Lexington being only 82 miles from Cincinnati, there were many times in the past when you might spot Pete Rose at the betting window. When the baseball Reds' season ended, Pete spent considerable time at the track. This brings up an interesting story about Pete and Vince Dooley.

When Pete was managing the Reds, I often went by his office at the old Atlanta-Fulton County Stadium when Cincinnati was in town to play the Braves. Pete was an affable fellow and would talk with anybody. He, on occasion, wanted to talk Georgia football—but mostly he wanted to know about Dooley.

I was happy to share with him opinions about Vince's coaching style, his underscoring details, commitment to preparation, emphasizing fundamentals and a "don't-beat-yourself" philosophy.

Pete listened attentively and nodded with each assessment and then said, "Boy, he sure beats the spread a lot." I am sure that would have come as a shock to Vince.

With Kentucky off to one of its best starts in its history, I am feeling good about this game taking place between the hedges. Looks like the Dawgs could use a little home field advantage the way the Wildcats are playing.

PATRIOTS 25, TEXANS 22

David Andrews, OL: Played all 64 snaps at center and helped the Patriots accumulate 352 total net yards. He was New England's lone regular starter on the offensive line as injuries and COVID-19 sidelined the other four.

Chris Conley, WR: Caught three passes for 84 yards, including a 37-yard touchdown, for Houston. Prior to Sunday's game, Conley and wife Brianna welcomed their first child, a daughter named Calani Myles.

Jordan Jenkins, DE: Posted four tackles, including one for loss, and a quarterback hurry for the Texans.

TITANS 37, JAGUARS 19

Ben Jones, OL: Logged all 64 snaps and helped Tennessee roll up 368 total net yards.

Monty Rice, ILB: Appeared on 12 plays on defense and seven special teams snaps for the Titans.

Tyson Campbell, DB: Was on the Jaguars' inactive list due to a toe injury.

CARDINALS 17, 49ERS 10

A.J. Green, WR: Hauled in a 13-yard catch for the Cardinals.

Charlie Woerner, TE: Had a 4-yard reception, his first of the year, for the 49ers.

BILLS 38, CHIEFS 20

Isaiah McKenzie, WR: Had a 7-yard punt return and a 4-yard kickoff return for Buffalo. He stands seventh in the NFL with 91 punt return yards. Teammates also lauded his ability to help simulate Kansas City quarterback Patrick Mahomes during practices leading up to the game.

Deandre Baker, DB: Saw action on one defensive play for Kansas City.

Mecole Hardman, WR: Led the Chiefs with nine catches for 76 yards.

PACKERS 25, BENGALS 22 (OT)

Eric Stokes, DB: Had four tackles and defended a pass for Green Bay.

Trey Hill, OL: Appeared on four of the Bengals' special teams plays.

CHARGERS 47, BROWNS 42

Tre' McKitty, TE: Was on the Chargers' inactive list as a healthy scratch.

Mark Webb, DB: Posted a special teams tackle for the Chargers.

Nick Chubb, RB: Rushed for 161 yards, including a 52-yard touchdown, on 21 carries and added a 9-yard reception for the Browns. He ranks second in the NFL with 523 rushing yards and sixth with four rushing touchdowns.

Richard LeCounte, DB: Was on Cleveland's inactive list for undisclosed reasons.

RAVENS 31, COLTS 25 (OT)

Ben Cleveland, OL: Saw action on four Baltimore plays before exiting with a second-quarter knee injury.

Justin Houston, OLB: Posted three tackles and a quarterback hurry for the Ravens.

Nick Moore, LS: Snapped on four punts and a field goal and he registered a special teams tackle for the Ravens.

Rodrigo Blankenship, PK: Converted field goals of 37 and 43 yards and he made one extra point for the Colts. He stands second in the NFL with 11 field goals.

RAMS 26, SEAHAWKS 17

Leonard Floyd, OLB: Posted five tackles, including one for loss, for the Rams.

Sony Michel, RB: Rushed for 37 yards and a touchdown on 11 carries and added an 8-yard reception for the Rams.

Matthew Stafford, QB: Went 25-of-37 for 365 yards and a touchdown for the Rams. He ranks third in the NFL with 1,587 passing yards and fifth with 12 passing touchdowns.

BEARS 20, RAIDERS 9

Alec Ogletree, OLB: Posted six tackles for the Bears.

Roquan Smith, ILB: Had a Chicago-best 10 tackles and he defended one pass. Smith stands fifth in the NFL with 50 tackles.

VIKINGS 19, LIONS 17

D'Andre Swift, RB: Had 11 carries for 51 yards and a touchdown and he caught six passes for 53 yards for the Lions.

COWBOYS 44, GIANTS 20

Lorenzo Carter, OLB: Notched an interception and two tackles for the Giants.

Tae Crowder, ILB: Recorded eight tackles and forced a fumble for New York.

Azeez Ojulari, OLB: Picked up three tackles for the Giants.

Andrew Thomas, OL: Was active, but he did not play due to a foot injury.

John Jenkins, DL: Was on the Dolphins' inactive list for undisclosed reasons.

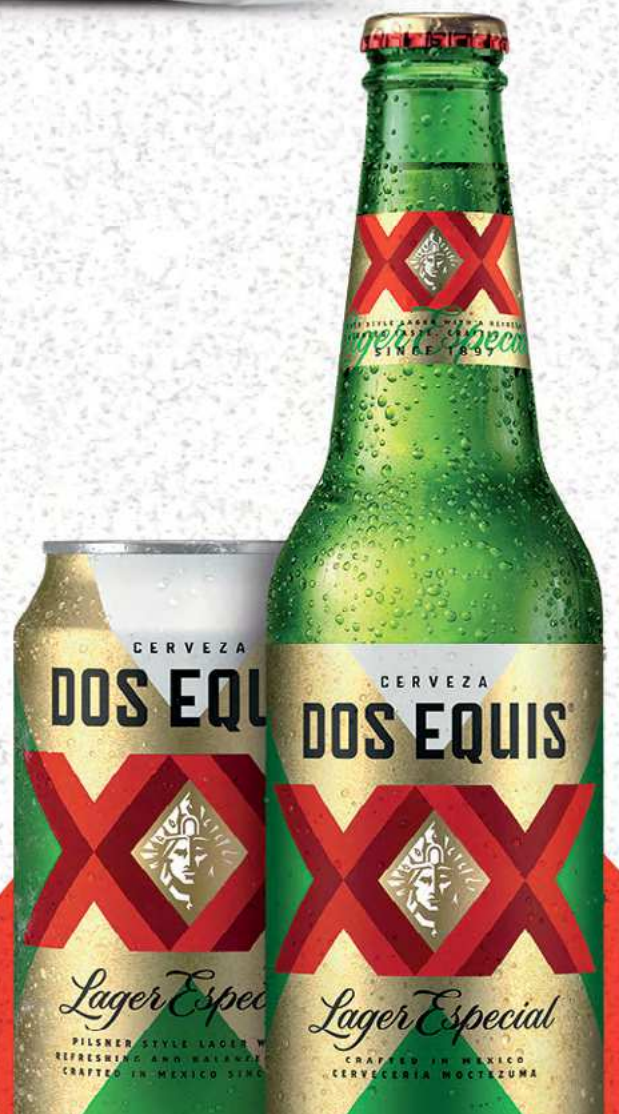

- Top-ranked Georgia (6-0, 4-0 SEC) plays host to No. 11 Kentucky (6-0, 4-0 SEC) in a battle of the last two unbeaten teams in the Southeastern Conference. The Bulldogs lead the all-time series 60-12-2 and are riding an 11-game winning streak in the series. ESPN College GameDay returns to Athens for the second time this season while SEC Nation will broadcast from Athens too. CBS will televise this matchup as its national game of the week.
- Georgia leads the nation in Scoring Defense, allowing just 5.5 points per game. Kentucky is averaging 31 points per game. The Bulldog offense is scoring 39.8 points a game while Kentucky's defense has surrendered just 17.5 points a game.
- Georgia will celebrate Homecoming on Saturday. The Bulldogs are 79-18-2 in Homecoming contests since 1922. Georgia is 15-2-1 all-time against Kentucky on Homecoming. Ten different SEC teams have served as an opponent on Homecoming.

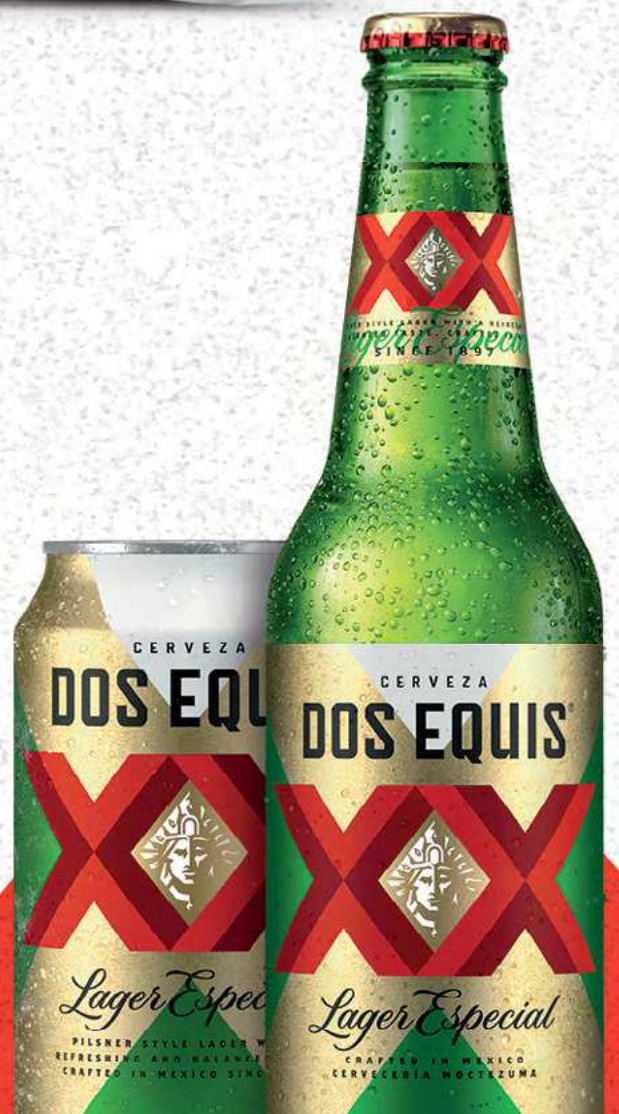

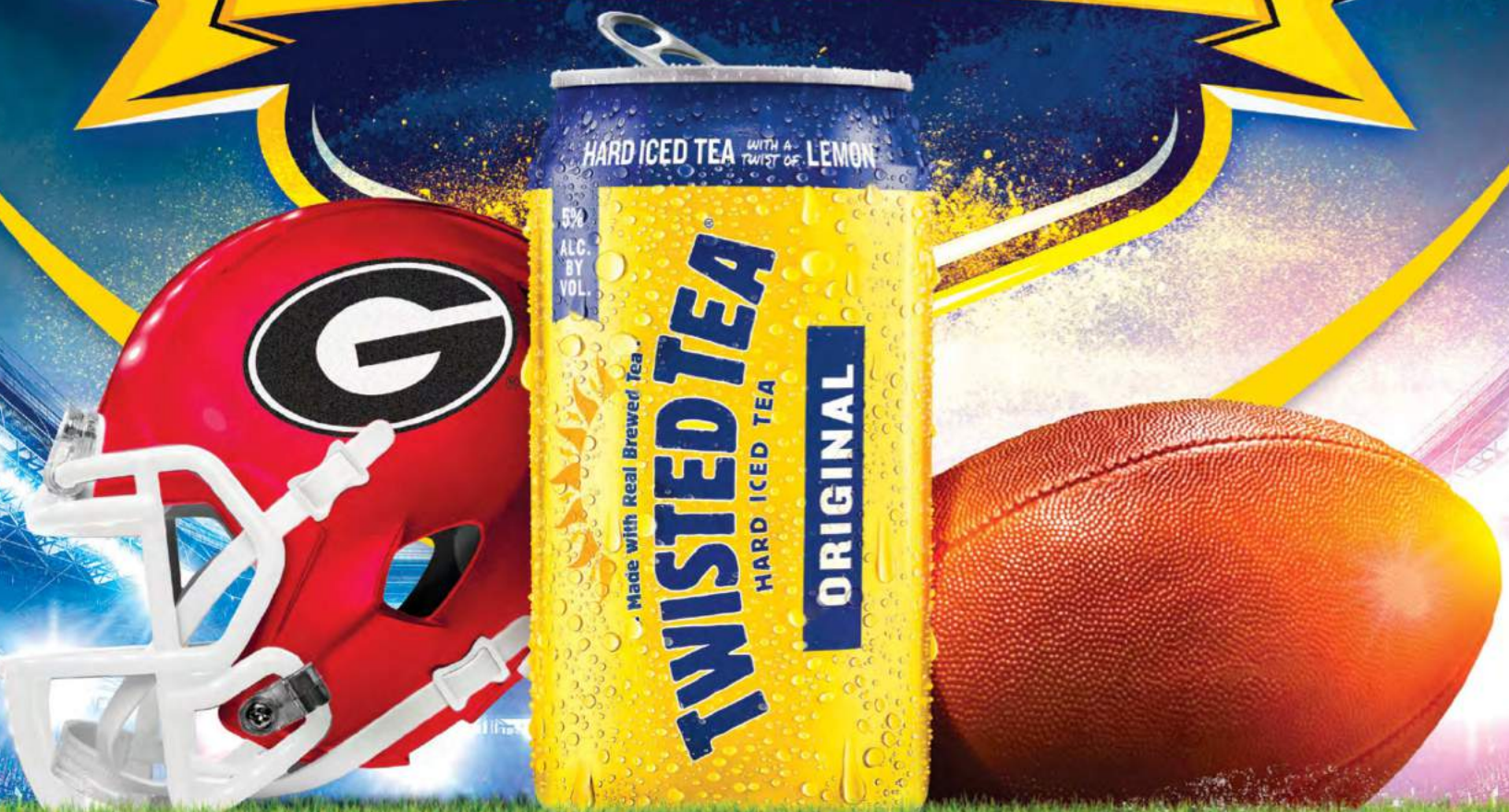
